## Specifications of the UltraSharp 52 Thunderbolt Hub Monitor

The UltraSharp 52 Thunderbolt Hub Monitor is specifically designed for productivity, with Dell advertising it as an alternative to multi-monitor setups (the ultrawide screen offers a more immersive experience). This curved

monitor is extremely large and boasts a 6144 x 2560 resolution, a 120Hz refresh rate, and an ambient light sensor to reduce eye strain.

It also comes equipped with a wide range of connectivity ports:

1. 2 HDMI ports
2. 2 DisplayPort ports
3. 4 USB Type-A ports
4. 1 USB Type-A port supporting BC1.2 charging.
5. 3 USB-C ports (data only)
6. 2 USB-C ports supporting 27W charging.
7. 1 Thunderbolt 4 port (capable of charging laptops with power up to 140W)
8. 1 RJ45 Ethernet port

This monitor also has another groundbreaking feature: You can connect two different computers, and the screen will split in half to display content from both. Dell calls this feature Picture-by-Picture, and it's truly amazing. Built-in tools allow you to control all connected computers with a single keyboard and mouse. Obviously, not everyone can take advantage of this feature (or has the need to use it), but for those who can, it's a unique experience.

Gamers, beware: This screen may look appealing, but ultrawide screens can have drawbacks for gaming. In this case, the excessively large size and slightly unusual resolution could cause problems.

## **Dell also announced a new 32-inch 4K monitor.**



Dell also unveiled a smaller (but still very large) 32-inch monitor at CES, called the UltraSharp 32 4K QD-OLED Monitor. This monitor is geared towards creative tasks where color accuracy is crucial, such as photo and video editing. It features an anti-glare screen, a built-in colorimeter and numerous color management tools, and is DisplayHDR True Black 500 certified.

The UltraSharp 52 Thunderbolt Hub Monitor will be available starting January 6th for \$2,900. The UltraSharp 32 4K QD-OLED monitor will be available starting February 24th for \$2,600.
