

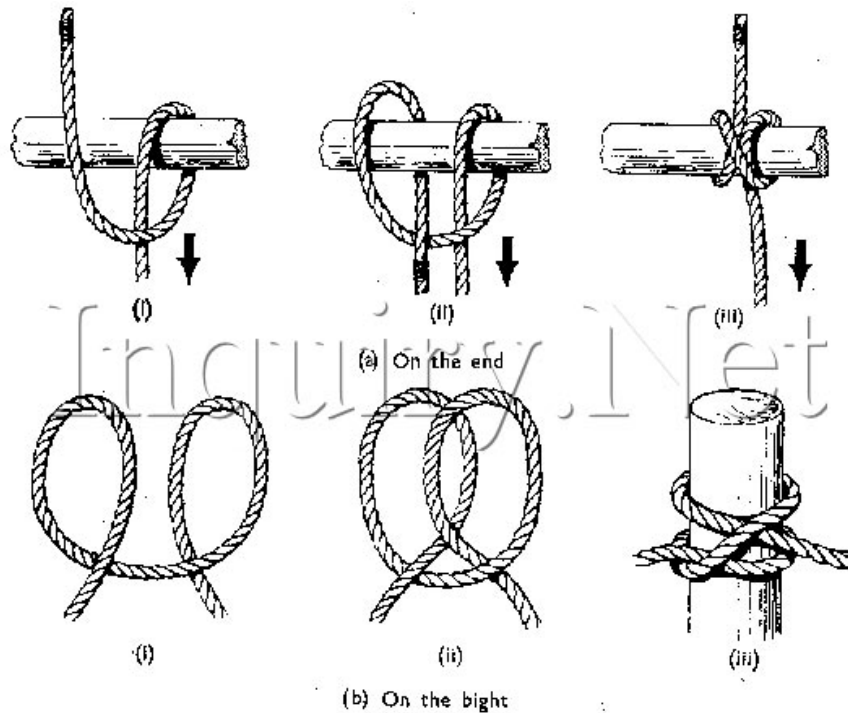
Some ways to tie the pole or everyone should know

How many knots do you know? Did you know how to tighten and tie the rope? If not, then please refer to the following article of the Network Administrator to be able to learn a few ways to tie the string super easy but extremely tight.

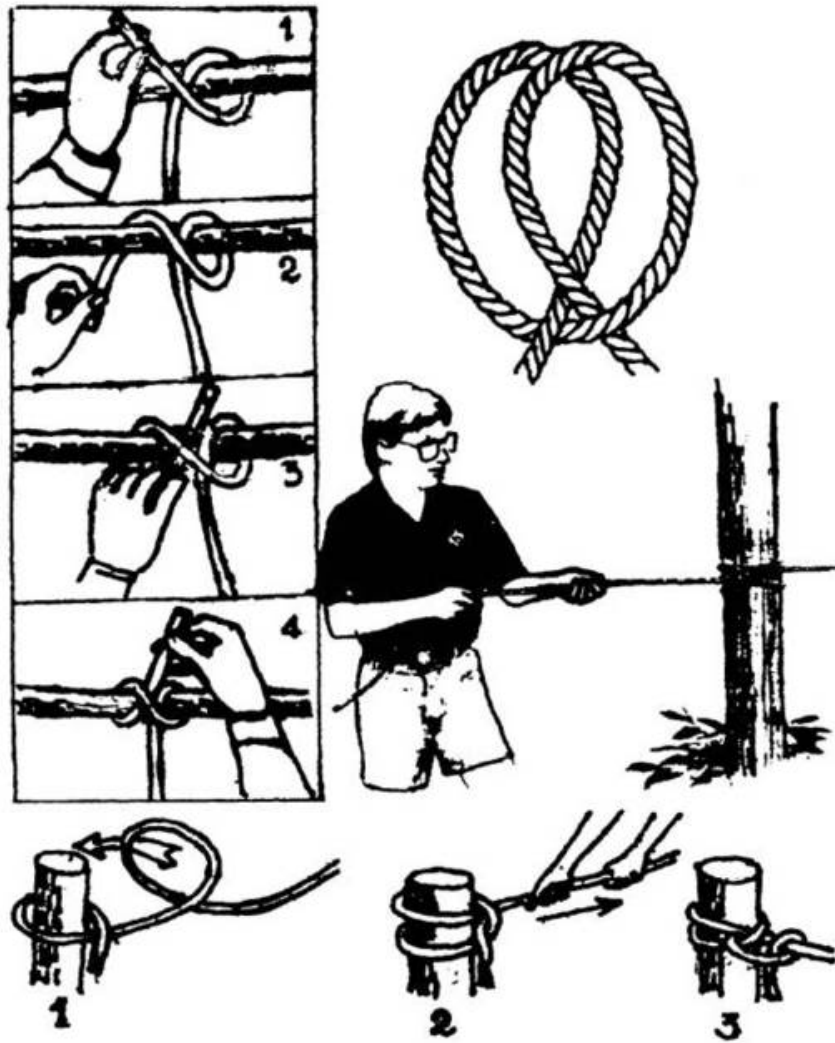
From a young age we have been taught some basic knotting methods for parents to tie things. As we grow up, we learn more knotting ways to serve personal purposes such as tying a rope to tent camp when traveling .

How many knots do you know? Did you know how to tighten and tie the rope? If not, please refer to the following article of Network Administrator to learn some easy and extremely tight knots, you can apply it in your life to be able to tie things. Don't worry about falling. Please read along for reference.

