The court ordered not to allow the press to reveal the identity of this young man.

Not only did he share videos about the tragedy in Christchurch, he also posted a photo with the caption "Achieving the goal", about one of the mosques becoming the target of the attack.



Under New Zealand's Censorship Law, the government is allowed to make some videos illegal if viewed, owned or shared. And the 17-minute terrorist video in New Zealand has been categorized as a "officially banned" group over the weekend by New Zealand censorship director David Shanks.

Therefore, despite not being involved in the terrorist attack, the young man still faces up to 28 years in prison for allegedly sharing a obscene video, some other violent video and inciting violence. via message lines in the inbox.

Stephen O'Driscoll, District Court Judge, refused this bail.

The bloody shootings in New Zealand caused the deaths of 50 people and wounded dozens of others who were hung up on Facebook. Soon after, the video about this horrific incident spread quickly on social networks.
