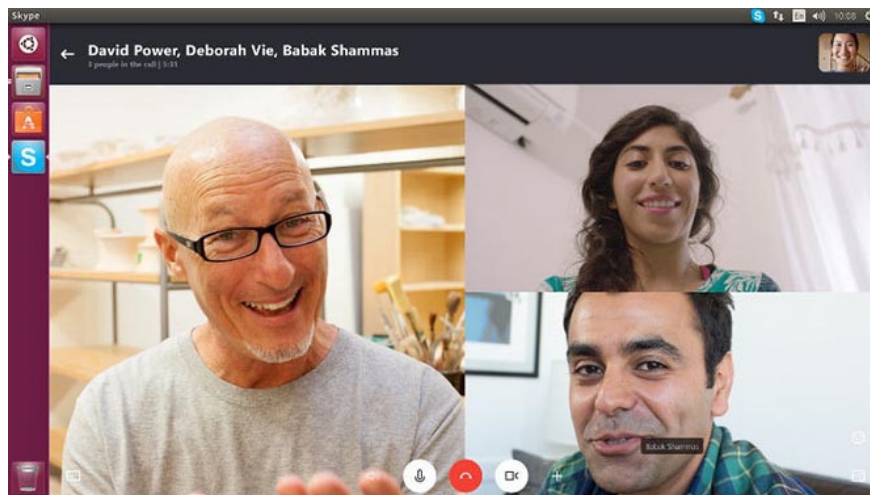


Skype is available for Linux users, download and experience

Snap is packaged software designed to work on any Linux platform, from desktop, cloud or IoT device. It was first released in 2016. They are cleaned, away from sensitive devices and have all the software requirements required for the application to run so it is more manageable than the archive. Developers can accelerate updates directly to users and return features if there is a problem.

With Skype on Linux, users will enjoy the latest versions when released and have more applications to choose from.

To install a new Snap, visit the Snapcraft.io website and download it. It will work on distributions that support Snap, including Ubuntu, Linux Mint, Manjaro, Debian, Arch Linux, OpenSUSE and Solus.
