

Microsoft is about to bring Windows 11's new app store to Windows 10

After a long time of testing, Windows 11 was officially released by Microsoft on October 5. The new operating system comes with a series of notable tweaks and additions in terms of features as well as interface.

One of the most notable changes is in the new Microsoft Store app store.

Specifically, Microsoft Store (also known as Windows Store) on Windows 11 has been built and redesigned to provide an intuitive interface, more information and features than the existing store on Windows 10. There will be a new navigation menu on the left side. At the top of the interface, there will be a new, more eye-catching search bar. Microsoft has also redesigned the app page in the Store with more clarity on download sizes, reviews, app features, changelog, and other information.



In particular, the Windows 11 Store will allow you to download apps that were previously unavailable. For example, you can download other app stores like Epic Games Store. The way the feature on the Microsoft Store Windows 10 works is very limited, preventing you from getting all the apps you want. With the new app, however, you can get most of the software you want.
