This is Wanjina's hidden cave, which contains many paintings, characters, numbers, strange, simulating the ancient fishing scene of native Australians.



These native ancient rock sites are mostly gathered in the West, more than 1,000 km east of Broome city and 3,400km north of Perth city.



There are a total of more than 30,000 numbers, images and strange characters found in 250 ancient art stone native places found in Western Australia.



The whole process of searching and collecting takes 3 months.
