Microsoft said that, like files that were shared via the Computer History Museum, the files uploaded to GitHub this time were not edited. Users can fork this repository and experience it themselves. If you want to edit unrelated files or add additional content unrelated to the source code, the user can send it to PR for review and review.



In addition to the source code, this time Microsoft also added information about how the first version of this operating system appeared.
