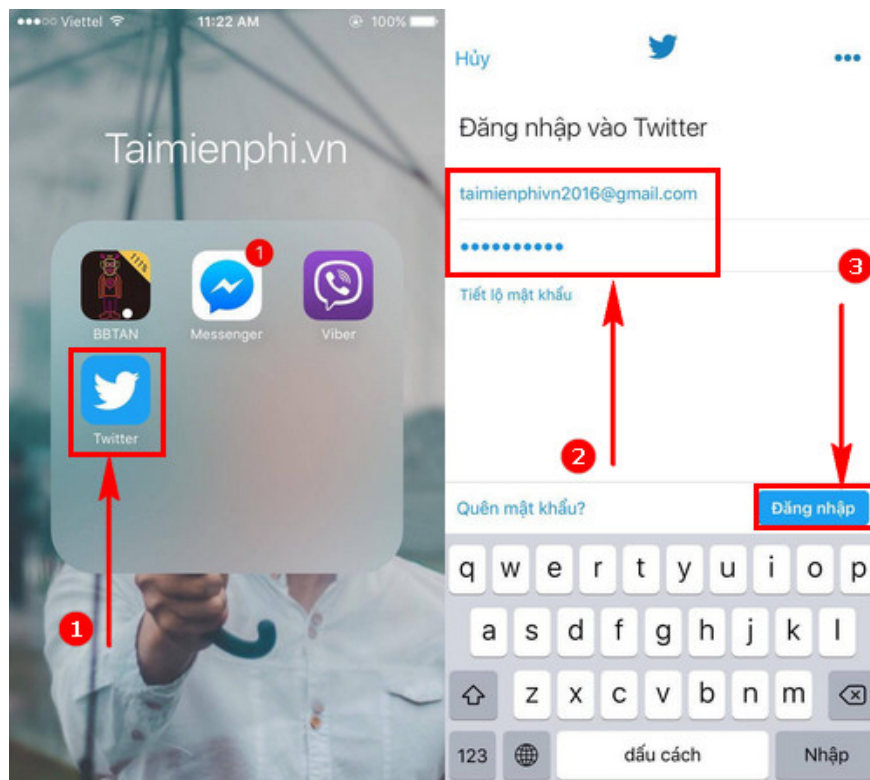

GIFWrapped: Download **GIFWrapped**

Step 1: Open your Twitter app and log in with **your account and password** .

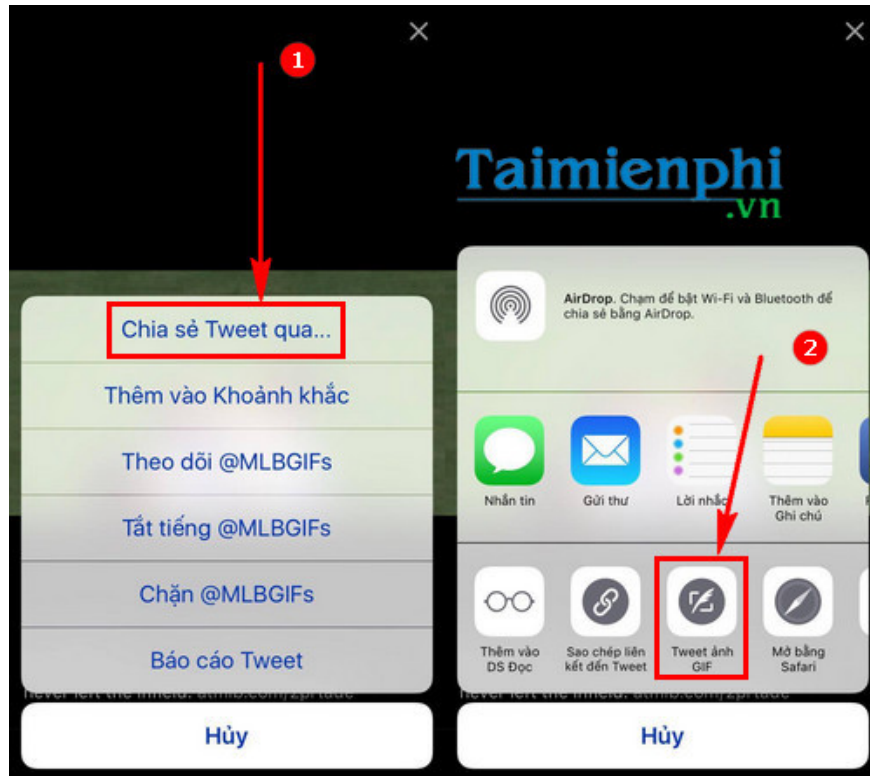


Step 2: Next, in your Twitter account, find the GIF images you want to download to your computer or phone. Then click **the arrow** next to the GIF image.

