

Ntcmdprompt command in Windows

Run the interpreter command **Cmd.exe** or for **Command.com** after running a Terminate and Stay Resident (TSR) or after starting the command prompt from within an MS-DOS application.

ntcmdprompt

When **Command.com** is running, some features of **Cmd.exe**, such as the doskey display of the command history, cannot be used. If you want to run the Cmd.exe command interpreter after you have started a Terminate and Stay Resident (TSR) or started the command prompt from within an MS-DOS-based application, you can use the **ntcmdprompt** command. However, keep in mind that TSR may not be ready for use when you are running **Cmd.exe**. You can nest the **ntcmdprompt** command in your **Config.nt** file or in the equivalent boot file in, within the program information file (Pif).

For example, to nest the **ntcmdprompt** command in your **Config.nt** file or in the boot configuration file specified in the additional PIF reference, enter: **ntcmdprompt**
