

The 5 most powerful women of the world technology village

The technology industry is still the club of boys, only 26% of jobs for women at the present time. Here are 5 of the most powerful women in the technology world today.

Since ancient times, women have always faced a world very different from what our mother and grandmother used to do today. Outdated views on gender in the workplace are gradually " *disappearing* " and instead, perceptions of women's dependence are reasonable and necessary to have a strong workforce. However, while women have not yet represented equality in politics, business and technology. We are gradually breaking those barriers every day.

The technology industry is still the club of boys, only 26% of jobs for women at the present time. Women face an average sex ratio of 3: 1 in the industry, and it is only higher in management positions. Fortunately, a lot of women face this " *harsh* " sex division, which is **five of the most powerful women in the technology world today** .

1. Ursula Burns

Although not having many advantages like other children, **former Xerox CEO Ursula Burns** thinks that part of her success comes from living in a less comfortable housing area but having access to public transportation. Plus cheap and a good education. Ursula Burns is a humble beginner, daughter of a Panama immigrant and raised by a single mother in housing projects in New York. Being able to live in a low-income neighborhood is a

significant step up from the dormitory that her whole family lived in in Alphabet City (*Manhattan, New York City*). However, Ursula Burns is the first black American female CEO to lead a Fortune 500 company, overcome gender barriers and racial segregation that dominates the technology industry.

In 1980, Ursula Burns began his career at Xerox as a trainee and became an engineer here with a starting salary of over \$ 29,000 per year after graduation. This salary is enough for Ursula Burns to have a middle-class life. At that time, Ursula Burns owned a car and a house in upstate New York. Ursula Burns was continuously promoted in the mid-1990s and 2000, becoming the president of Xerox in 2007.

In 2009, Ursula Burns was appointed CEO. Burns' career shows the power of loyalty, the value of advancing in a company and the proof of a hard-working person who has shown his skills during his time at Xerox. . 34 years later, Ursula Burns was the president and chief executive of the company. Ursula Burns not only holds power in the high-tech industry, but is also judged by Forbes as the 14th most influential woman in the world. Ursula Burns made a big contribution to bringing more than 50% of the \$ 22.4 billion in revenue in 2012 from information technology services.

2. Ginni Rometty

Another story about the promotion of being CEO, Virginia "Ginni" M. Rometty (*born 1958*) is the CEO of IBM Company, effective January 1, 2012 and is also The first woman to become head of IBM. Before being appointed CEO, Ginni Rometty served as Senior Vice President and Executive of Sales, Marketing and Strategy Group at IBM. Ginni Rometty has been appointed as one of the 50 most powerful women in Fortune's business for 7 consecutive years and ranked 7 in 2011.

Ginni Rometty joined IBM (*International Business Machines*), a multinational computer technology group based in Armonk, New York, USA in 1981. More than 3 years after taking the helm at IBM, Ginni Rometty helped this group overcome many difficulties and gradually regained its position in the world technology village. Previously, IBM faced many difficulties as well as the suspicion of investors when the sales decline in 11 consecutive months.

Ginni Rometty made bold decisions but was very effective when diverting investment into businesses. IBM moved its development direction into the field of data analysis software, cloud computing and artificial intelligence technology. Success has come to IBM to help this company overcome a difficult time.

Ginni Rometty has been with the company for decades, leading the project such as buying PricewaterhouseCoopers Consulting and being appointed as president and CEO in 2011. In 2015, Fortune magazine ranked Ginni Rometty in 3rd place. List of the most powerful women. In October 2016, during a meeting of technology women, Rometty spoke in front of the crowd and advised women to be the ones who faced the risk and refused to allow others to control them.

3. Jen Fitzpatrick



Jen Fitzpatrick is one of the first employees at Google. Graduating from Stanford University, Fitzpatrick started working for Google in 1999 as a trainee and was the first to make Google search results better. Jen Fitzpatrick also works on user interface design, web index search services, Google Maps and many other projects. Currently, Jen Fitzpatrick is in charge of mobile positioning technology - the area that Marissa Mayer made before moving to Yahoo. Computer scientists have been working with the organization since then.

Currently, at age 39, Jen Fitzpatrick is the Vice President of Google Maps, with big dreams about how to expand the usefulness and usability of one of Google's most popular products. Fitzpatrick said Google took the time to build a female-friendly environment to welcome employees like her.

She said: " *When participating in the poll, the candidates always face at least one female executive. It is important to bring power to women, we also want to recruit programmers. Men, who will be great colleagues with women* " .

4. Meg Whitman

Hewlett-Packard's chief executive, Whitman, is a self-made billionaire based on Forbes magazine and named the ninth powerful woman on this list of ten powerful pink balls that ran as governor. California, 2016. A long-time female business with a well-known career developing television, Whitman leads or joins the executive team of Walt Disney Company, Procter and Gamble, Dreamworks and Hasbro before being appointed. HP's CEO in 2011. Whitman has become a " *power plant* " in the high-tech industry, giving himself a new name when confronted with " *militant mode* " that begins to campaign against Donald Trump and support Democratic candidate Hillary Clinton.

Meg Whitman is the president and CEO of Hewlett Packard, and President of HP Inc, a brother company of Hewlett Packard. However, Meg Whitman did not succeed in that political race. Fortune magazine voted 49-year-old online auctioneer eBay as the most influential woman in the business sector because " *she has done everything she claims* ".

Meg Whitman is the number one female entrepreneur in America because she is still dominating in Silicon Valley. Although the stock index fell 30%, the company's revenue and profit were still very strong. The company has more than 68 million active customers (*active*) out of 157 million registered accounts. EBay has just bought Skype for \$ 2.6 billion. Whitman is considered the queen in online auctioning. While not the founder of eBay, Meg Whitman turned the start-up company into one of the most valuable brands on the Internet. Now, Whitman owns \$ 1.6 billion in assets and ranks among the richest people on the planet.

5. Sheryl Sandberg

While Mark Zuckerberg is known as the world's most popular social network founder and operator, Sheryl Sandberg plays a role in bridging the talented CEO to the rest of Facebook. Holding the position of *Chief Operating Officer (COO)* of Facebook as the first woman to be on the company's executive board, Sheryl Sandberg is seen as the main assistant, assisting Mark with the right to The highest force and better understanding of the company than Mark. " *Under one person, over ten thousand people* ", Sheryl Sandberg knows Facebook the most today, more than CEO Mark Zuckerberg. In addition to work at Facebook, Sheryl Sandberg also writes books on business leadership and development for women. Previously, Sheryl Sandberg served as vice president at Google and chief of staff for Finance Minister Larry Summers. Recently, Sheryl Sandberg is known for her husband's departure speech with efforts in work and life.

Sheryl is also the person who helped Facebook achieve a record advertising revenue, up to 4 billion USD in 2011. Forbes magazine also voted Sheryl as the most powerful woman in the technology world today and is a in the rare female billionaires in the world comes up from the white hands. With a net worth of \$ 1.1 billion, Facebook's chief executive officer (*COO*) - Sheryl Sandberg, is one of the richest female generals in the technology world. Currently, Sheryl is living with her family in Silicon Villa, who has a simple, unobtrusive style. Having worked for a government agency and Google, Sheryl currently holds the position of executive director of Facebook, and also revolutionizes the position of women at work.
