

# Reasons to use Bitwarden instead of Apple Passwords

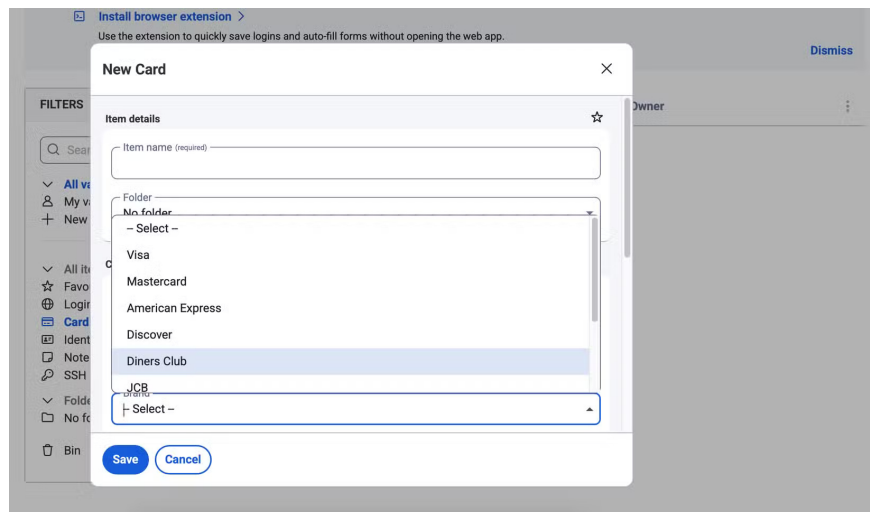
While this is a step up from the previous way passwords were organized on Apple devices, many people still don't feel like Apple Passwords maximizes the way they manage their logins.

While it was a step up from the previous password arrangement on Apple devices, many people still didn't feel like Apple Passwords maximized the way they managed their logins, so after months of testing, some people finally decided to switch to Bitwarden .

## 1. Ability to store payment information

One of the most frustrating things about Apple Passwords is that you can't organize your payment information. While you can use Apple Pay on many devices, not all online retailers accept it, so it would be nice to be able to store your card information in the Passwords app.

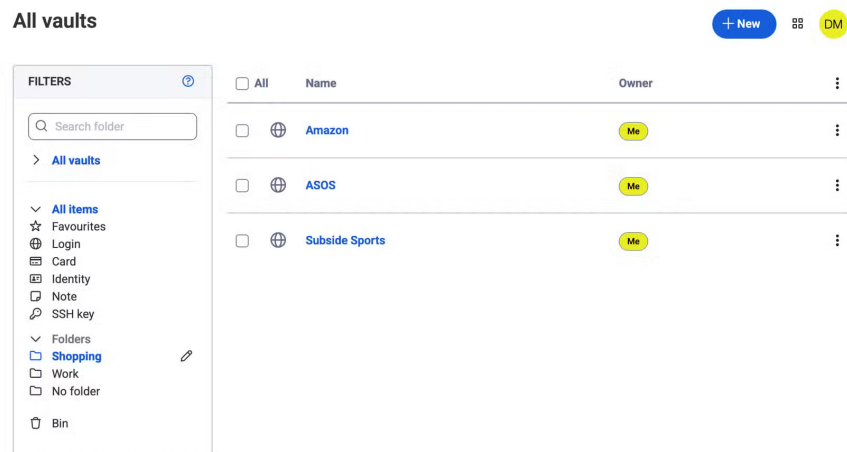
Bitwarden eliminates this issue right away. You can add your card number, name, and security number without any problems. Furthermore, you have the option to choose your brand; in addition to Visa and Mastercard (you can choose American Express and many other providers).



## 2. Easier Password Organization

Apple Passwords has some useful organizational features, like sorting Wi-Fi codes and other credentials. You can also filter by newest and oldest passwords, as well as by individual websites that have saved login information. But beyond that, the app is pretty limited.

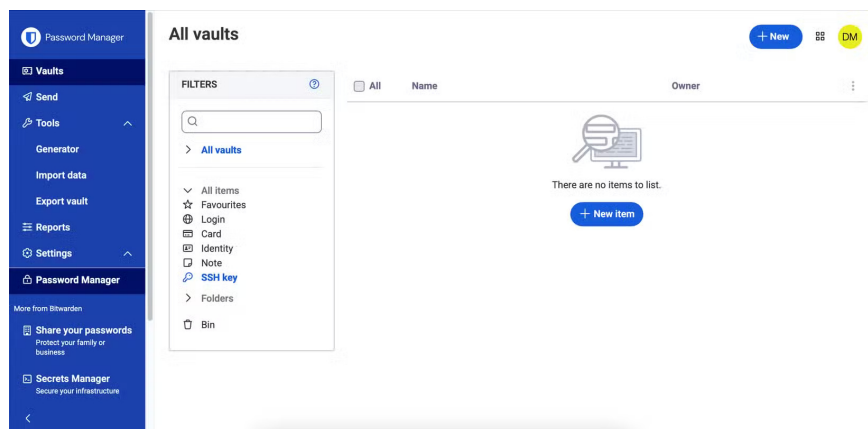
Bitwarden's password organization tools are much more advanced. You can mark your most frequently used credentials as favorites, meaning you can always access them whenever you need them.



