Today, Microsoft officially announced that it has reached the milestone of 1 billion devices running Windows 10.

'We are pleased to announce that over one billion people have chosen to use Windows 10 in over 200 countries, resulting in more than 1 billion currently active Windows 10 devices,' said Microsoft Vice President Yusuf Mehdi: *'We are extremely grateful and grateful to our customers, partners, and employees for helping us reach this milestone.'*

The software giant plans to reach 1 billion devices running Windows 10, within 3 years of the operating system being released. However, Microsoft had to extend the expected time, because Windows Phone could not compete with iOS and Android. Finally, Microsoft has reached this milestone after 5 years.

This milestone is also partly due to the end of support for the Windows 7 operating system. Obviously, businesses upgrading from Windows 7 to Windows 10 helped Microsoft achieve this milestone more quickly. .

When 900 million devices running Windows 10 increased to 1 billion devices in less than a month.
