Here is a list of 20 websites that are worth keeping an eye on, and are expected to make things happen in the future.

In terms of technology, they have gathered many interesting and attractive factors. The only thing they need now is just a little luck.

1. Popfly

If you're still unfamiliar with the term "mashups," Microsoft's Popfly is the ideal starting point to learn about it. Mashups is a combination, merging multiple Web sites or Web-based applications together to create a new utility program, without even writing to a single line of code.

Just drag and drop "site blocks / apps" like dragging bricks, putting them together, so you have a "mashup" of instant noodles. This mashup can exist as a standalone website, or you can insert it into an existing Web site. For example, you can easily create a mashup that gathers photos from sites like Flickr, then displays them on the screen in rubic form.

2. Yahoo Pipes

You will need a bit of perseverance to learn how to create "mashups" with Yahoo Pipes. Like Popfly, Yahoo Pipes allows you to create your own "mashups" by dragging and dropping existing modules, then setting up links between them. However, using Yahoo Pipes is much more complicated and difficult than Popfly, it requires you to tinker, scramble, and understand, not easily, "obvious" as Popfly.

But if you take a hard time digging a little, you will be able to create a very useful program, such as using Yahoo's map service (Yahoo Maps) to display the location of all apartments for rent in a certain area for example.

3. BuzzDash

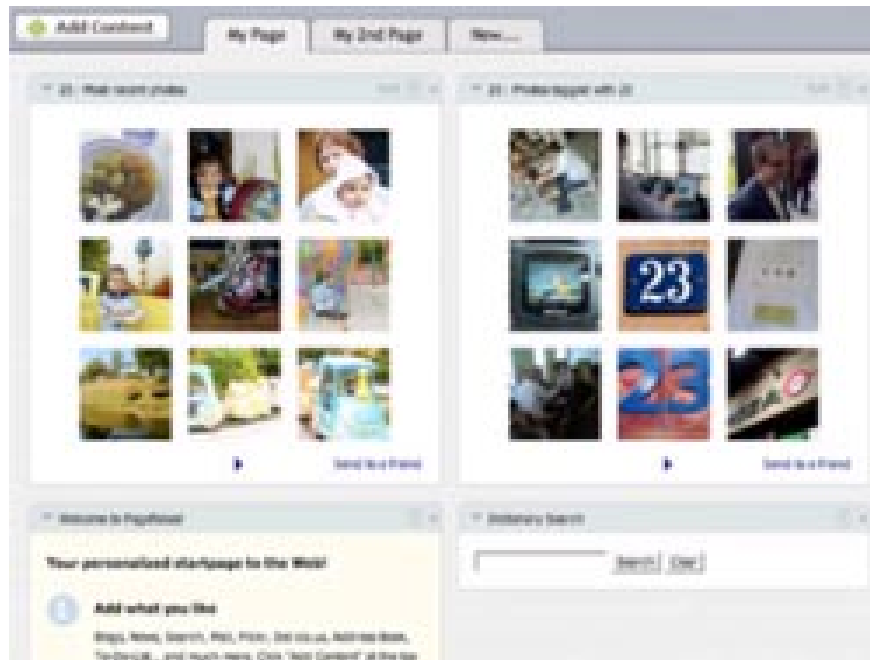
If you are a regular person asking the question " *Why is that?* ", BuzzDash will probably meet some of your tireless curiosity. The subtitle of the movie just saw "banana" too? Should we cry in the middle of work? Who is the best central midfielder of all time? etc.

If all these problems keep haunting you all night to insomnia, BuzzDash is the ideal sedative. It allows you to register members, comment on a certain issue and solicit comments from all other members in the blink of an eye. These referees are organized by topics such as movies, football and politics. And if you have an urgent problem, do not hesitate to come forward to receive your answer.

4. CircleUp

This website allows you to organize and divide your contacts into different groups. If you are about to organize an event, who will you need to be involved? What is the composition of guests? . That's when CircleUp works. Use this Website to send e-mail or IM messages to a specific group of people. Response messages will be summarized by CircleUp and provided to you in a single email. Very simple, easy to use and free .

5. Pageflakes

Using Pageflakes, you will be able to customize a Website so that it only shows the information or newsletter you want. This "super customizable" version allows you to select certain categories and sections. It also displays mini-apps you specify, such as movie showtimes, to-do lists, emails and even horoscopes on this day. A crossword sudoku? Does not matter!.

6. Spock

Spock is a tool dedicated to "finding information" about people. Starting by typing your own name or a search keyword describing the nature of a group of people, for example Rastafarians, Spock will scour through all the virtual social networks like MySpace, Friendster and a series of Universal Websites. The best way to give you an answer.

In many cases, you will get a multitude of different link types. For example, type in Barack Obama, Spock will display answers into groups such as "*Democratic Party*", "*Senator*" and "*US Presidential candidate 2008*". Click any link, you will also find websites related to Obama.

There is also a link to Obama's own image, website, as well as an article about him on Wikipedia. Currently new Spock is in test form and to access it, you need an invitation from a member (same as Gmail case before).

7. Swivel

Swivel created a chart of all things in life: from the number of crimes in the month to the popularity of American Idol. Statistics and graphs have a new roof on the Internet.

However, the most striking feature of this page is that it can integrate various charts to create "seamless" data lines.

8. OpenDNS

One reason that sometimes, you feel the Web is so cramped, sluggish (even if you are using broadband) is the Internet Domain Name System (DNS). When you type a URL into the browser, the DNS server will have to translate this URL into a numeric IP address that the Web server and PC can understand.

Usually this translation job is done by your ISP's servers.

However, OpenDNS can accelerate this process by assigning "translation" to its own high-speed DNS server system.

9. Trulia

This website will help you visualize some of the costs needed to purchase a new home. There are many real estate websites operating on the Internet, but Trulia is still very different. By combining virtual social networks with digital maps and search technology, Trulia allows you to find your dream home quickly.

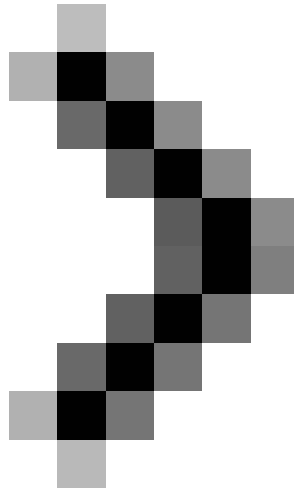

Click on the different categories such as price, surface area, number of restrooms . and Trulia will give you a list of "qualified" homes in a certain area - all is shown "over" on the 3D map. Some reference information is also provided as a general ground of house prices here, crime rate .
