

Microsoft is about to allow IT admins to send messages to the screen or taskbar for employees in the company

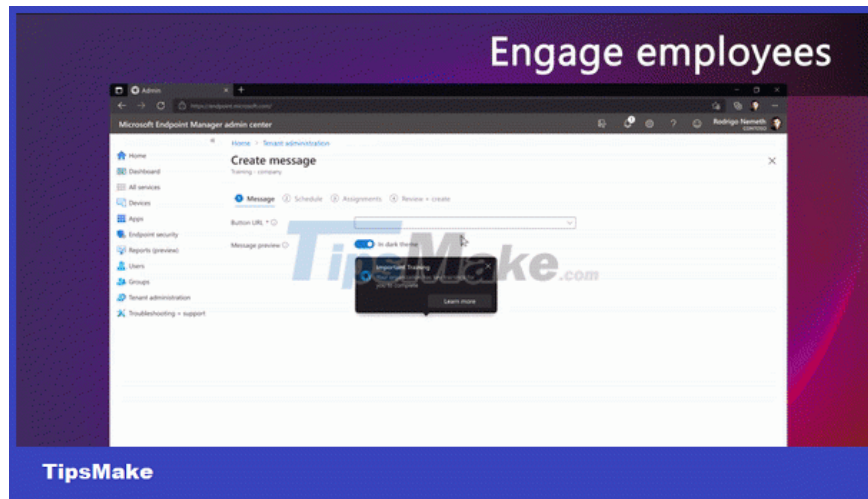

IT admins can customize messages in Microsoft Endpoint Manager and customize how messages appear, which groups of employees receive which messages, and can even define how often messages appear. The company logo can also appear in the message and the admin can even add the company website.



This feature can be useful when you need to send training materials to all employees or alert employees across the company or specific department about a certain issue.

However, there will be some users or security researchers who do not like this feature. That's because it can be abused to harass or used by hackers to trick employees into clicking malicious links.