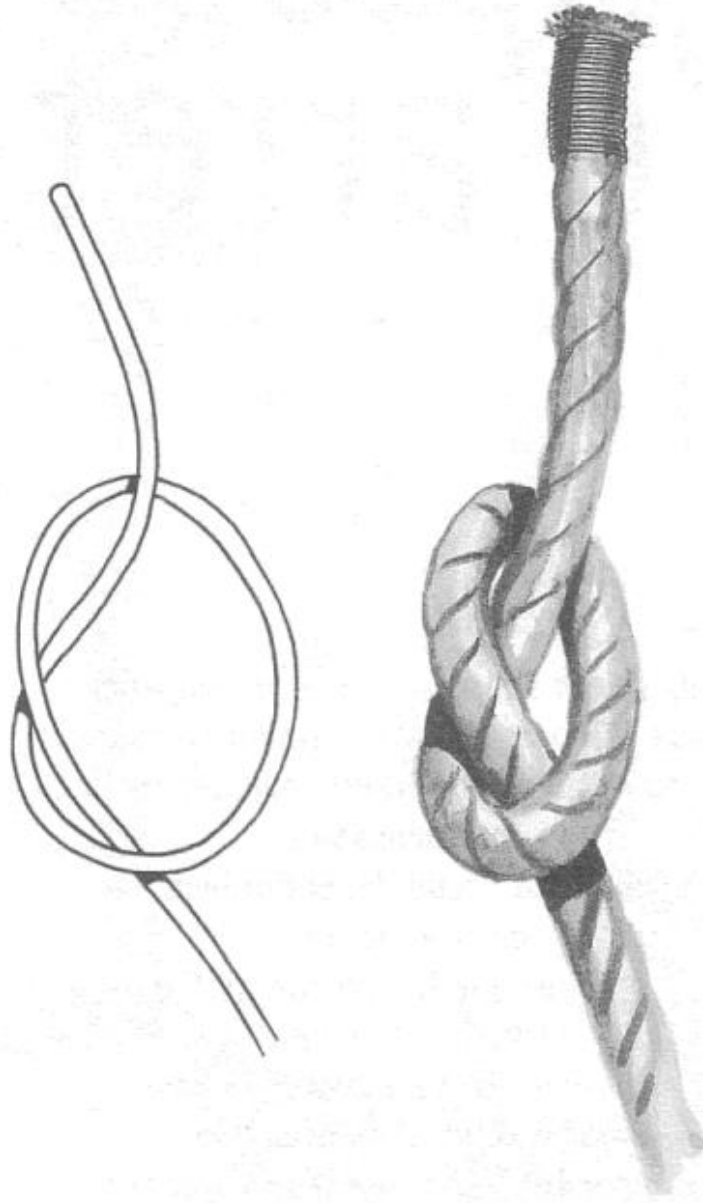
1. Fishing boat button (clove hitch)



This is usually used when tying a boat to a pile on the shore or tying the tents (when camping). The fishing boat button is also the starting knot for tree assemblies.

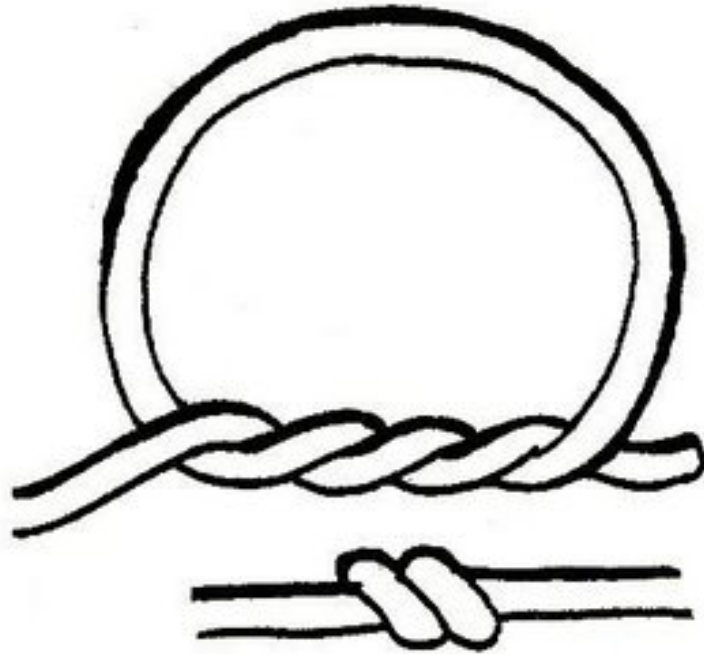


2. Single button (Overhand Knot)



This tie is extremely popular with many of us. The advantage of a single knot is quite tight, but the downside of this way is that it is very difficult to remove. So, before forcing you to determine if you need to remove that piece of wire before tightening it.

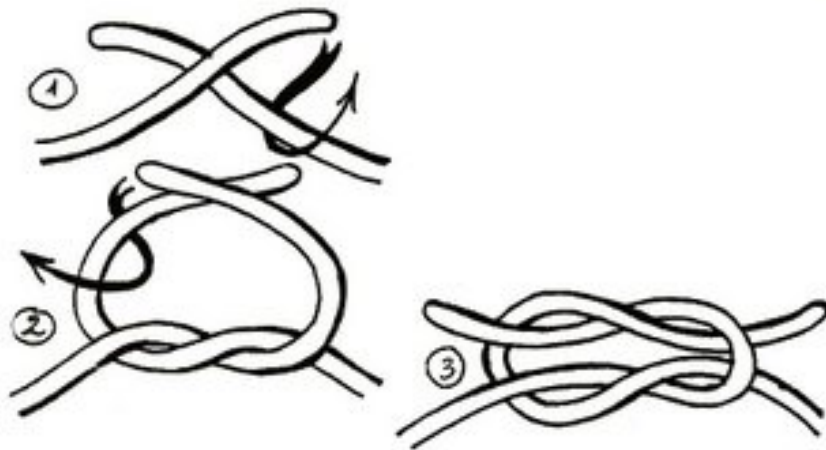
3. Double button



Double knots are similar to single knots, but it will definitely be much more than single buttons.

