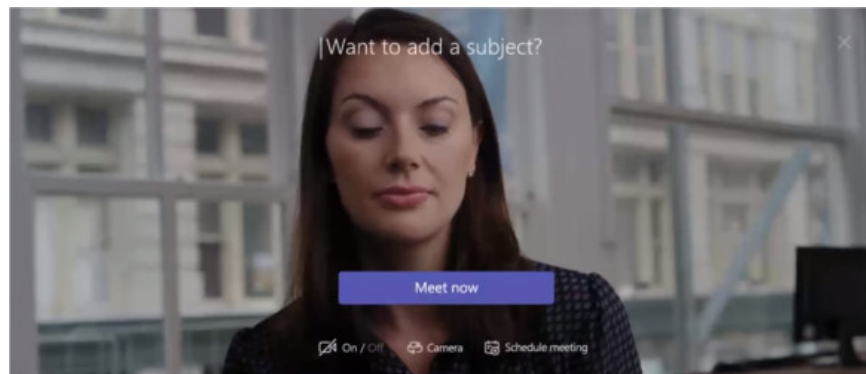


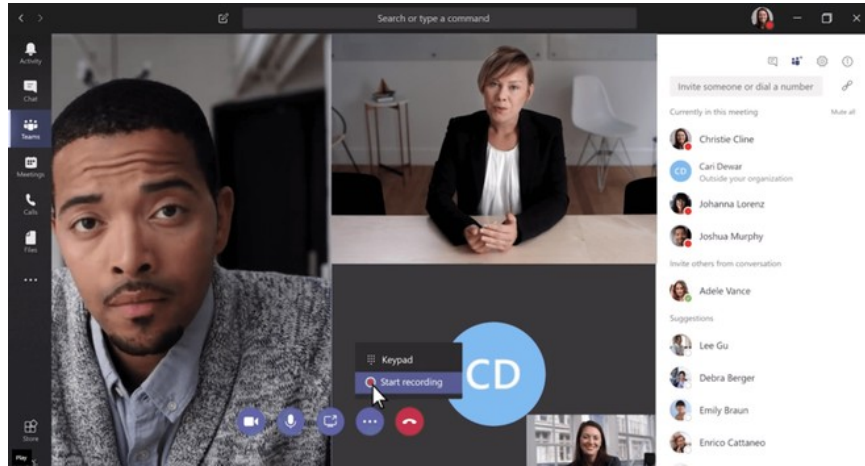
Skype launches Meet Now feature without registration, without installation
