

Simple ways to protect home security cameras, avoid hacking

1. Activate two-step authentication if the camera supports it

If your security camera supports two-step authentication, activate it now. This will make it difficult for hackers to carry out the attack, as both a password and verification code must be sent to the host's mobile phone.

2. Do not install security cameras in sensitive areas

Do not install security cameras in private, sensitive areas such as bedrooms, bathrooms, etc.

3. Choose a hard-to-access security camera installation location

One of the ways for the bad guys to make the attack is to remove the security cameras outside your home, then use them to access the network and recorded clips. So, please choose the location of the security camera so that bad guys cannot reach and remember to attach it tightly.



4. Do not share any clips on social networks

Many users often share recorded clips from security cameras on social networks without knowing that this action is also risky.

5. Regularly delete old videos from security cameras

Delete old videos recorded by security cameras to prevent hacking, so that bad guys will have less access to information about you and your family.

6. Change your password often

Strong passwords should be set, avoid passwords related to family members' names and birthdays, and frequently change passwords.

7. Regularly update the latest software

When the manufacturer releases regular software updates for security cameras, update them now as they often contain security patches.
