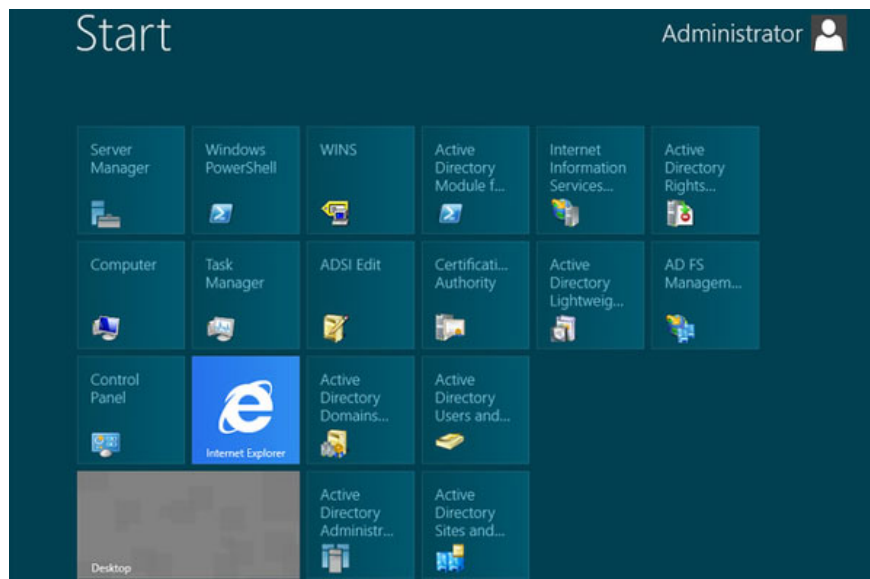


Microsoft launched Windows Server 2012 operating system
