10. Too many ads

Obviously advertising is one of the most annoying things online (but not the most). It is not inevitable because they are just advertisements, but because they are too numerous and often indiscriminate. Even so, blocking them is easy. Users simply choose an ad blocking application for Chrome, Firefox, Safari, and even Internet Explorer.

Users can also use ClickToFlash for Safari on Mac OS X so that whenever you want to see a Flash on the web, you will have to click it to run.

8. Forms and login are unattractive

While most browsers save passwords and help you fill out online forms, this is only really useful when you use a web browser. Although users can stick with the same web browser on all systems, you don't have this luck when using mobile devices. It will also be troublesome when you decide to change the web browser. Use a password service that works on all the devices you are using - on your desktop computer and on your phone, portable devices and tablets - remove these discomforts aside. Although there have been minor problems recently, we still recommend using LastPass. Of course, there are a few other great options that you may like them, such as KeePass, 1Password, .

7. Register for a new account

Sometimes users want to try a new web service without going through the long online login steps.



Sometimes you just want to use a quick service and will not use that account later. Whatever the reason, logging in means you have to provide your personal information - something that we don't always want. Fortunately, there are databases of public usernames and passwords that you can borrow temporarily in these cases. BugMeNot is a great choice and it also has an extension for Chrome and Firefox browsers. In addition, you can also access it through the official website, providing a bookmarklet for almost any browser.

6. Bad and tangled sites



Basically, they only remove CSS to make pages look different. Besides, we can also use extensions and add-ons for this. For example, you can change YouTube (Firefox and Chrome), Facebook (most browsers), Twitter (using Greasemonkey), and of course Gmail (Firefox and Chrome).

5. Social network

2. Wait for downloading files from file sharing services

If you've ever visited MegaUpload or RapidShare, you probably know that downloading a file from one of these pages requires a Premium account. Without this Premium account, users will encounter a slower file download speed and a countdown timer that forces you to wait. This is only to cause discomfort and lead to user fees.

Although it is not possible to fix slow download speeds, you can still eliminate the waiting time with a very smart extension for Firefox, SkipScreen. It is said that the Skipscreen supports Chrome, but it still doesn't look right now. Another pretty handy solution is RapidShare Download Helper.

1. Trolls
