

Scarlett Johansson, Channing Tatum team up in 'Fly Me To The Moon'

Scarlett Johansson and Channing Tatum will be a very romantic couple in the new romantic comedy 'Fly Me To The Moon'. The latest trailer of the work has partly revealed the sweet and touching story revolving around this duo.