4. Knotted flat or double knots (reef knot / square knot)

Just like how to tie a single button, the flat button is also extremely popular and simple. This way of tying is used to tie the ends of a rope to fix something in the middle. This knot is also called a thief button or bullhead button.





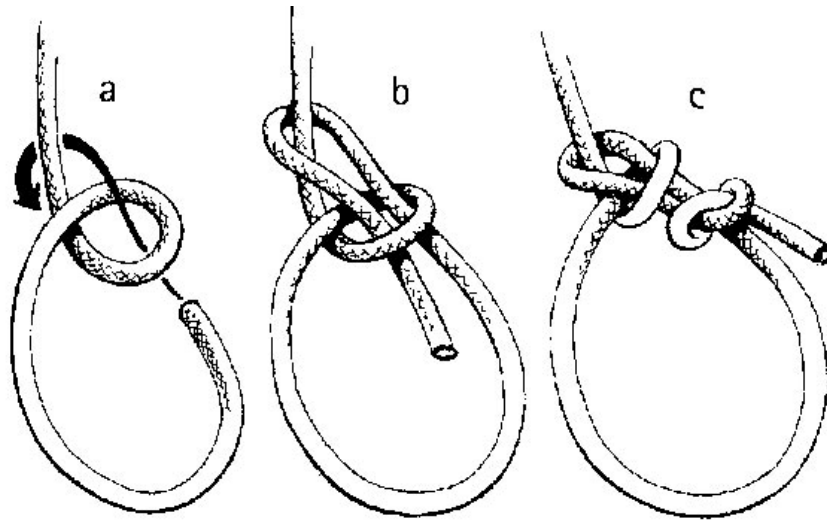
This way of tying can be used to tie goods, tie riches and end the patient bandage.

5. Button No. 8 (figure-of-eight knot)

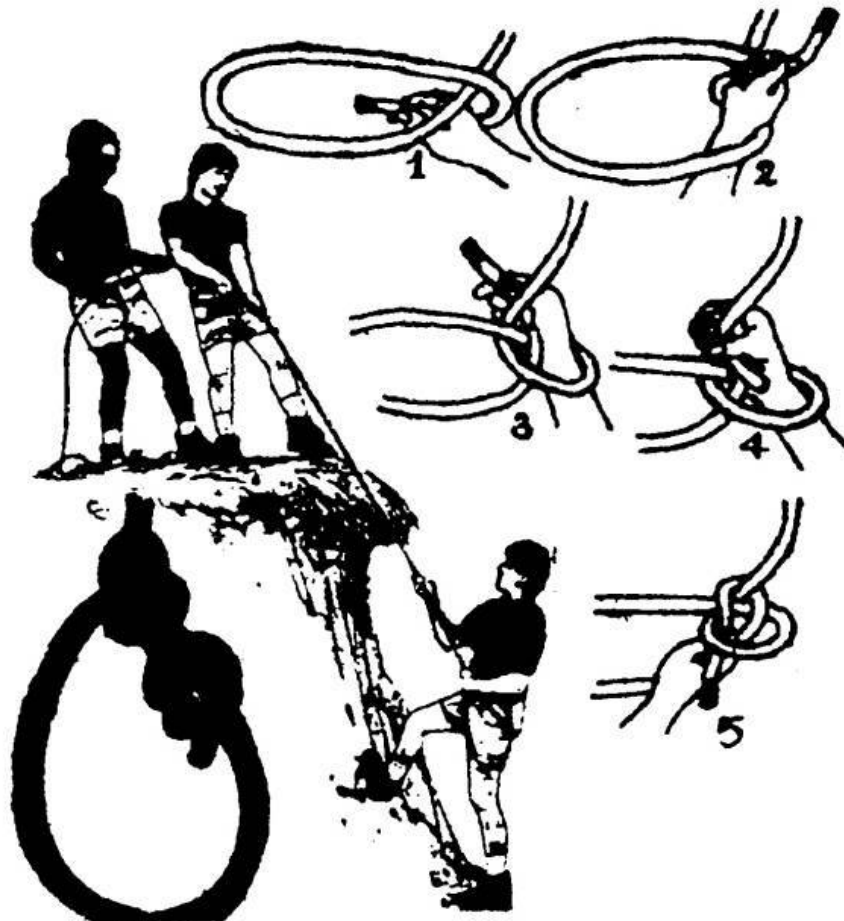


This is often used by people with the aim of avoiding the string from being removed from equipment such as a pole when sailing or climbing and making a rope ladder.

7. Single seat button or untouched noose (bowline)



This tie will create a fixed circle, which is often applied when tying a rope around a person or animal without fear of a ring being slipped and tightening on the neck.

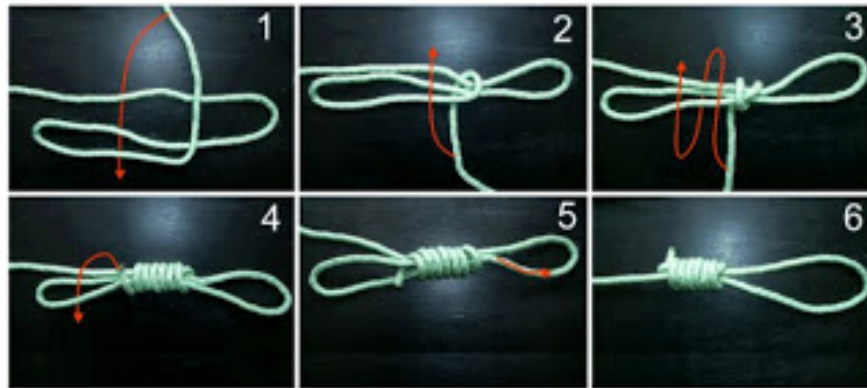


This method is often used when going hiking, working high or throwing people to die in the water .

