

Revealing secrets hidden by the CIA for decades

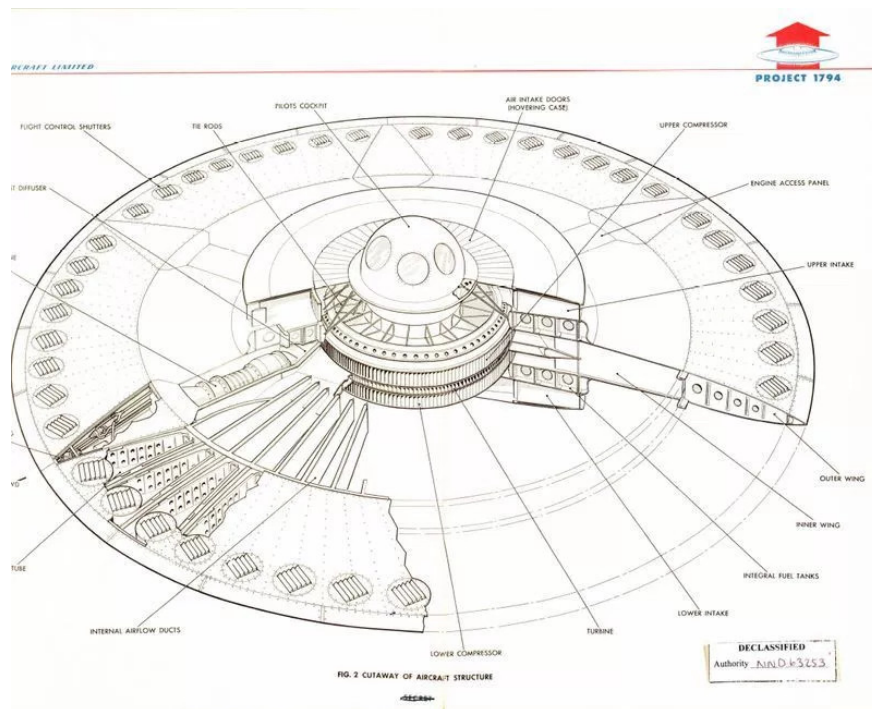

Below is a list of projects that have been publicized after years of hiding.

1. Project 1794

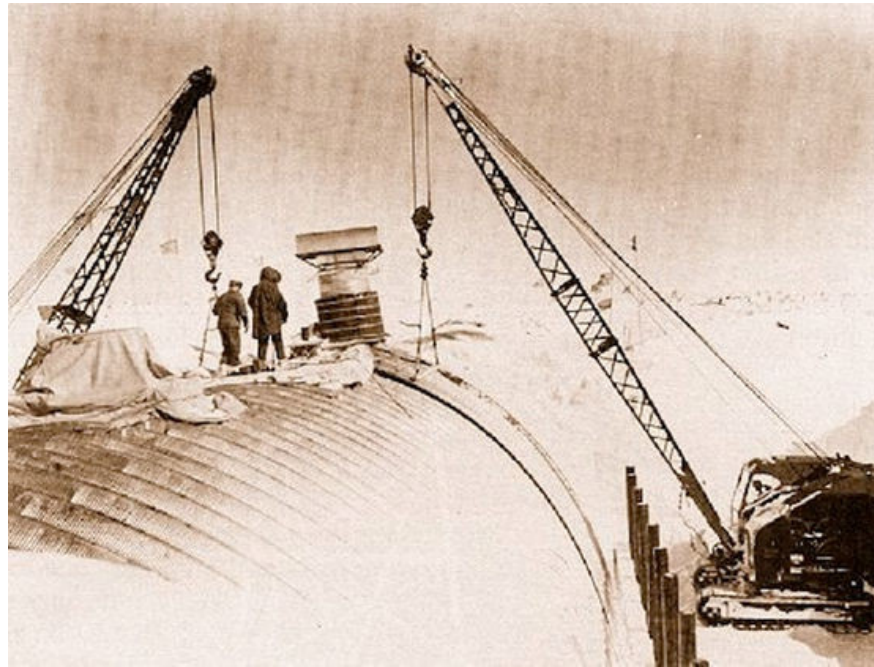
Since 1950, the US Air Force launched Project 1794 with the goal of making supersonic flying discs to shoot down Soviet aircraft.



