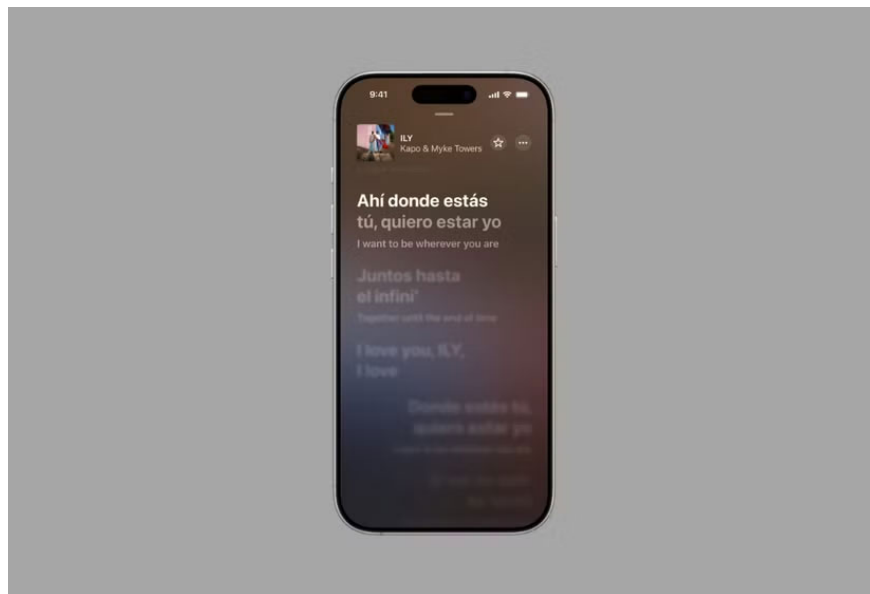

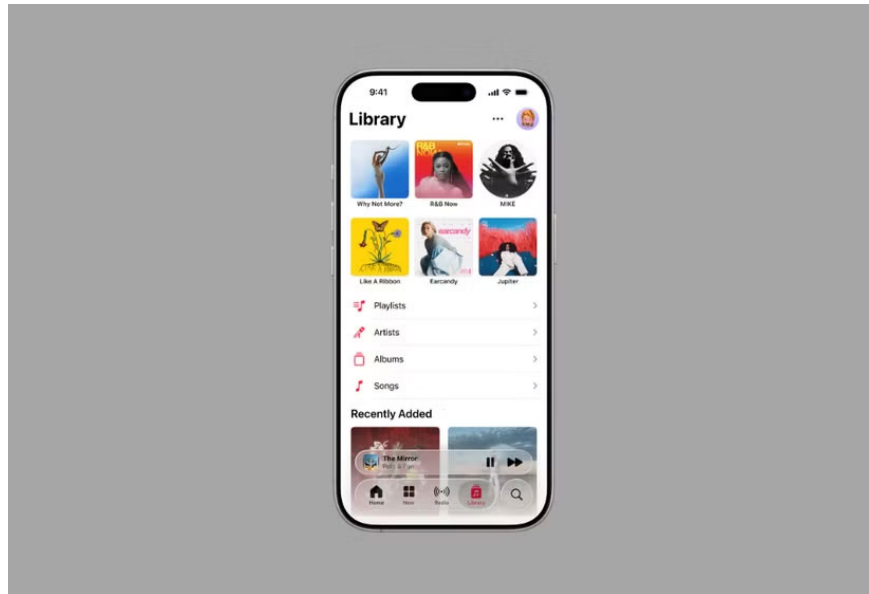
3. AutoMix
