

The best deck building tips in Hearthstone

TCG fans are sure to love Hearthstone for its faster card retrieval, as well as its central theme linked to Blizzard's popular World Of Warcraft series.

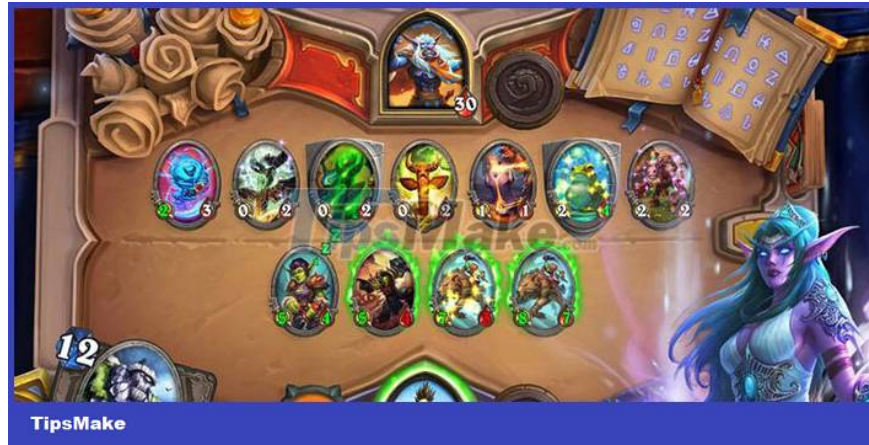
Separate from the hit MMO game Blizzard, Hearthstone gives the impression of a light game instead of a serious plot revolving around World Of Warcraft.



Still, it's still a competitive card game, and a slight mistake in deck construction can cause any player to take damage during the match.

With such a wide range of cards and playing styles, deck building can seem overwhelming for new players. In this article, let's explore some tips for building the best deck while playing Hearthstone.

Learn the basics of the road



Before beginners build on their top deck, the game will help beginners understand some of the basics. Like other online card games, Hearthstone sets up guidelines before players actually start building their own deck. For those who are new to Hearthstone for the first time, there are a few things to keep in mind:

1. Continue training with the Mage and Hunter classes.
2. Pay attention to how to get gold.
3. Turn spare cards into dust for crafting.
4. Use gold at the arena instead of buying packs.

Guaranteed to qualify for the win

The only way to win a level in Hearthstone is to reduce your opponent's Life Level from 30 to 0 during the match. An effective deck will have win-condition play that ultimately results in the opponent losing the game.



Most decks only have a single win condition, while others can have multiple win conditions depending on the type of hand the player owns. At their core, the big win conditions have the following characteristics:

1. Strong enough to defeat opponents. An ideal win condition is a strategy that uses the power of the deck to bring your opponent into submission.
2. Consistent enough to be a repeating element. The ideal win condition is one that can occur in consecutive matches.

Winning conditions

Unfortunately, not all win conditions are perfect. When building a deck, players need to consider the following disadvantages of any win condition:

1. Strong win conditions are often hard to come by.
2. Consistent win conditions are not sustainable.
3. Consistent win conditions are underpowered.

Example of win condition



Most win conditions revolve around the use of a particular card. Here are some examples of cards and their pros and cons:

1. **Edwin VanCleaf** (Legendary): This card gains +2/+2 for every other card the player uses this turn. As such, the more cards a player uses, the stronger VanCleaf is, aiming to destroy power.
2. **Prophet Velen** (Legendary): This card doubles the damage and healing of all spells and hero powers. Therefore, this card encourages a controlling approach or using a lot of spells to be able to eliminate the opponent without many minions.