8. Weaver button (sheet bend, becket bend, weaver's knot and weaver's hitch)



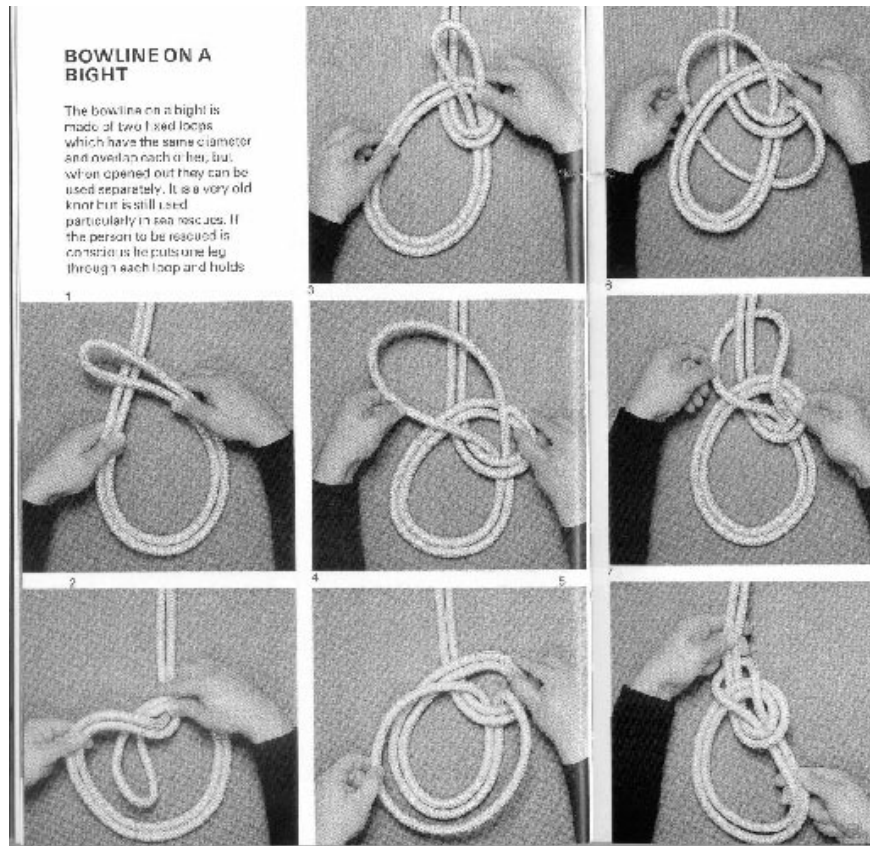
This way of tightening is somewhat similar to the way to tie a single chair. This way of tying you can apply when tying two pieces of rope with different sections.

This method can be used in wiring when setting up tents, knitting nets .

Double weaver button:



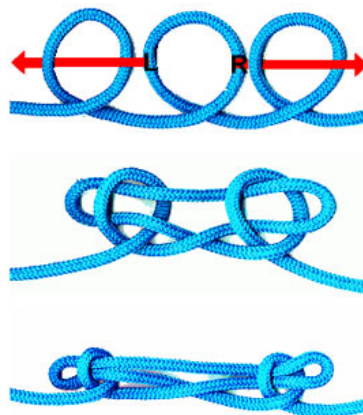
9. Dual seat button (Bowline on a bight)



The way to tie a double chair also gives you a fixed circle in the middle of the rope. The benefit of this way of tying is that you don't worry when you wear it and it's easy to remove.

This can be used to create a toe hold in the middle of a rope or to make a safety seat round for rescue, more convenient and more comfortable than a single seat button. Each ring can be used on each leg and upper part to cover the chest to keep it safe.

10. Sheepshank knot



This type of rope is used to shorten a piece of rope or to retract the remaining part of the string.

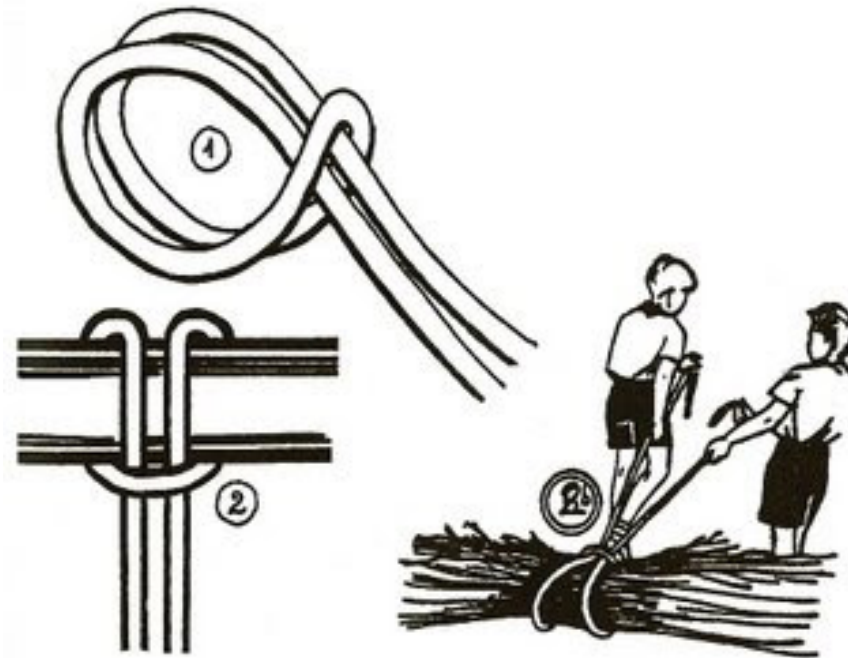
This tightening method can be used when you want to shorten a piece of wire that is overlapped when you do not want to cut it. Besides, you can also apply when tying to trailers or sailboats.

