This giant dragon only spawns in The End dimension and has the ability to heal thanks to the End Crystal on the Obsidian tower. Upon seeing your character, the Ender Dragon will swoop down and spit fire to attack.

Wither



Although it is still controversial, Wither is also ranked by many players above the Ender Dragon in terms of danger. Wither is a special type of mob that Minecraft players will have to manually summon. It can fly and shoot withered skulls towards gamers. In particular, Wither is a type of mob with buffalo health in the game.
