

# Online scams are popular on eBay and prevented

eBay is no longer a secure website, because many people use it as a tool to make a profit. Many people use eBay to play tricks. Let's TipsMake.com find out what scams are!

Ebay used to be an online shopping site that I used to trust and I have a lot of experience when using this website. Now, however, scammers have turned it into a market that is no longer as safe as before.

Sometimes, you have no other choice. If you are a buyer, some items are only available on eBay, and as a seller, eBay can be the most profitable platform for you. However, if you absolutely must use eBay to trade, be wary of some scams!

## **EBay scams should be avoided if you are a buyer**

### **1. High sellers run away with your money**

For most items, the eBay Money Back Guarantee will protect you if the seller does not ship the item. However, there are some items that are not covered by the guarantee:

1. Car
2. Real estate
3. Items sold by Sotheby
4. Websites and businesses
5. classified advertising
6. Service
7. Some business equipment

**Note:** These are usually high-value transactions (about a thousand dollars or more).

## **Prevention**

Even if you look at the positive feedback about the seller, there is no guarantee they are a genuine seller. All you can do is avoid shopping in eBay's unsecured repositories.

### **2. Sellers use fake names**

Sellers create a normal sales list. When you buy, the seller gives the right item to your address but incorrectly sends the sender's name, making you think you received the wrong package.

Therefore, you return the package to the post office as any good citizen will do. Unfortunately, this will indicate that your package was rejected or returned and you will not receive refunds from eBay. The money you transfer to the seller is now theirs. The worst thing is that this dispute has been resolved and you can't respond to that dispute.

## **Prevention**

The best way is to open the package to see if it is the product you ordered (if the recipient's address matches).

## **EBay scams should be avoided if you are a seller**

Sellers certainly face many problems on eBay. Scammers easily target sellers without much concern about consequences. Therefore, if you are a seller, you can only believe in yourself.

### **1. Buyers pay a higher price**

For example, have a buyer contact you and offer to pay a higher price than the amount you sell for your item. They will send fake checks or personal accounts. After that, when you shipped, it was too late.

This is one of those scams that easily happens because when people get paid more, they don't want to. No individual is not attracted by the price of 500 USD for a laptop sold for 300 USD?

## **Prevention**

Never ship goods until you have money in hand or in the bank. To be safe, wait until you know for sure that you have received or never accepted a check on eBay.

### **2. The buyer claims you have sent an empty package**

For example, a shopper selects one of the products you sell and you ship it to them as usual. Upon receiving this item, the buyer opens an argument on eBay and declares that you sent them an empty box. eBay was forced to return the buyer only to return the empty box and keep the item inside.

## **Prevention**

Check the buyer's feedback history, you can find something useful. Or if you contact eBay, they will show you how to appeal the dispute. You will need all the evidence collected (for example, by proof that you actually

delivered the item).

To avoid the risk of selling, take a picture of the entire packaging and shipping process of every item you sell on eBay. The more evidence there is, the better.

## **The eBay scam should be avoided by everyone**

You receive an email like the official notification from eBay. It requires you to do a lot of things like reviewing security details, updating passwords, confirming recent purchases or sales . It is important that the email contains a link to log in to your account.

This phishing link will take you to a web page similar to the eBay website. You try to log in but can't. In fact, this site has taken the login information you just typed in to access your real eBay account.

### **Prevention**

Learn how to detect phishing emails and never click links on emails. To access a secure website, enter the URL manually.