11. Lark's head or Cow hitch

The caustic button is also the head of the nightingale, depending on the locality, there are different ways to call. This type of button is often forced to hang, especially hanging objects on the crossbar.



This way of tying is applied in life such as making swings, pulling hanging bundles of firewood, building flags, tying elastic bands, decorating knitting hooks, or shaking hands with strings .



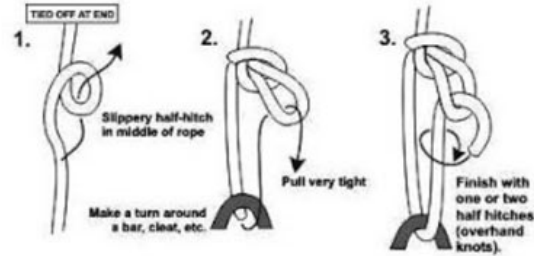
12. Running button (Taut Line Hitch)



This way of knotting helps you to adjust the length and short length of string. You can make use of short strings to tighten this method.

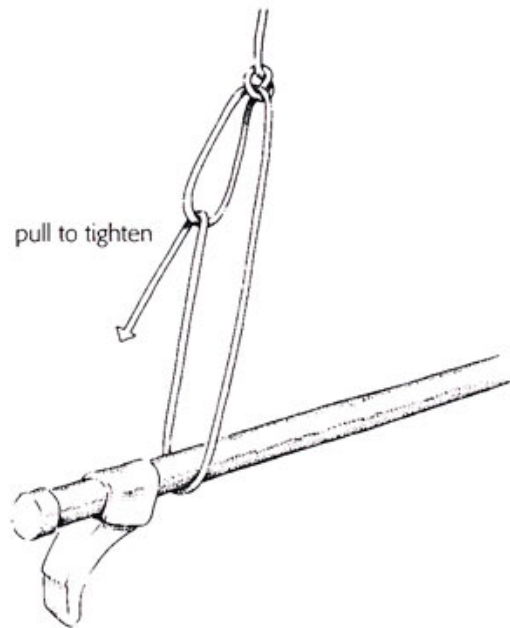
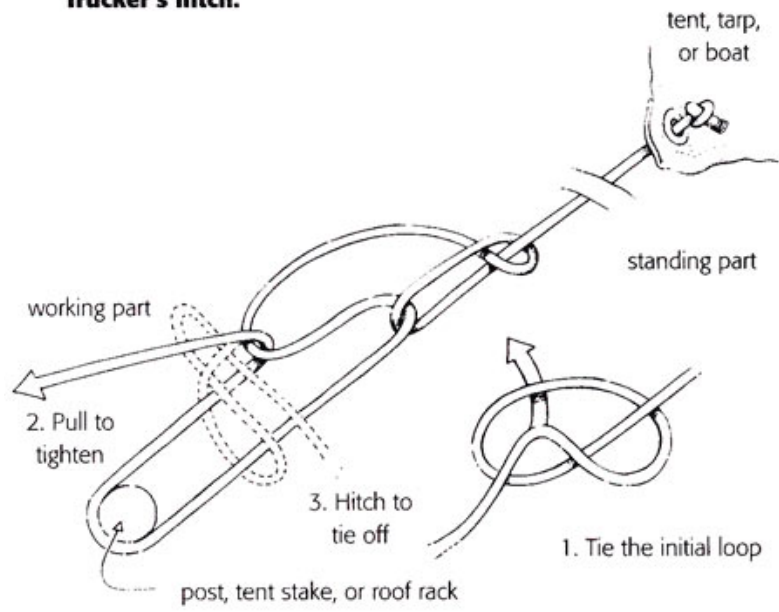
Note : the more string loops will create greater friction and thus will be more robust, but should not exceed 10 laps.

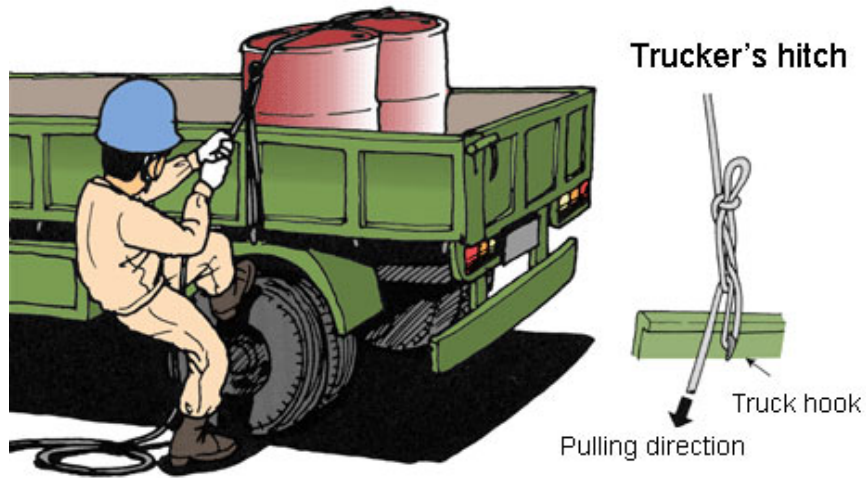
13. Trucker's hitch knot



Used to increase or decrease the wire. The way to do it is to use a noose button in the middle of the wire to form a wire loop (can be replaced by a bird's-knot button), an anchor head and a hook to the other anchor head, pierce the second anchor wire into the newly created wire loop. and pull up and down in my direction, ending with a single button.

