

Pocket some quality video recording tips on iPhone

The iPhone video recorder has a lot of modes as well as a lot of different settings, making it possible to create complete videos. Besides, we should also pay attention to some of the following tips to always shoot beautiful videos on the device.

The iPhone / iPad video recorder is provided with a number of customizations, which you can use during movie shooting to produce the most satisfactory video. Basically, the operation for video recording is very simple, just press Video mode in the Camera app. However, to get quality and satisfactory videos, users need to pay attention to many different factors. The following article will help you get quality videos on iPhone, with extremely basic and simple tips.


1. Check memory usage on iPhone:

Checking and freeing memory on your device is something you should regularly do. Especially when we set up video recording in 4K resolution, the video will take up a lot of memory. So if you intend to shoot videos in high resolution, check the memory to ensure video storage.

We go to **Settings (General)> General (General Settings)> Storage & iCloud Usage (Capacity & Use iCloud)** . You will then know what the current capacity is on the device.

In addition, cleaning up device memory also limits the status of slow devices, speeds up the device, as well as adds capacity to install other applications. Readers can refer to some tips to release iPhone memory in the article below.

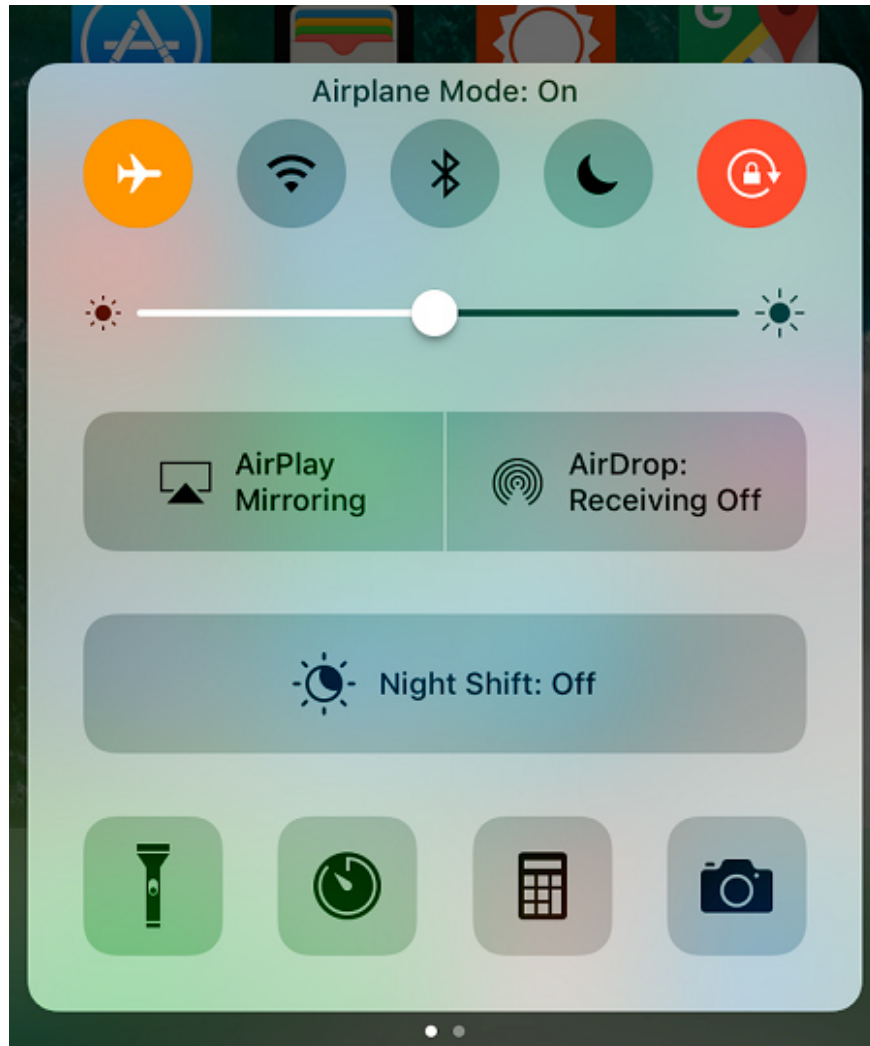

2. Turn off Notification notifications on iPhone:

During the video recording for a long time, we should turn off notifications on the device, or switch to Airplane mode. So we won't be bothered by notifications when recording videos. Readers refer to how to turn off application notifications on iPhone in the article below.

