

Microsoft releases new Patch Tuesday update for Windows 10

Microsoft has released a series of new cumulative updates for Win 10 as part of the monthly Patch Tuesday update cycle, bringing changes and fixes to improve the quality and security of Windows 10.

In particular, this is the first **Patch Tuesday** patch of 2021 and needless to say, these cumulative updates focus mainly on solving security vulnerabilities in Windows 10 and some of the built-in components. .

The latest Patch Tuesday update supports all versions of Windows 10, including the recent 2004 version and 20H2 is currently rolling out to all devices globally.

As mentioned above, since the focus is on fixing security issues in Windows 10, this update is intended to fix a number of vulnerabilities in the operating system, including one that affects local network servers. intranet servers based on HTTPS.

Microsoft explains as follows: "After installing this update, HTTPS-based intranet servers by default cannot use user proxies to detect updates. these servers will fail if you do not have a system proxy configured on the client computer.If you must use a user proxy, you need to configure the behavior using the Allow user proxy to be used as a policy. fallback if detection using system proxy fails To ensure the highest level of security, deploy the Transport Layer Security (TLS) Windows Server Update Services (WSUS) certificate on all devices. The clients are using the "WSUS HTTP server".

Users can update Windows 10 from Windows Update, Microsoft Update Catalog and Windows Server Update Services (WSUS).
