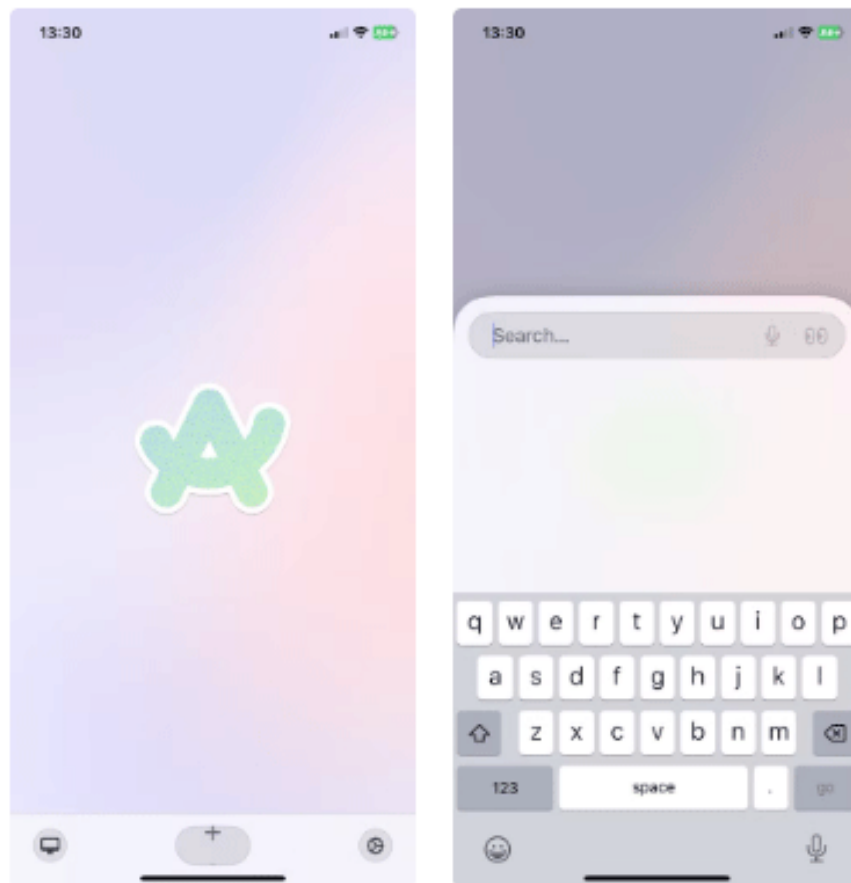

1. Minimalist, fresh interface

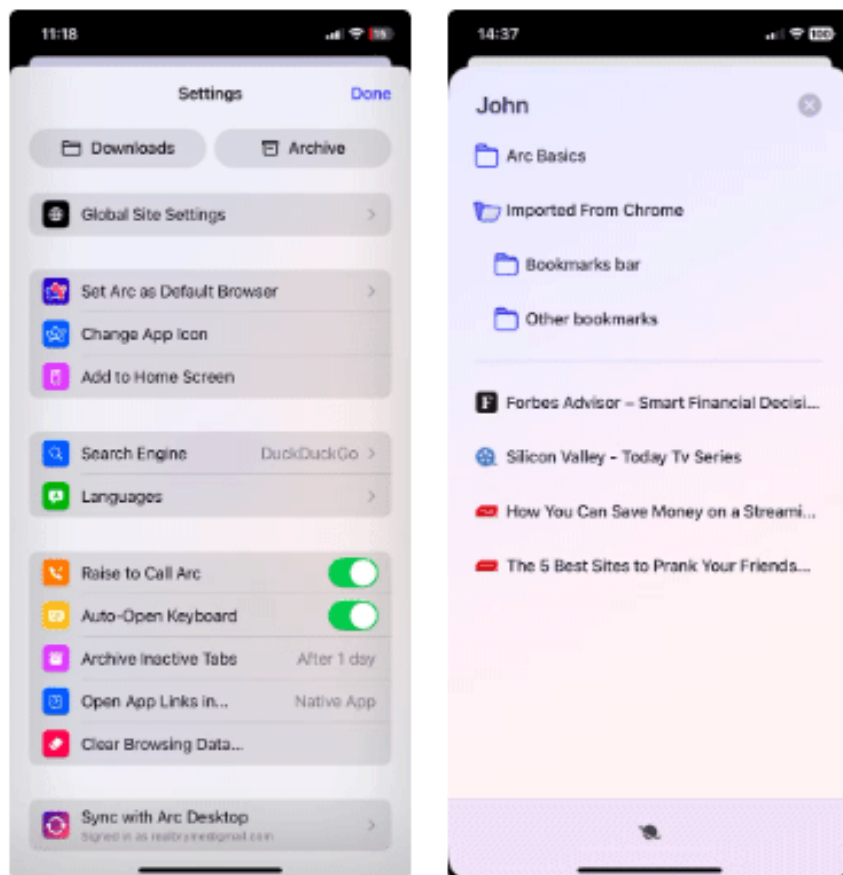

2. Superior synchronization