Here are three points that Snow Leopard can hardly beat Windows 7 :

1. Hardware requirements are too different

Windows 7 is capable of operating on most current PC hardware platforms. Obviously, faster processors and larger RAM capacity will make the device's performance more powerful, but Windows 7-only computers require a minimum of 1GHz CPU and 1GB of RAM. This can be said to be the common configuration parameters of computers currently on the market. That means, all computers now can install Windows 7 operating system.

Meanwhile, Snow Leopard will only run on Macs equipped with Intel hardware (specifically the processor and chipset). That means Snow Leopard does not work with most of the users' computers already on the market, even with users' computers that are running Mac OS X today.

2. Only an upgrade

No matter how aggressive the ads are, Snow Leopard is not a new operating system. They are just an upgraded version of the implementation with some new features. For Microsoft, such a version is often called service patches (*Service Packs*) and is provided free of charge.

Windows 7 is a new operating system. Many people believe that Windows 7 is simply a flashy update of Windows Vista, but Microsoft has provided Snow Leopard-like updates to Windows Vista twice, including Windows Vista Service Pack 1 and Service Pack 2.

Windows 7 has the same user interface (UI) as Vista, but they are a completely new operating system. Asking anyone who uses Windows Vista, they hate this operating system, but they love the Windows 7 Beta version when using and comparing the two versions.

Snow Leopard has some advanced features and some are new but still on the old version. In fact, the nature of Windows 7 is superior, many features seem to be picking up Mac OS X but improving the capabilities for Windows Vista and many features of the user interface, security, . .

3. The cost of netbooks running Mac OS X is quite expensive

Netbooks are an attractive platform for the Mac market, but the price for this product line is the most telling thing. Apple products have sleek designs and designs but are always more expensive than other competitors. Currently, the netbook segment has the strongest growth rate in the computer market but this market will have two limitations that operating system manufacturers need to care about. It is not high configuration and low cost. Therefore, in response to this market segment, manufacturers need to have their own versions for their minimum configuration and lower prices.

At a price of \$ 29, Snow Leopard seems like a reasonable investment for current Mac OS X users, but that depends on whether their device is lucky enough to meet the hardware requirements for upgrading. . Moreover, many applications that are not used on Snow Leopard such as Backup Bouncer, DataBackup, Disc Inventory X, DiskWarrior 4.1, ElectricSheep, Fallout II (game), Flip4Mac 2.3.0.7, Forklift, Leopard Cache Cleaner, Macromedia FreeHand MX 11.0. 2, MailFX Pro, MenuMeters, WindowShadeX, WireTap Studio, X-Lite, .

However, in the future of the desktop market, Windows 7 will probably face many threats from open Linux operating systems like Ubuntu or Fedora. This open source operating system can operate computers that require hardware configuration like Windows 7 but are provided to users for free.
