look much different than a regular hat because the electric stimulator is quite small, yes It can be neatly attached inside a hat that others cannot recognize.

Of course, before applying it to humans, the team conducted countless experiments on mice in a laboratory environment. When tested on mice, the team began to experiment on humans, and the first volunteer, the father of a research team member, was bald on average. The end result has allowed scientists to confidently claim that this project is a great success.

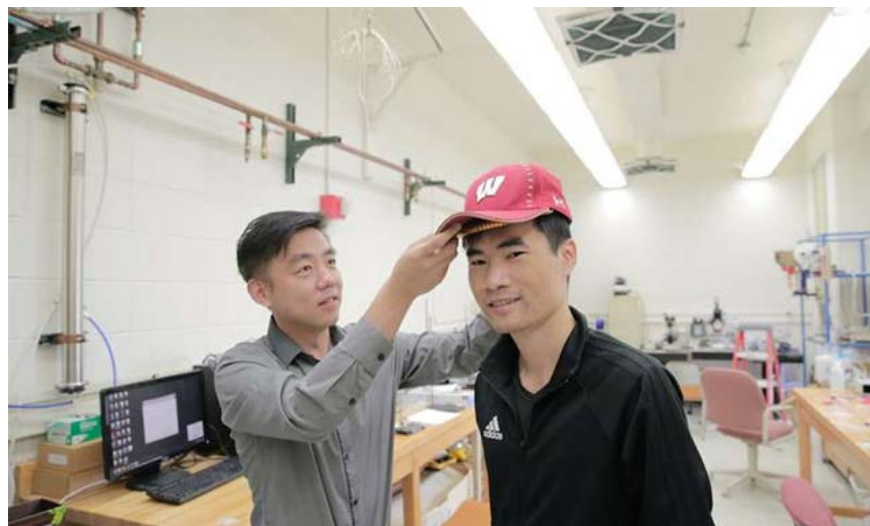
The irritation device is very small and can be attached inside any of your favorite hats

In addition, according to a press release from the University of Wisconsin, this device requires absolutely no battery (both rechargeable and removable).

'Small devices called' nano generators' built into the device automatically absorb energy from every movement the user makes, and then transmit low-frequency electrical impulses to the skin. That gentle electrical stimulation makes the 'lazy' hair follicles excited and active again. '