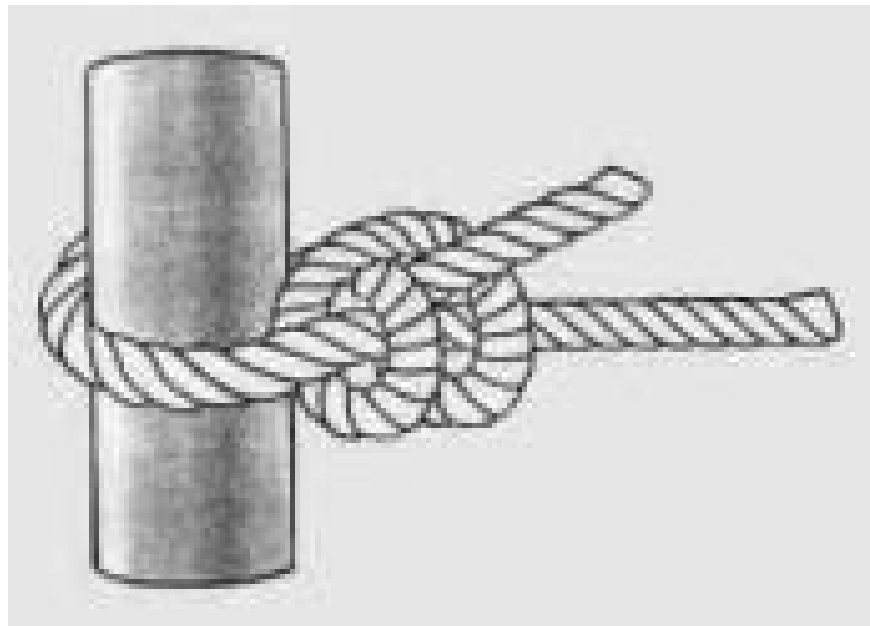
Trucker's hitch.





14. One round of two courses

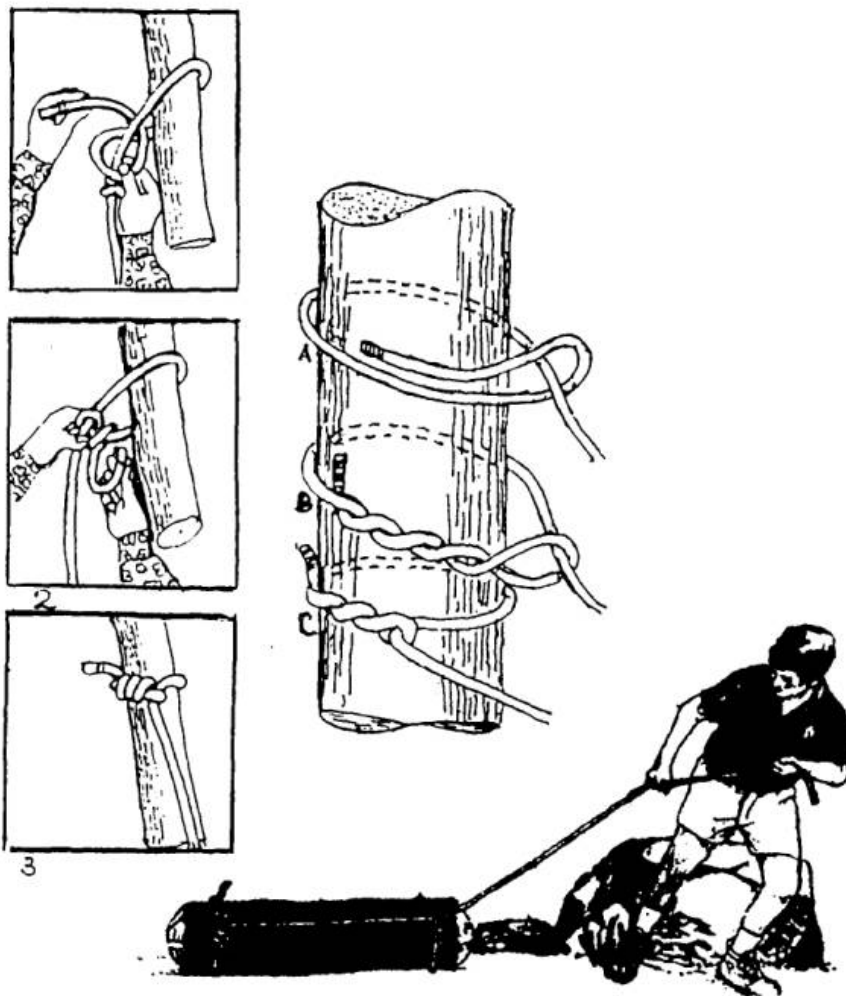
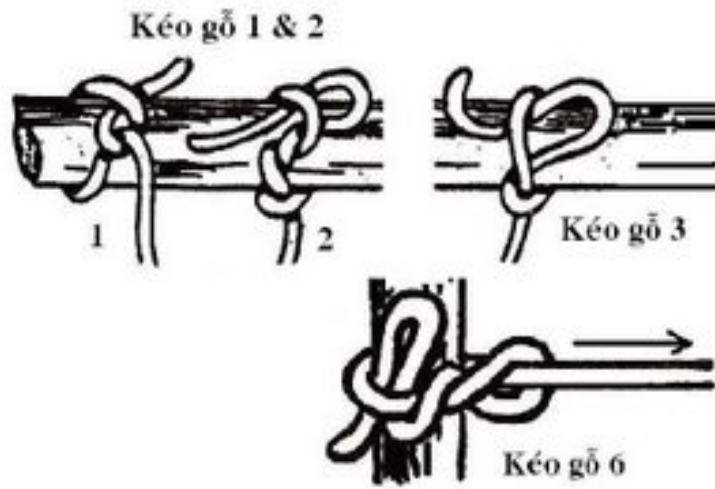
Used to lock the anchor buttons.

15. Wooden pull button (Timber hitch)

Used to tie rope to a pile, this button is strong and relatively easy to carry out, easy to remove. It could also be the start of the X-tower tower button.



