Ancient residents considered rodent meat as a protein-rich food. And when analyzing the rat fossil carbon isotope, it is possible that these rats can be partially baked on embers and not burnt completely like some destruction or killing mice.

These signs of baked rat carbon in Scotland are quite similar to archaeological data about a baked mouse that appears in archaeological sites in Patagonia and South Africa.