According to the plan, the built-in flying saucers will have Mach 4 speeds four times faster than the speed of sound, fly more than 30km and the production cost of more than 3 million dollars at that time, about 26 million dollars hours.

Since the flying saucer was not stable and difficult to control at high speeds, the project was suspended in 1961. By the end of 2012, the US Air Force publicly announced the secret flight research program.

2. The Ice Project (Project Iceworm)



In 1960, the US military planned to build a mobile nuclear missile launch site inside the continental iceberg on Greendand Island in order to attack the Soviet Union at close range.

Engineers built underground systems under the cover of tunnel construction to cover the eyes of the Danish government. It was not until 1966 that the project had to stop operating because the moving tape destabilized the system. Today, America's once-secret military project is buried under the snow in the Arctic.

3. MK-ULTRA project

MK-ULTRA is a project launched by the CIA during the Cold War to control the human mind and create silent assassins. They used a variety of methods from hypnosis to medication, including LSD to study the impact on human neurological state and alter brain functions.

In 1973, to hide this crazy project, Richard Helms, CIA director, ordered to cancel all related documents.

4. Area 51



Area 51 viewed from satellite.

The secluded 920 square kilometer area near Groom Lake, in the Nevada desert is one of the most mysterious places in the world. Many people suspect, this area 51 is the focus of American UFO research.

Operating since 1955, but until 2013, Area 51 was only acknowledged by the CIA to exist and operate for the purpose of researching reconnaissance aircraft.

5. Project Grudge project



In late 1947, a series of strange objects were thought to be unidentified flying objects (UFOs) that landed on American territory. Therefore, in 1949, the US carried out a secret project called Project Grudge to study UFOs.

The initial results of the project show a lot of UFO records on the fact that the aircraft was either unable to identify the source due to insufficient information. When the project was announced to the public, some people criticized the project because they thought the UFO reports were untrue.

6. Paper Clip Program



In 1946, the American Paper Clip Program was conducted when agreed by President Harry Truman. The purpose of this program is to recruit Nazi scientists to work in the US to attract talents after the war and to avoid valuable knowledge from getting into the hands of the Soviet Union.

Wernher von Braun is a scientist at the top of America's recruitment list, and later he is the head of the Apollo mission to explore the moon.

7. Manhattan project



This project is one of the most famous top secret projects in the world. The Manhattan Project was built to study and create the first atomic bombs during World War II.

On July 16, 1945, the first nuclear device was tested in New Mexico state. Less than a month after two atomic bombs dropped on Hiroshima and Nagasaki in Japan claimed tens of thousands of lives and left consequences until today.

8. Gladio program



This is a plan with the participation of many NATO countries during the Cold War period. The program was developed to prevent the Soviet Union from going into conflict.

The Gladio program has the task of preparing secret troops to counter the Soviet offensive during the war. In 1990, the Italian prime minister published information about this force on a website.

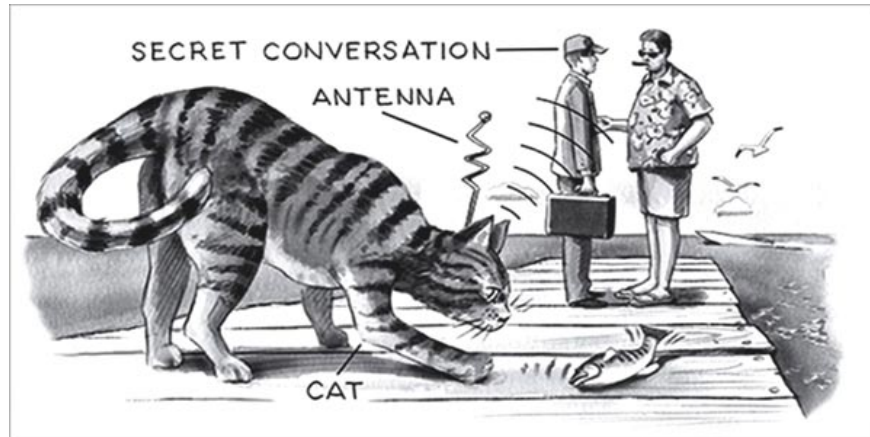
9. Bath Project



Fearing the Soviet repossession of Alaska state, in the early years of the Cold War the US government recruited and trained a secret military group that provided wartime intelligence. 89 native Alaskans were trained in encryption techniques, decrypting information to spy on Soviet troops if they attacked Alaska.

