The creator of " *Silicon Valley - Silicon Valley* " by Tally, Simbe Robotics has pointed out that most recent retailers rely on IT systems and employees to manage inventory inventory, call the local This solution is " *expensive and inaccurate* ". Tally robot seems to be able to inventory all goods in the store at the same time as usual, constantly updating staff about the status of goods coming out on the shelves to quickly add.



Simbie said: " *The ability of Tally to perform such inventory tasks 'repetitive and fast', means that employees at the store can receive direct information to be able to serve customers one by one. The most thoughtful way* ".

The 96cm high robot is equipped with sensors that record the status of goods in the store, with aggregate data sent to the cloud for processing and analysis. Other sensors mounted on the machine prevent Tally from bumping into the shelves and more importantly hitting customers.



A manual report automatically produces from the collected data, allowing store personnel to observe which products need to be replaced and cleaned. Moreover, it will also show which products are misplaced (*which means you will never sell an unwanted product randomly placed on the shelf*) and even, maybe Includes specific recommendations to improve the store's performance.

Tally comes with a charging dock to be able to control the direction of the test and operate constantly.