1. How to turn off iPhone application notifications?

Besides Do Not Disturb mode does not disturb will also prevent calls or notifications from being sent to the device.



3. Do not shoot videos vertically:

If taking a picture, the vertical or horizontal screen capture issue will not affect the image much. But if you shoot the video, you need to pay attention to this issue. One point to keep in mind when recording videos is that it should be rotated horizontally to avoid excess black parts on the sides of the screen when watching videos.



However, at present, some social networks are compatible with vertical videos. For example, if we watch videos on a computer screen through uploading to YouTube or Vimeo, we can record videos horizontally. But if you upload to Snapchat, you should leave it vertical. So you need to determine what video is recorded on the iPhone for what purpose, upload it to a social network or switch to another device. If not, you should still record videos in landscape mode, which is the most reasonable.

4. Limit camera shake when recording videos:

On iPhone / iPad devices, Apple has a built-in video stabilizer to reduce video shake. However, it is best to limit the device to shake during video recording. Users can squeeze the elbows into hips to fix the arm, or place the iPhone on a flat surface to minimize vibration.

This is necessary if we perform video recording with a subject, or in the case of close-up, fast-forward video (time-lapse) or slow-motion video recording.

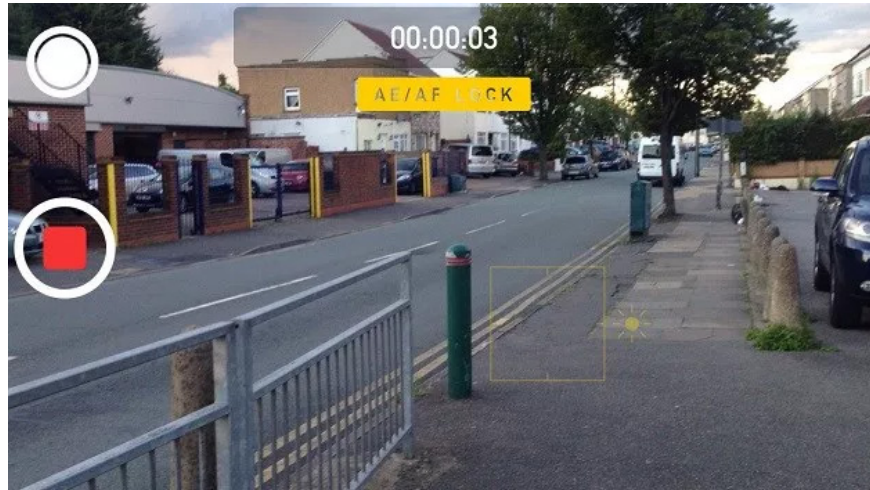


5. Adjust light when recording video:

With the best lighting conditions, iPhone will produce good quality video. In case we are in a complex lighting environment, you need to adjust the light.

With a strong light source pointing from behind, certain videos will accompany the person holding the camera. If so, we need to stand facing the light source so that no shadow appears in the video.

If you need exposure, click on the subject you want to focus on, when the yellow square appears, we will pull the brightness icon up or down, when you see the sharp object, then it is fine.



To lock the exposure, also touch and hold on the position to focus to appear the focus square. On the screen you will see the AE / AF LOCK text to adjust the exposure. In addition, the use of additional flash to brighten the video with dark conditions, not enough light is also needed. But you need to calculate the use of the flash accordingly.

6. Use 1/3 layout when recording video:

The 1/3 rule, also called the roach chessboard, is a familiar and long-standing layout in photography. Pay attention to the line on the screen to place the subject so that it stays on the right line of 1/3 horizontal and vertical lines, to make the image more harmonious.

At that time, the subject will be divided into 3 parts, horizontally and vertically. However, the frame display mode only appears when we take a photo and with the video recording on the iPhone, you will have to estimate yourself. But if anyone regularly uses this 1/3 layout when taking photos, it won't be too difficult to estimate when shooting videos.



Here are some tips when shooting videos on iPhone, help you get good, sharp picture-quality videos, or enhance the art for videos. Some settings such as adjusting the light when recording a video, adjusting the first 1/3 layout will be difficult to implement and not standard. But if you do a lot, you will get experience for yourself to get the best video.