with desktop version



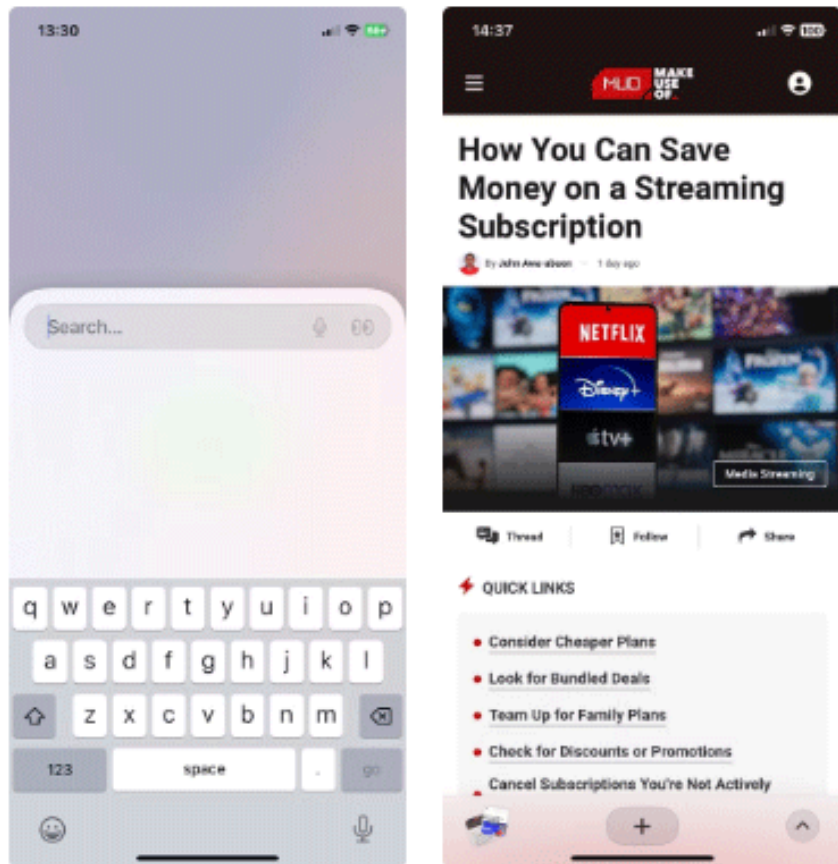

3. Fast, light and refreshingly simple

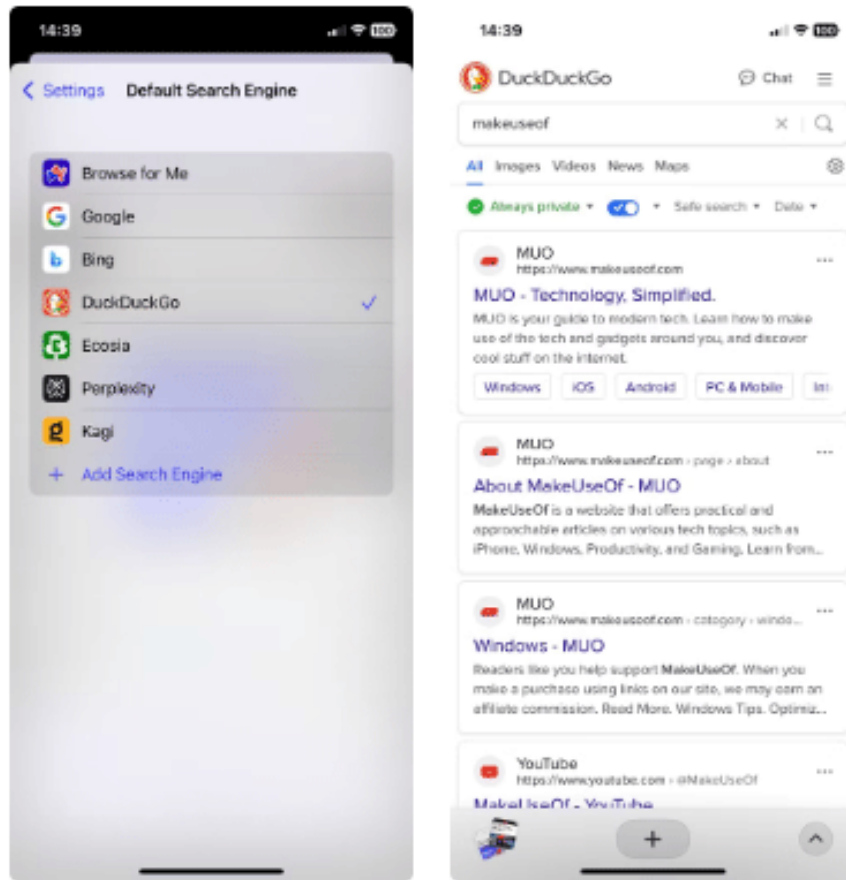