## 3. Better interface

App design is important. Apple Passwords looks nice, obviously, since most Apple tools are aesthetically pleasing, but functionality and navigation are just as important. Passwords isn't the worst tool you'll ever use, but Bitwarden is better.

Bitwarden's interface is easy to navigate, with clear signage and bold text. Plus, the blue and white contrast means it's less tiring on the eyes.



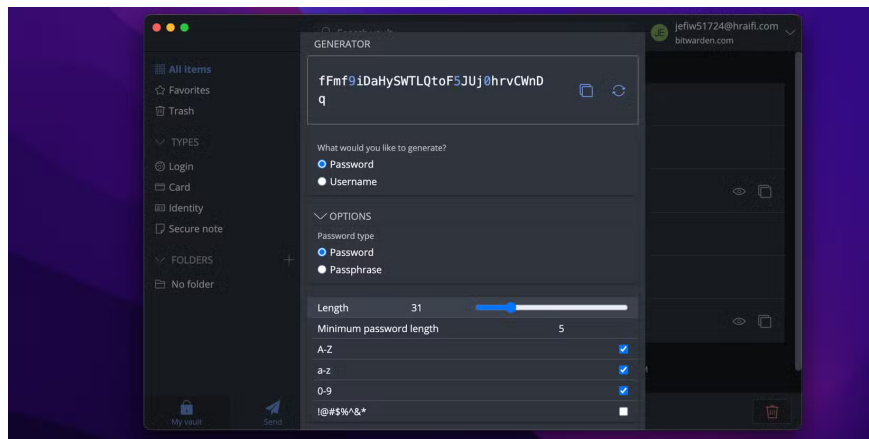
## 4. Can be used on non-Apple devices

Apple Passwords is great if you're already in the Apple ecosystem, but it becomes a pain if you have to use any other device. It's hard to feel confident sharing your passwords from Apple Passwords to a non-Apple device, so you'll need to find an alternative.

Bitwarden works on any device, whether Apple, Android, Windows, or anything else. It's also available on your web browser, giving you more control over how you manage your passwords.

## 5. Customize your new password better

Using Apple Passwords, you can easily create new passwords. The app lets you choose strong credentials based on whether you want special characters or not, making it much easier to ensure strong logins. Plus, you can make sure you don't use the same password everywhere — improving your online security without doing much.



But while there's nothing wrong with Apple Passwords' customization features, Bitwarden is simply better in this regard. When creating a new password in the app, you can choose from:

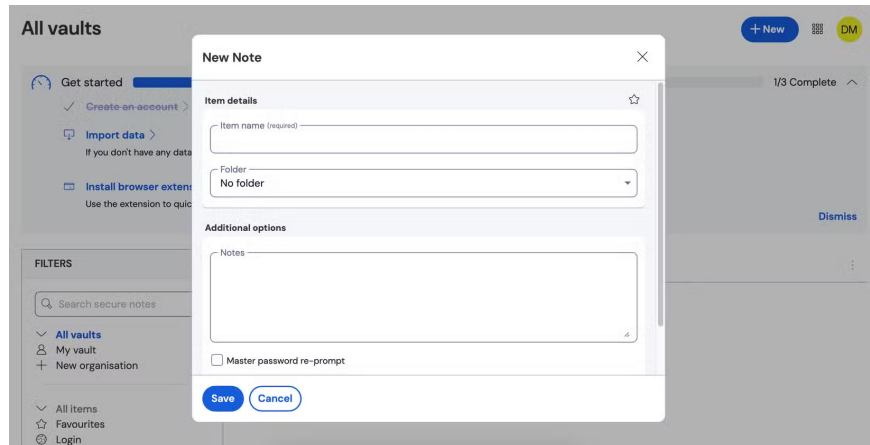
1. Password length
2. Minimum number and special characters
3. Want to keep or delete ambiguous characters?

There's also the option to choose whether to use special characters or not. However, unlike Apple Passwords, you can mark and delete specific categories.

## 6. In-app note options

People can use a variety of note-taking apps, such as Apple Notes and Notion, to take notes. However, sometimes you want to add extra security to what you write. Keeping these in Bitwarden is not only a great way to centralize everything; it also means that no one else can access your content.

With Bitwarden, you can add any notes you want and also divide them into different folders. So it seems more organized than some note-taking apps you might have used before. Like other note-taking tools, you can add your most important notes as favorites.
