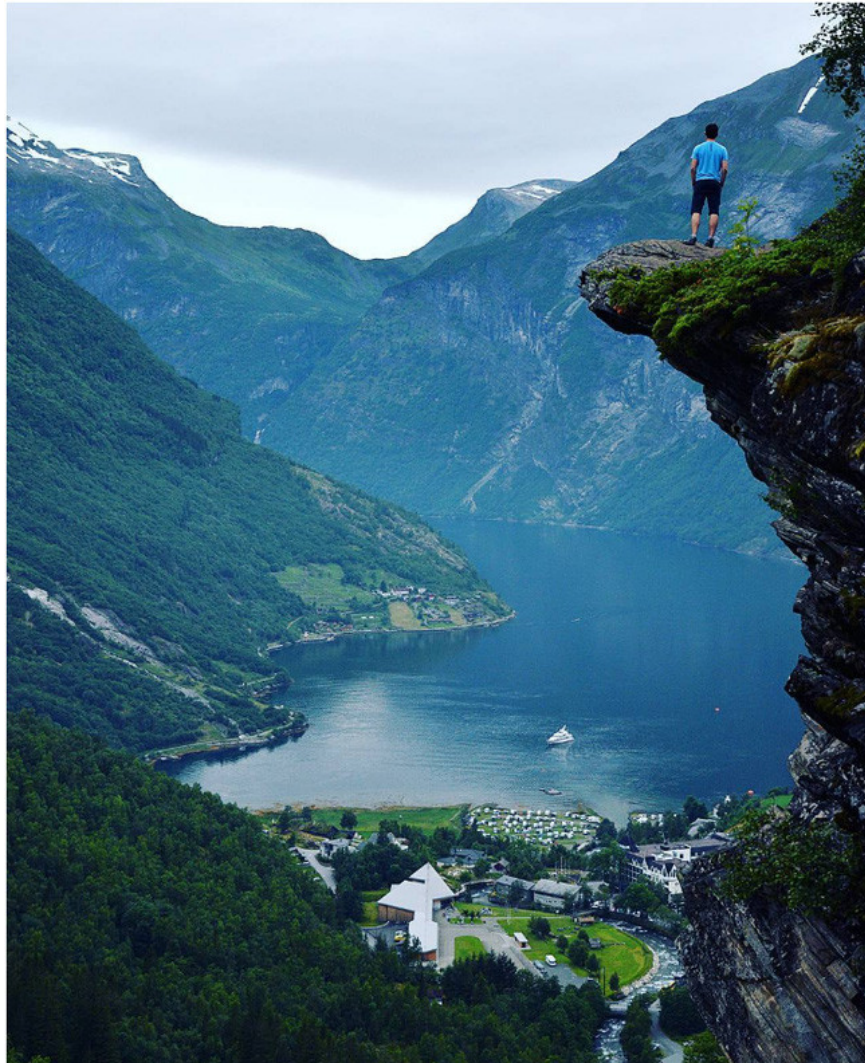
## **Geiranger Bay in Norway**

## **Cyclades, Greece**



