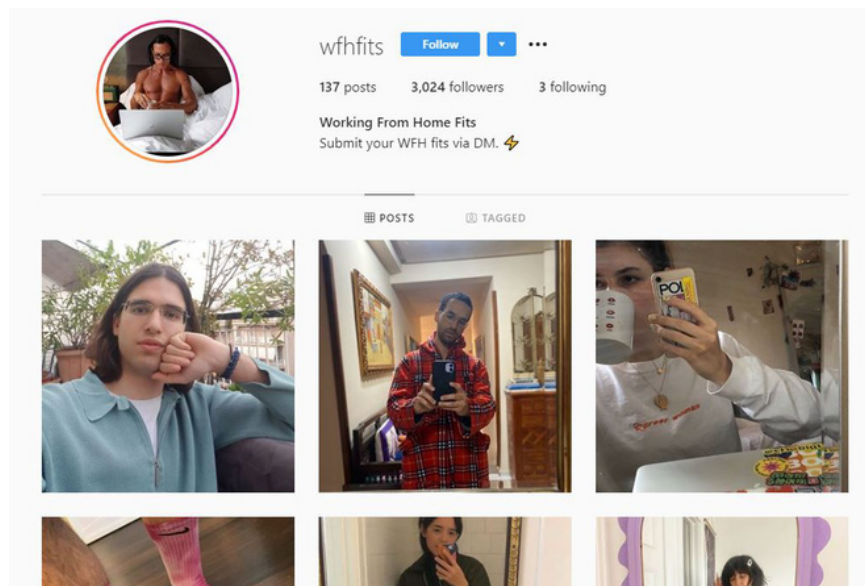


Netizens and 7749 different dress styles when working from home to avoid Covid-19, sleepwear is not the only option
