Zoji La, India

On the craggy cliffs, a 9km long stone road connecting Ladakh and Kashmir are all gravel. This is the most dangerous and dangerous pass road on the Srinagar-Leh route with a height of 3.52km above sea level, with up to 60 points often landslides. Besides, the danger of the road is further increased because it is very narrow, vehicles must move with livestock herds here.

Transf?g?r??an, Romania

The Transf?g?r??an road, Romania is 90km long, located between Romania's two highest points, Moldoveanu and Negoiu. The Transf?g?r??an road connecting the Transylvania region with the cities of Sibiu and Pitesti makes many people involved in the traffic face extremely dangerous bends and detours, at an altitude of 2,034m above sea level. Transf?g?r??an is also known as a beautiful and extremely dangerous destination.

Dalton, Alaska Highway

Dalton, Alaska Highway is one of the most dangerous and lonely roads in the world. Stretching 666km through the tundra and connecting only 3 small villages, this highway has lots of snow, slippery and many obstacles on

the road. In addition, there are no fuel stations and very few residents live here.

Khardung La, India

At 5,602m (*higher than Elbrus*), Khardung La is recognized by the Guinness Book of Records and National Geographic as the most dangerous and dangerous pass in the world.

Yungas, Bolivia

Yungas Road, Bolivia is an important route to travel from La Paz to the Amazon jungle area. According to statistics, each year about 200 to 300 people die on this road because one side is a vertical cliff and a depth of

about 600m creates a danger for this road. Visitors who visit the Yungas Road will be able to cease their hearts when traveling on the narrowest, most dangerous road in the world.

Atlantic Road, Norway

Atlantic Road or Atlantic Road is about 9 km long on the sea, connecting the Norwegian town of Kristiansund and Molde. When traveling on this road, visitors will feel extremely excited because they experience the high slopes and soaring with white waves hitting the car wall.

Guoliang Tunnel, China

Guoliang Tunnel, China is built by local people. The road that stabbed out of the mountain was the only way to communicate between villages and the outside world. After that, the government built a 1.200m long tunnel to help local people move by transport.

Le Passage du Gois, France

The road of Le Passage du Góis is only open a few hours a day, because every time the tide rises this road will be submerged and disappear. Before entering the 4.5km highway connecting Noirmoutier Island with Beauvoir sur Mer on the continent in the northwest province of Vendee, drivers need to read the tide schedule or their car will be drowned in the water.

Tianmen Shan, China

Thien Mon Son road has a length of 10km and the highest peak is 1,300m. On the whole route, there are 99 bends, 999 stairs to climb to the top, the difference in height between the beginning and its end points is about 1,000m. To be able to drive a car on this route, the driver must have a steel nerve.

Hana, Hawaii

This 112km road connects Kahului town and Hana town on the island of Hawaii Maui winding through 59 bridges, 46 of which have only one lane. Moreover, this road is also often closed due to landslides.

"Kolima", Russia

People always call "Kolima" in Russia the "dead road", the first 90 km built in 1932 by prisoners. The remaining construction was completed in 1953. The Kolima Expressway is known as the coldest road in the world with a length of 2,031km.

Col de la Bonette, France

The dangerous Pass Col de la Bonette is located at an altitude of 2,000m in the French Alps, right next to the French border with Italy. The road through this pass has many steep and steep corners.

Gotthard, Switzerland

This is one of the highest mountain passes in the Alps. A 64km long road connecting the slopes together creates a beautiful scenery but also extremely dangerous.

"Caucasus", Russia

This narrow road connects Sochi with Lake Ritsa, through mountains. It both creates a sense of fear and possesses a strange beauty, which makes the road attractive to the adventurous, adventurous drivers.

Eshima Ohashi Bridge, Japan

Although it is just a bridge, it feels as dangerous as the aforementioned roads. The bridge connecting Sakaiminato and Matsue is about 1.7 km long and 11.3 km wide. When watching from afar, the bridge seems to be unable to climb, the height of the bridge is increased so that boats can easily move below.
