Decode the numbers in Chinese

Chinese has many homophones with counting numbers, so the Chinese take those numbers for slang in one case.

1. Number 0 (bù ~ nǚ, hín): You, me, . (like you in English).
2. Number 1 (yào ~ Yao): Want.
3. Number 2 (ài ~ ài): Love.
4. Number 3 (xì ~ xián / shǎng): Remember or give birth.
5. Number 4 (sì ~ shì): Life, like.
6. Number 5 (wǒ ~ wǒ): I, you, I, . (like I in English).
7. Number 6 (liù ~ lu): L?c.
8. Number 7 (qī ~ jī?): Kiss.
9. Number 8 (bǎi ~ fǎ / bàn / bā): Play, hug, stay, go.
10. Number 9 (jiǔ ~ jǐ / qiú / jiù / shǒu): Eternity.



Some sequence numbers are used in Chinese.

520/521: I love you.

520 reads as w? èr lǐng, 521 reads as w? èr yī, having the same pronunciation as w? ài n? (I love you / I love you).

9420: It's love you.

9420 read as jǐ? sì èr wǎn, pronounced almost like jiù shì ài n? (which is love you).

1314: Lifelong lifetime.

1314 reading is yī? sān yī? sì, pronounced yī? shǎng yī? shì (whole life).

530: I miss you.

530 in Chinese is read w? xǐ?ng n?, reading aloud almost like w? xī??? n? (miss me / miss you).

9277: Love and kiss.

9277 when pronounced jǐ? èr qī?qī? is similar to jiù ài qī?n qī?n (love and kiss).

Number 555: Huhuhu.

555 in Chinese is w?w?w? similar to w? w? w? (huhuhu).

9213: Love you all your life.

9213 when read up, jǐ? èr yī? sān wǎn read like zhǎng'ai yī? shǎng (love you all your life).

910: It's me.

The Chinese reading 910 is jiù y? n?, the steering reading of jiù y? n?.

886: Goodbye.

The number 886 that she reads is the same reading from the article (goodbye).
