At the same time, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention also showed that this is a sign that the sensitivity of TB risk is very high. The team believes that genetics is very responsible for making facial shapes, and it also increases the risk of tuberculosis and does not exclude the possibility, possibly related to increased ability. Left-handed in these people.

Scientists also said that considering the geographic factor, England is known as the tuberculosis capital of Western Europe, here, the infected people are proportional to the elongated face and most is left handed.