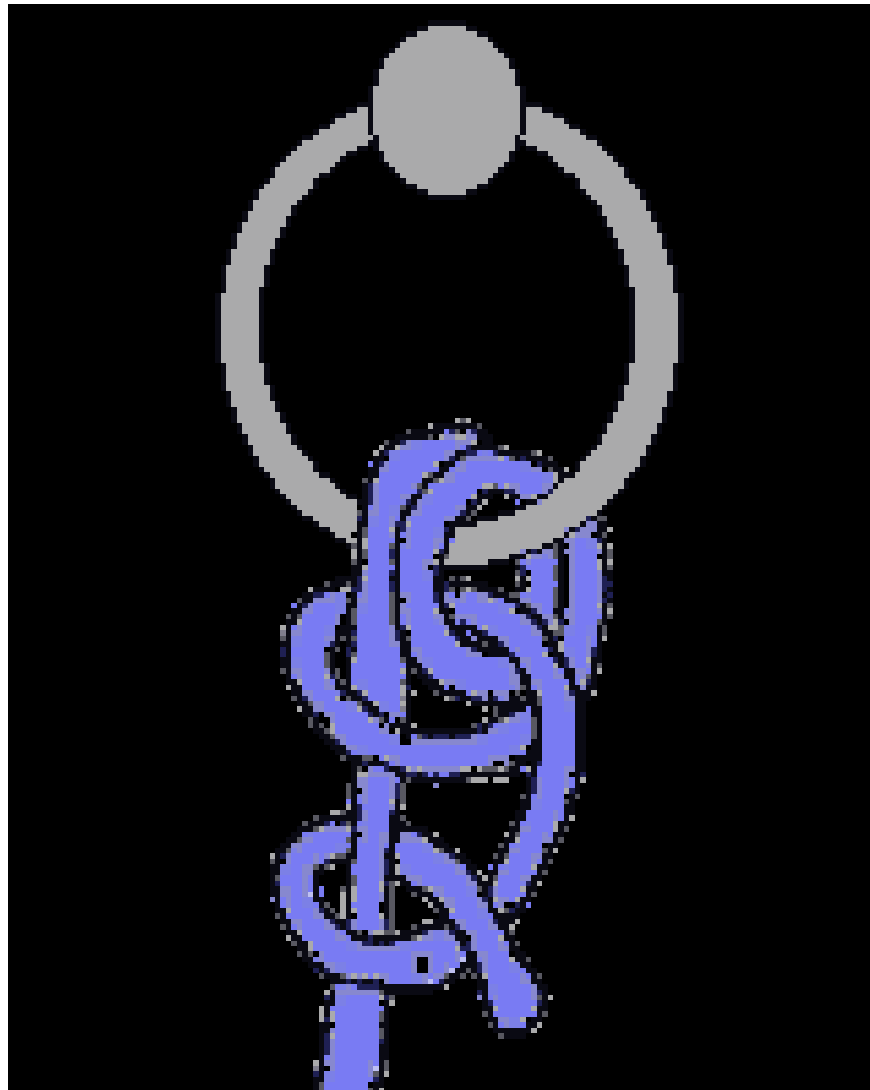
Application for pulling logs, hammocks or making clothesline.