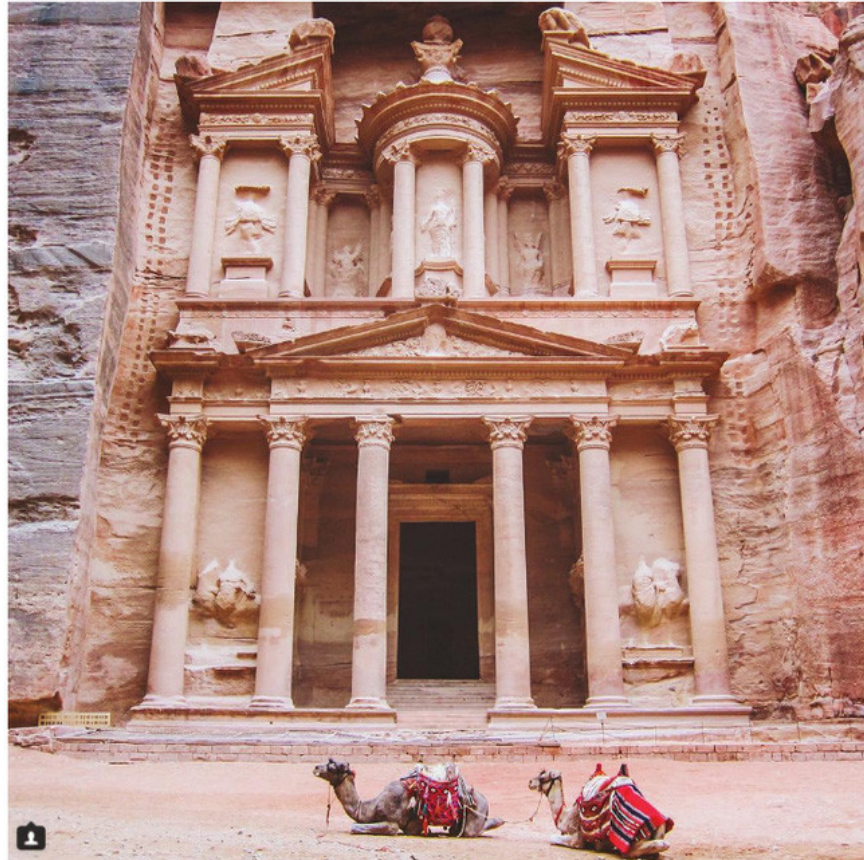

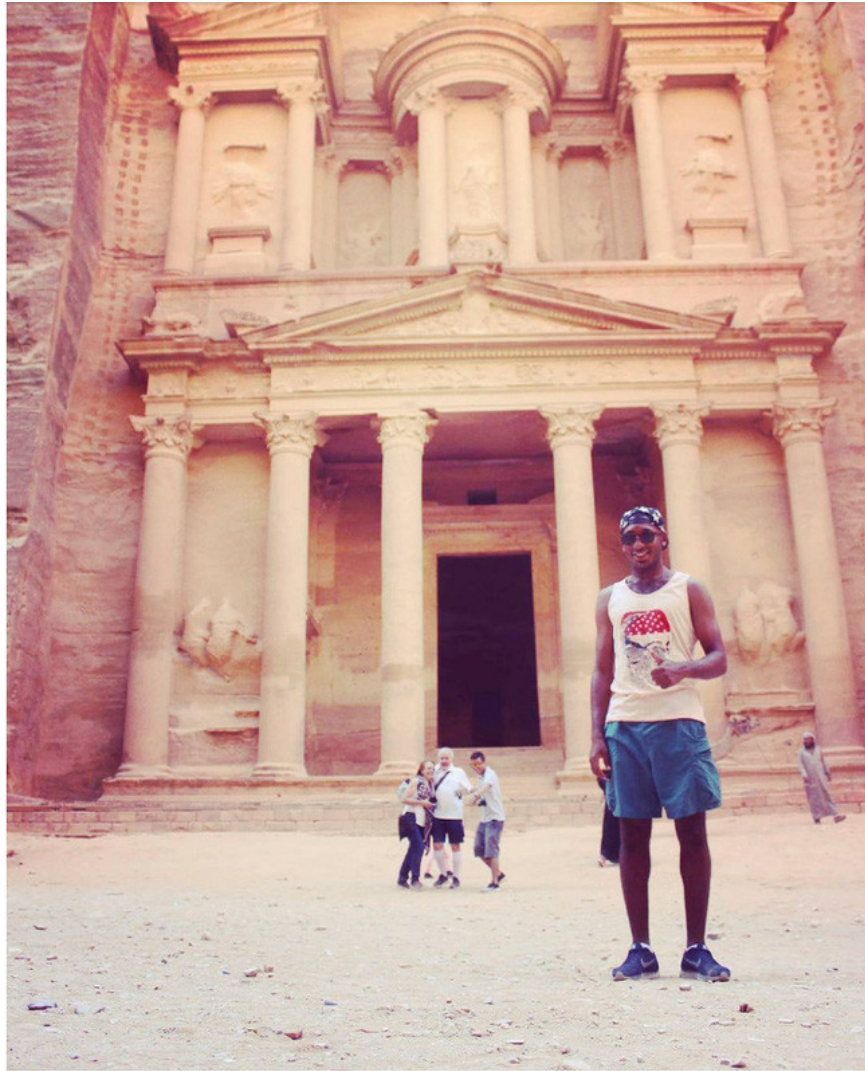
# Petra, Jordan

Two camels are located right in