Differences in screen quality

Cheap phones have a more limited aperture, and as a result, get less light in areas where shooting conditions are poor.

Cheap phones do not have NFC



If you choose a cheap phone, you can say goodbye to NFC. It's been eight years since you saw the NFC feature on the first phone, but to this day, it's not a feature you can see on all low-cost phones on the market. If this is a feature you need, you may have to spend about \$ 400 (VND 9.6 million) or more.

You may miss out on updates



When it's time to roll out updates, the latest and greatest smartphones will receive them first. Phones coming before the latest model will also receive updates, but after a few months. If you own a cheap phone, chances are you'll never get the update in the first place.

Cheap phones come with inferior CPUs and less memory

If you're impatient, a cheap phone may not be the right choice for you. They come with a worse CPU and take longer to complete tasks. Tasks may take longer when the phone is loaded with more and more files, such as videos and images.

Also, budget phones don't come with 64GB of storage for files. Keep in mind that even if the manufacturer of the phone says it comes with a certain amount of memory, you still don't have the whole number to store your content, because bloatware is used. use a large amount of it.

Is choosing a cheap phone worth it?

Choosing a cheap phone is the right decision depending on what you plan to use the phone for. If you just need a phone that's primarily for calling and some basic lightweight applications, then choosing a cheap model is fine. If you want a phone that meets your gaming needs or helps organize your busy life, it's best to choose the more expensive models.

However, this does not mean that a cheap phone is not worth it. In third-world countries, where people are too poor to buy a thousand-dollar phone, these cheap phones allow them to keep up to date without having to starve for a month. .
