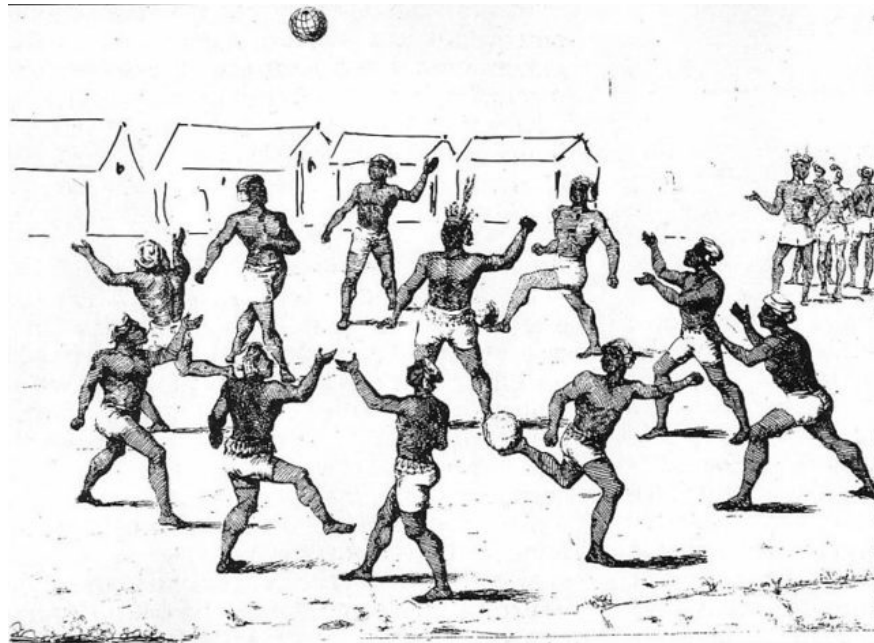
3. Whale corpses are food only for kings