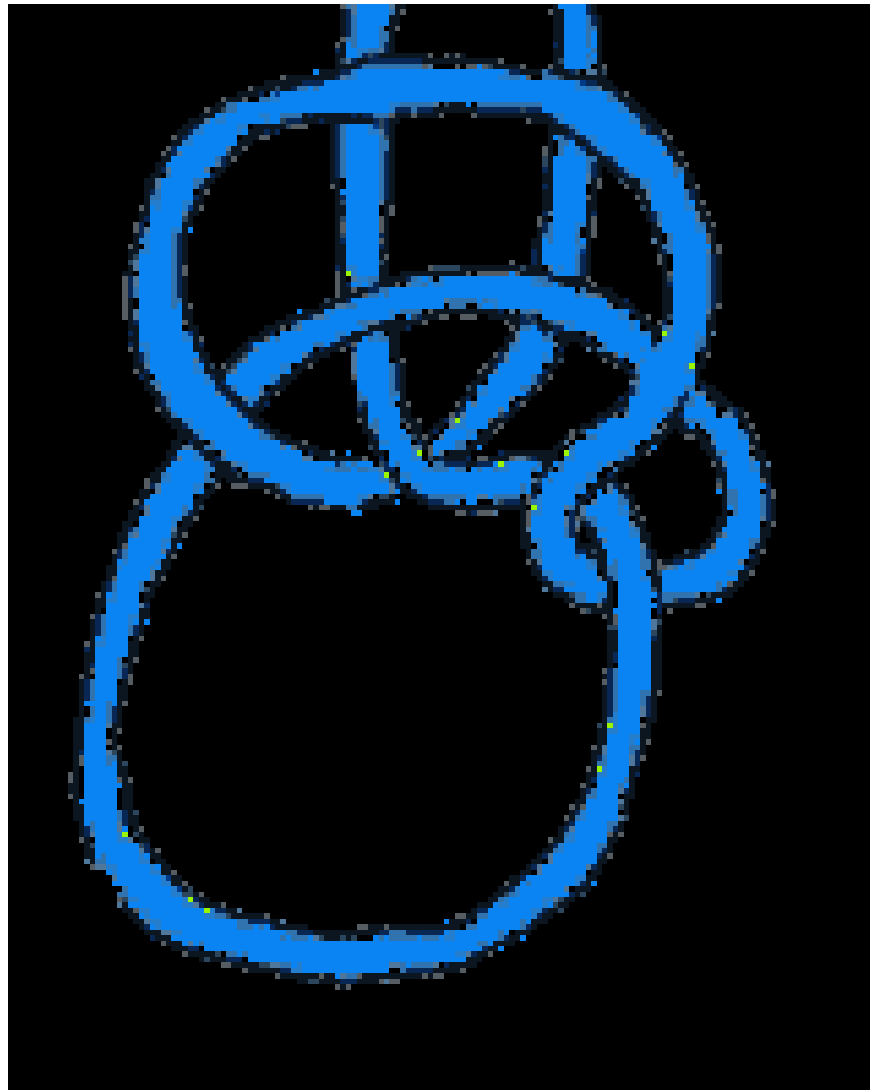

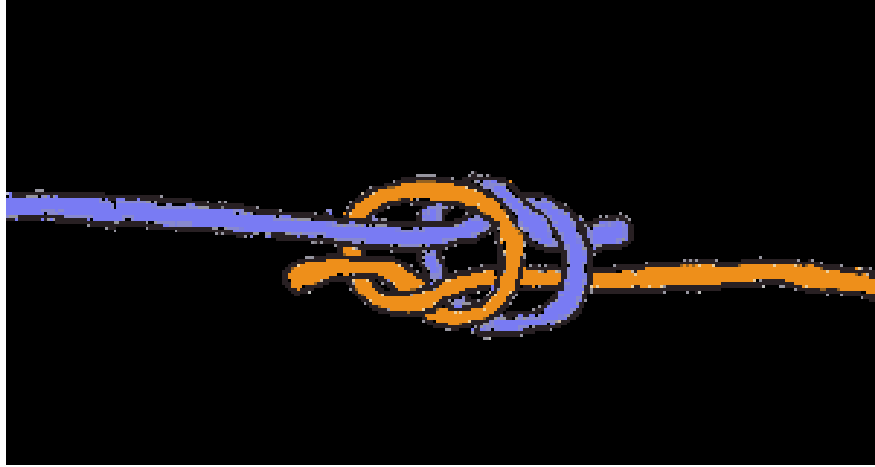

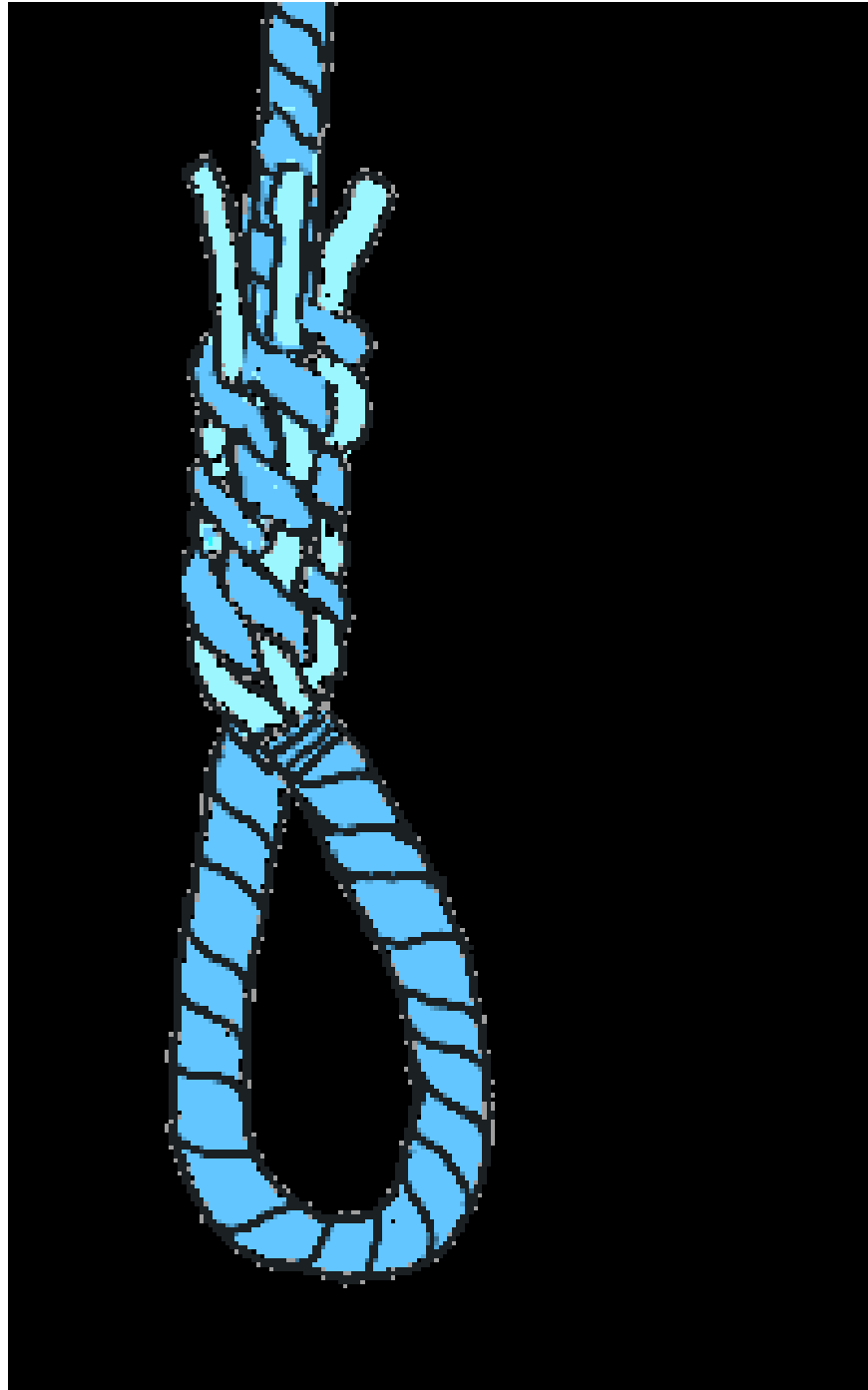