front of the Petra temple, which makes the painting a color of Arabity.

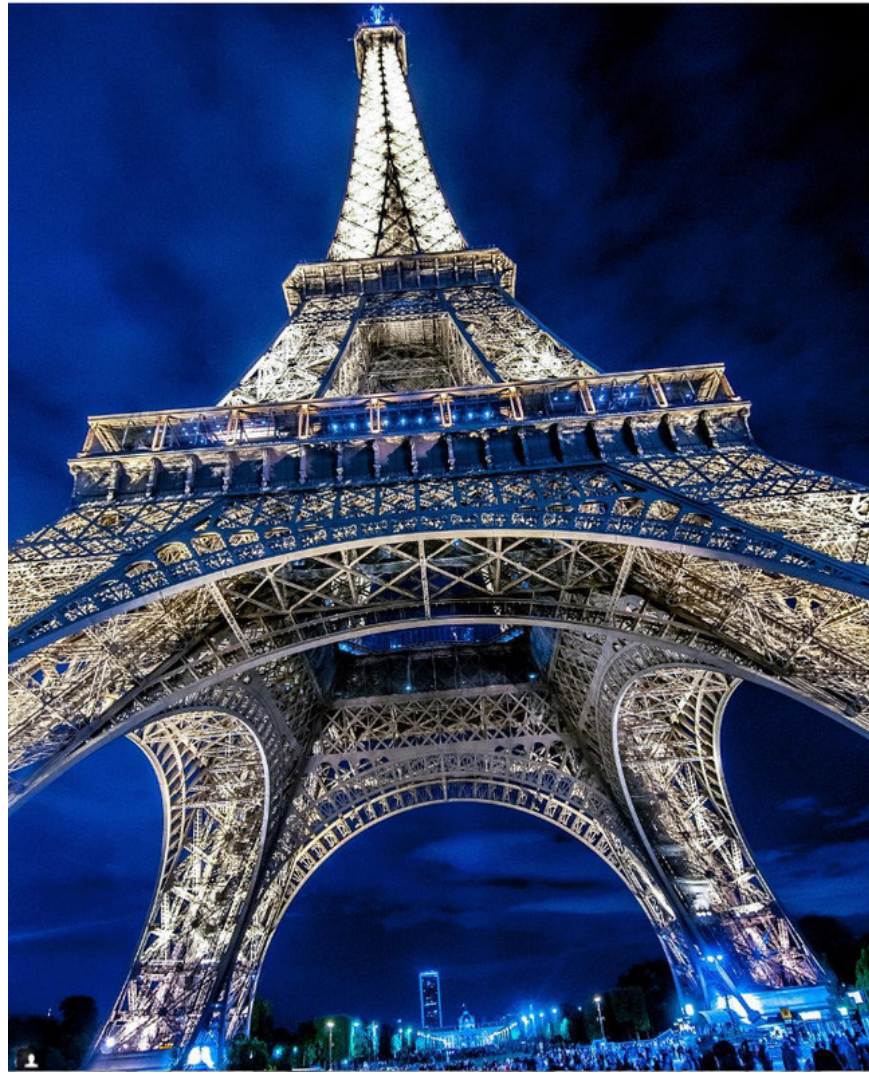