In 2014, documents about this program were published.

10. Spy cat



After World War II, tensions between the US and the Soviet Union increased. In 1967, the CIA spent up to \$ 20 million to train Soviet scouts called "Scout Cats" (Ascoustic Kitty).

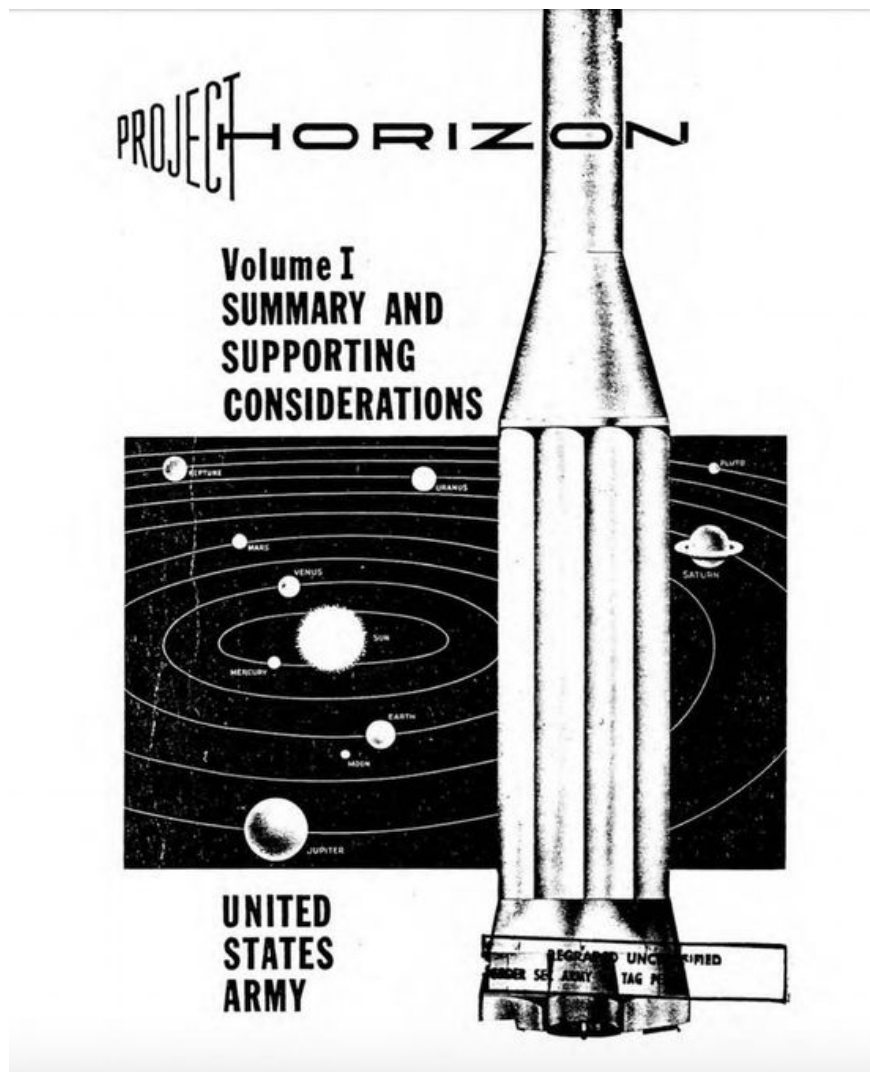
Cats are implanted with reconnaissance devices such as recorders, antennas, transmission equipment, etc., to spy on the Soviet Union. In 2001, the US National Security Agency released documents related to this project.

11. Bom in Greenland



In 1968, American B52 aircraft crashed near Thule, Greenland and four thermonuclear bombs. The US and Danish military carried out a project to remove radioactivity and collect debris in this area.

