

Minecraft: When will Frog mobs officially land?

Frog is a new mob announced and introduced at Minecraft Live 2021 event and will be included in the game soon. So when is the official time and what's so special?

Minecraft has experienced a year of 2021 full of positive signals, including the 'big update' version in the game history – 1.18. Not stopping there, Mojang is still actively working to improve the game and quickly release a new version in 2022. In particular, as revealed, Minecraft next year will have many interesting mobs. added, including Frog mobs.



Frog mob release time

Mojang revealed at the Minecraft Live 2021 event that they have plans for an equally exciting update of Caves and Cliffs in 2022 called The Wild - bringing loads of it. new feature and Frog will be among the mobs released in the same batch.



Overall, patch 1.19 will completely improve the swamp biome, adding Frogs, Tadpoles, and Fireflies to it. Additionally, a new mangrove swamp biome will also be introduced with new trees and blocks.

And yet, Minecraft 1.19 also gave birth to Warden - new hostile mobs and extremely fascinating deep dark cave biomes - which should have been released in version 1.18.



In a nutshell, Frogs and Tadpoles were added to the game in beta 1.18.10.24 of Bedrock Edition to test and test the gameplay. The final version of this mob will be officially released in 2022 with the Wild 1.19 Update.



The behavior and characteristics of Frogs in Minecraft

The Frog is a passive mob that spawns at Swamp Biomes and comes in different colors depending on the biome's temperature and location. Occasionally, they will squeal loudly and can jump up to 4 blocks high.



Frog's main foods are Fireflies and Slime and then release these Slime balls. Gamers can raise Frogs with the help of Sea Grass. After spawning, the Frog that lays eggs in the water will turn into a Tadpole and then grow into a Baby Frog.