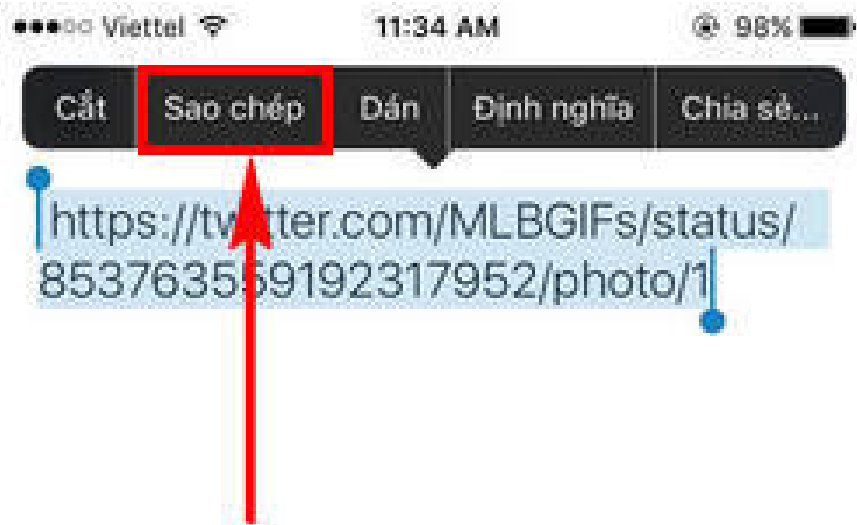


Twitter is also a social network that features many interesting and meaningful videos. Besides watching the videos, we can also download them to our devices for other purposes. Downloading Twitter videos isn't as complicated as many people think.

Step 3: When you click the arrow next to the image, several options will appear. Click on " **Share Tweet via .**" and then select "**Tweet GIF image**".



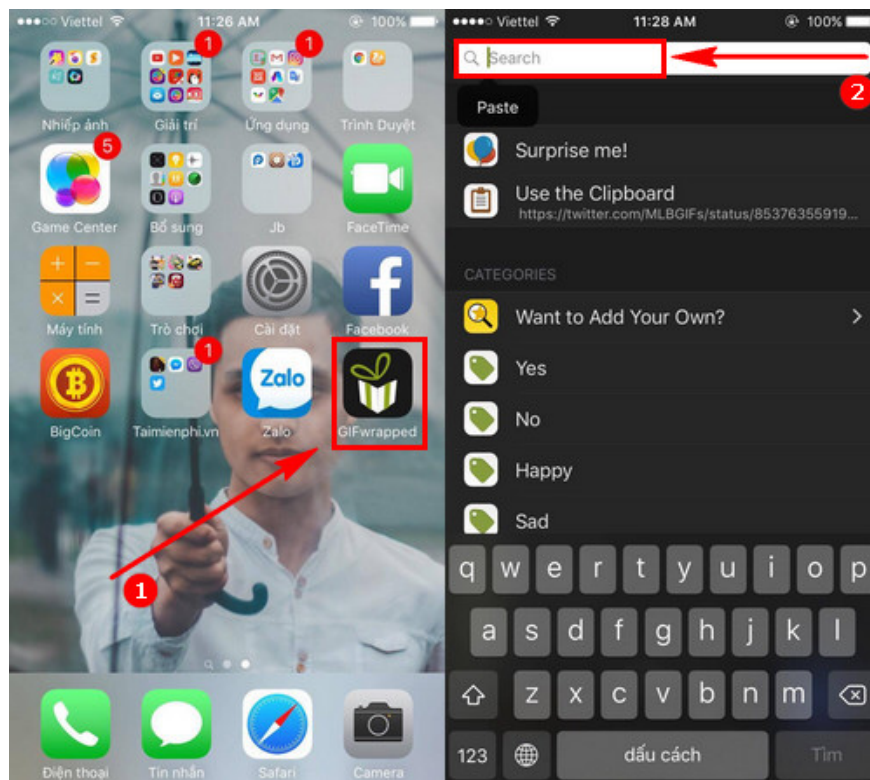
Step 4: You will immediately see the GIF link . Highlight the link and click **Copy**.