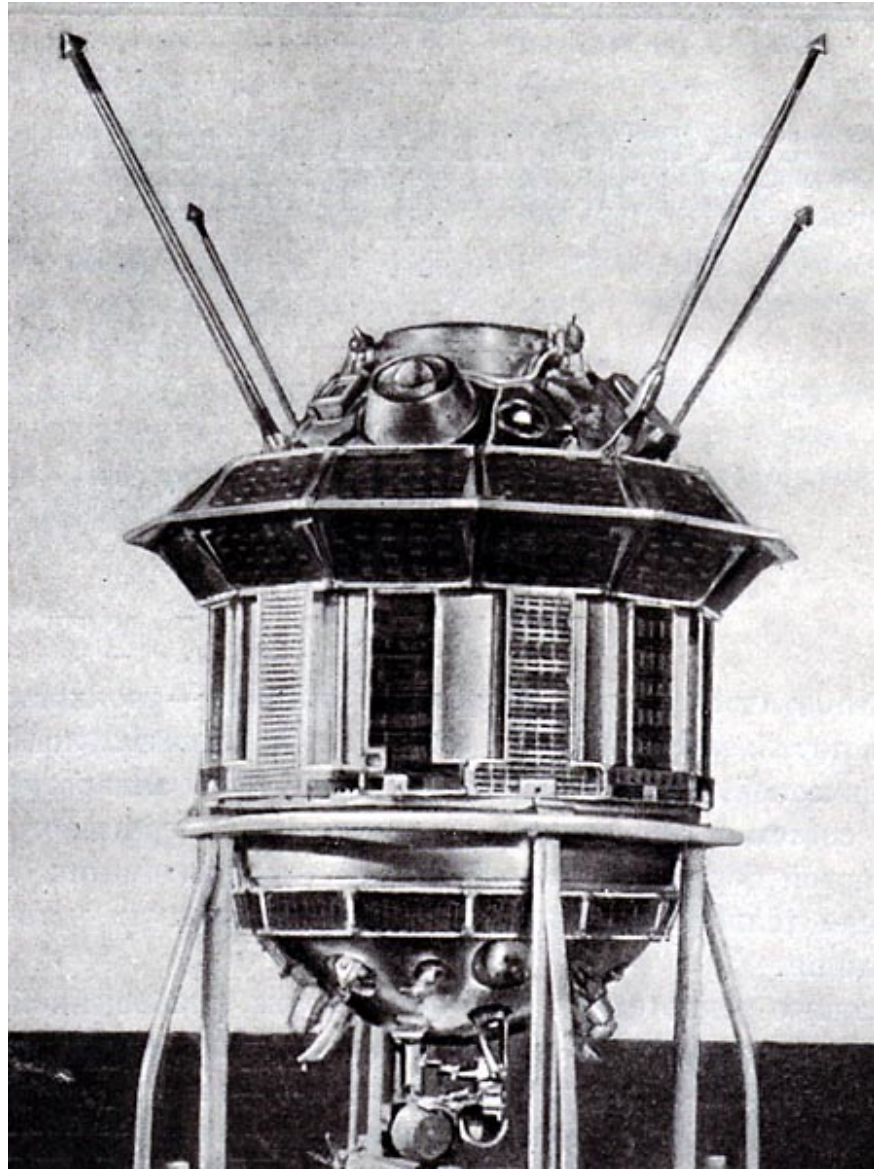
12. Horizon project



In 1959, the US military set up the Horizon project to build a military base on the Moon before NASA could bring people up here in 1969.

Another US Air Force program also aims to build a base to attack Earth from space. As planned, to prove America's power to the world, a nuclear bomb will be detonated on the Moon.

13. Abducting Lunik

In the early 1960s, the Soviet and US space races reached the peak when the Soviet Union launched many Moon exploration satellites. In response to this situation, the CIA outlined a plan to "kidnap" the Soviet Lunik spacecraft within one night.

One night, the CIA "borrowed" the satellite, disassembled, took pictures and returned the status quo to the Soviet Union. There is no record that the Soviet Union has detected this "kidnapping".

14. The Crossroads campaign



In 1946, the US launched the Crossroad campaign to carry out a series of nuclear weapons tests at Bikini Atoll in order to study their influence on naval vessels.

In July 2016, documents about this horrific campaign were revealed, information about the harmful effects of radiation on civilians was published.
