

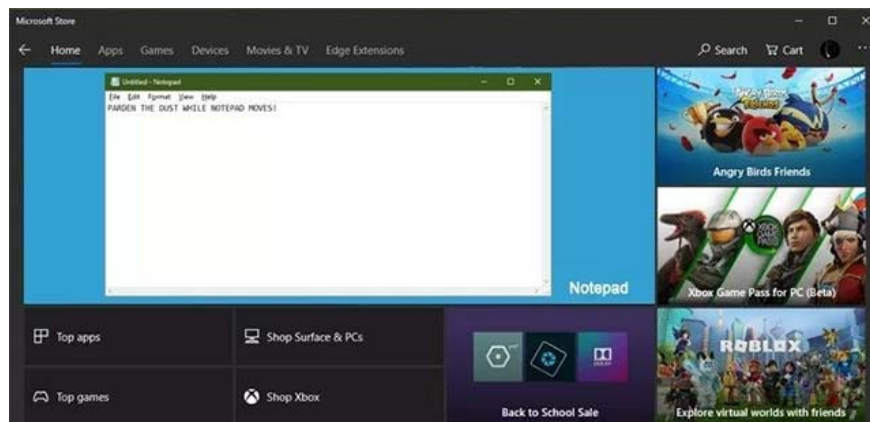
Notepad will be moved to Microsoft Store, no longer 'lying' with Windows

The Notepad application will be separated from Windows and updated via Microsoft Store as a separate Store application, no longer related to Windows.

The build of Windows 10 Insider Preview build 18963 has just been released by Microsoft on Fast ring on August 16 and contains some notable changes and additions such as GPU temperature monitoring in Task Manager, Virtual desktop renaming options, some improvements to Optional Features, Mouse Settings and other important changes.

Besides, there is another surprising announcement, starting from this build (build 18963), Notepad application will be separated from Windows and updated via Microsoft Store as a separate Store application, no anything related to Windows.

Notepad is designed and developed as a simple text editor for the Windows operating system, and is a basic text editing program, allowing computer users to create simple documents. No need to use Word. The tool was first released as an MS-DOS program in 1983, and has been included in all Microsoft Windows versions since Windows 1.0 in 1985.

Notepad is one of the most popular text editors. The text is edited when saved as a file with an extension.txt, without a formatting tag or any type of format.

Therefore, by moving Notepad to Microsoft Store, Microsoft can now release a separate update for this tool like any other Store application.

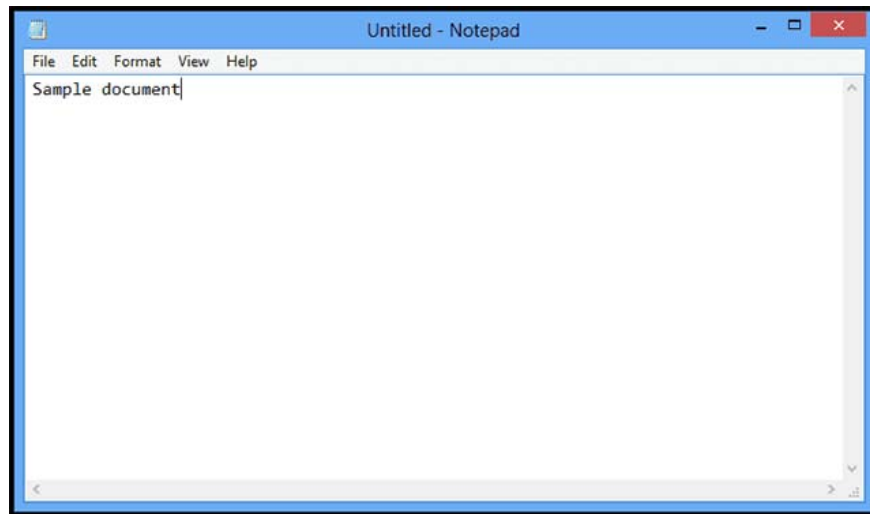
The Microsoft representative said this decision was necessary, and helped Notepad users benefit more because the ability to respond to issues and feedback outside of limiting Windows releases of the application would be greatly enhanced. tell.

After successfully exploiting, the vulnerability can allow hackers to launch any process in the system. Users have to wait for a long time, the new vulnerability is patched through Patch Tuesday updates. However, when Notepad is transferred to Microsoft Store and exists independently of Windows, any additional updates and updates such features will be released locally without depending on the update of the system.