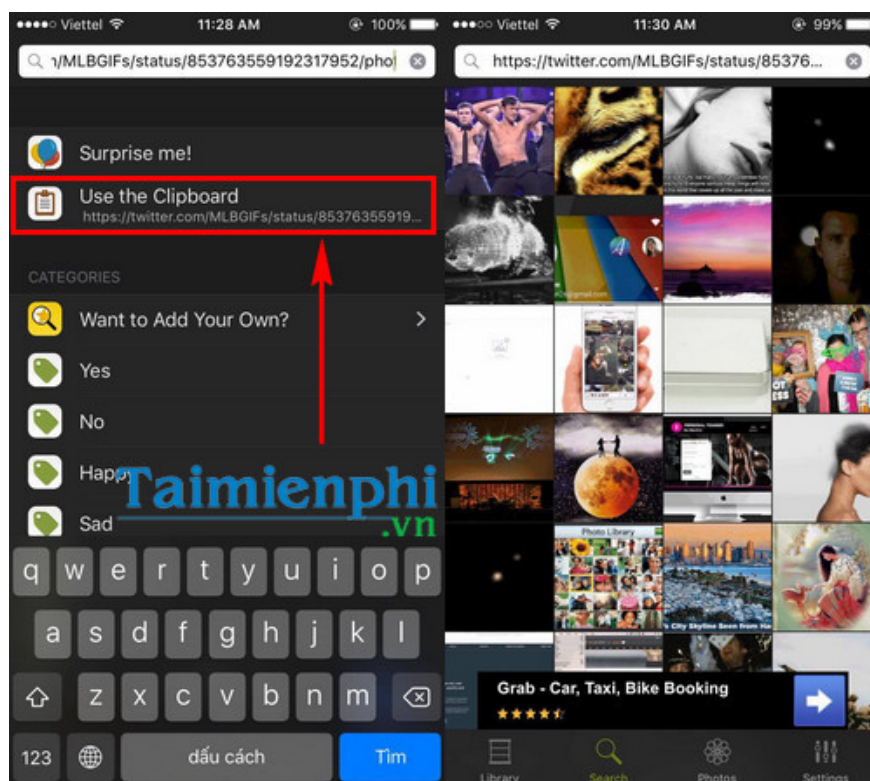

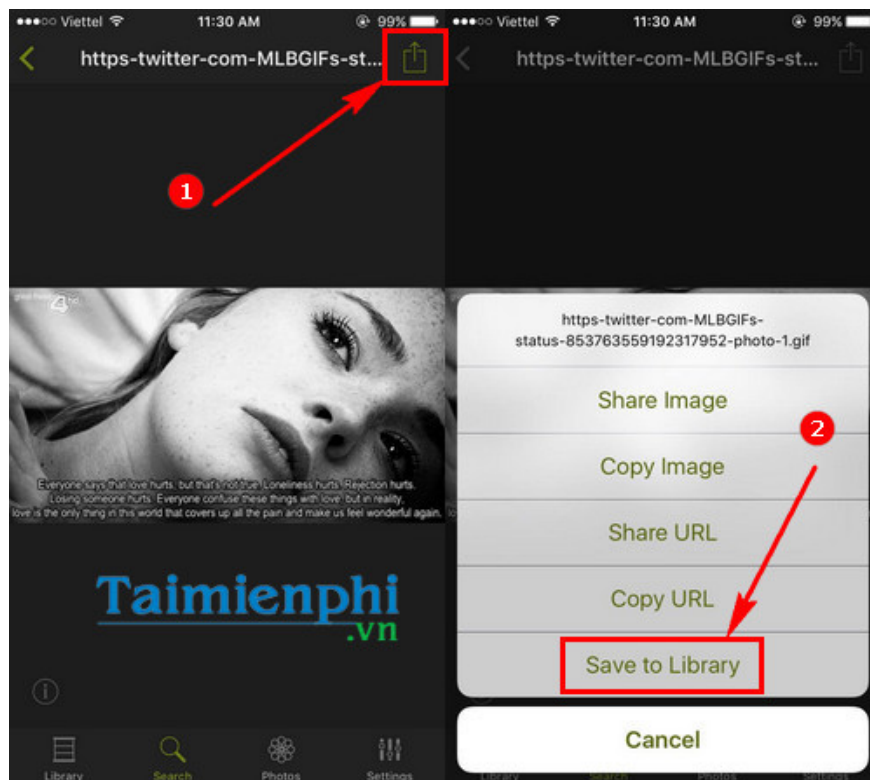
Step 5: Next, download and open the GIFWrapped app on your phone. In the **Search** section , tap and **paste** the link you just copied from the GIF image.



Step 6: You can select "Use the clipboard" to get more GIFs from the Tweet profile where you want to save the GIFs.



Step 7: Finally, simply click on any GIF you want to download to your phone. Select **the share icon** in the upper right corner and press **Save to Library** . The GIF will immediately be saved to your phone's photo folder.



Users can save GIF images from Twitter to their computers and phones in a similar way to how they save them on a computer, the only difference being that they don't need an application; instead, they access the Twitter website and GIFWrapped.

Another useful tip for long-time Twitter users is to back up your Twitter data to prevent account loss. If you've been using Twitter for several years, backing up your data is essential. Your tweets and GIFs are priceless gifts, irreplaceable memories, so you should back up your Twitter data to your computer or email for future reference.
