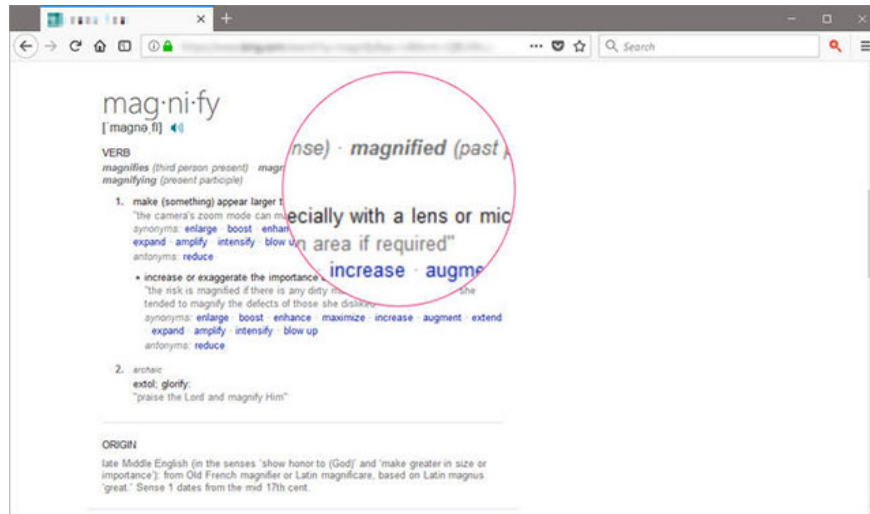
However, not all of these extensions can be used on all browsers. Consider whether to switch to a different browser just to use an extension.

Utility supports reading Oswald



The extension supports reading content Oswald is a tool for the Google Chrome platform and developed by Oswald. It can be said that this is one of the few extensions that focuses on support features for the elderly in particular. This is an extension that supports reading content. In theory, Oswald will extract content from a page and read it to users in their chosen language. In addition, it also supports adjusting color contrast, font size . to optimize reading text on the screen in case users prefer to read the content themselves instead of listening to Oswald reading. Unfortunately, we still cannot find utilities that have similar functionality on other browser platforms at the moment.

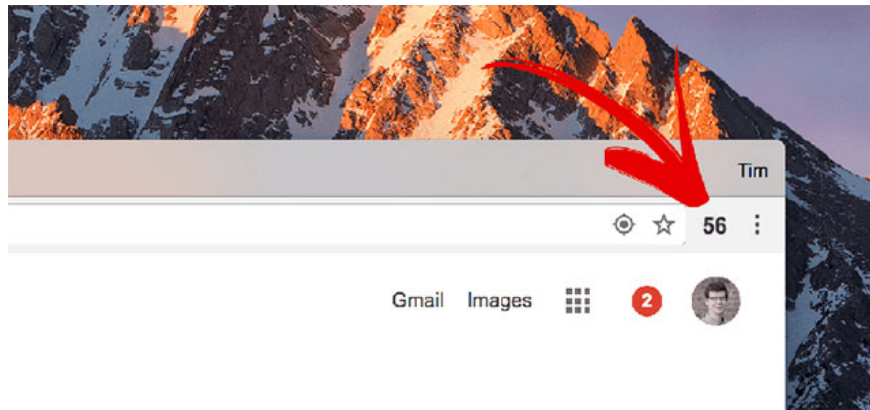
Extensions that help zoom your browser

This feature is also available on most browsers, but a utility that zooms in content is still worth using because with it, you can zoom in and out of individual parts of the screen, not must be the entire screen as usual.

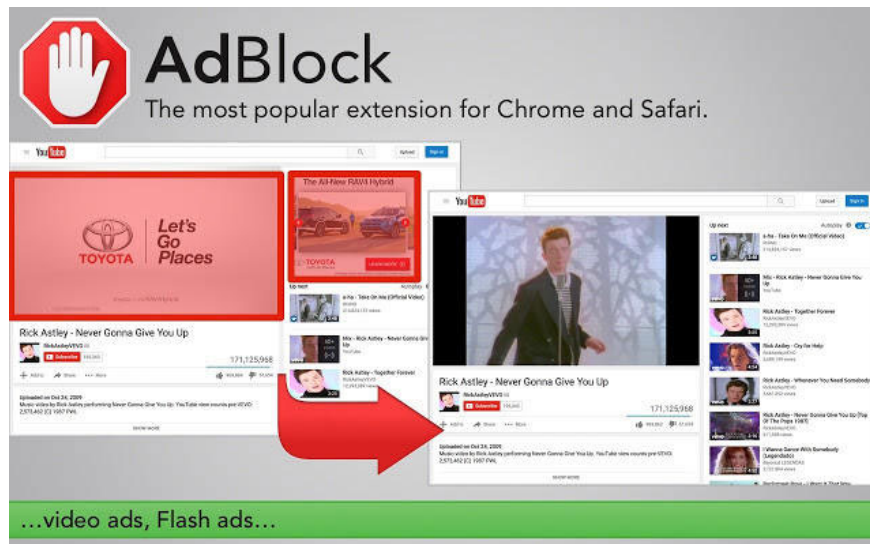

Weather extensions

The weather app for the browser is vast, none of which is the best, it all depends on the type of browser you are using, which is suitable for you. For example, Chrome users can refer to weatherextension.com, which is a pretty good utility with an intuitive interface and relatively accurate updates.

Ad blocker

One of the best, most popular ad blocking extensions available for Chrome, Safari, Edge, Opera and Firefox is AdBlock. Needless to say more about AdBlock's popularity, but if you don't want to use Adblock, you can look at other bright names, such as uBlock Origin. Or for iOS and Android, download AdBlock Plus.
