Mobile charging station



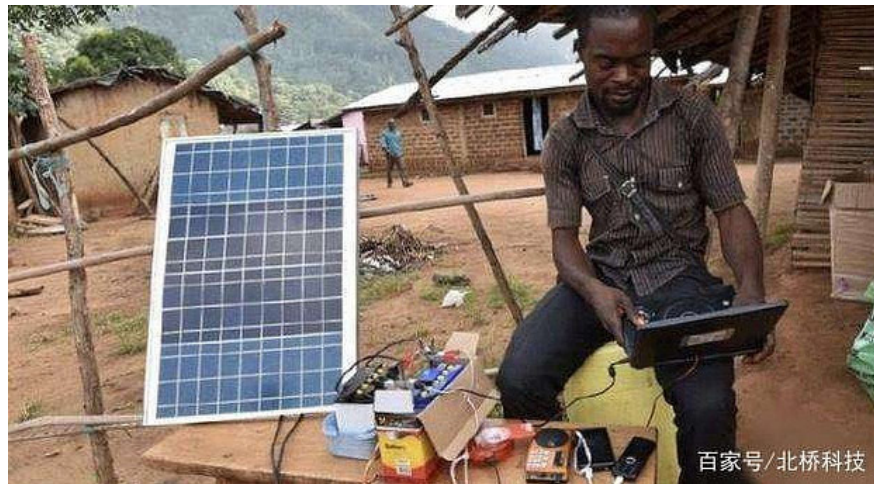
