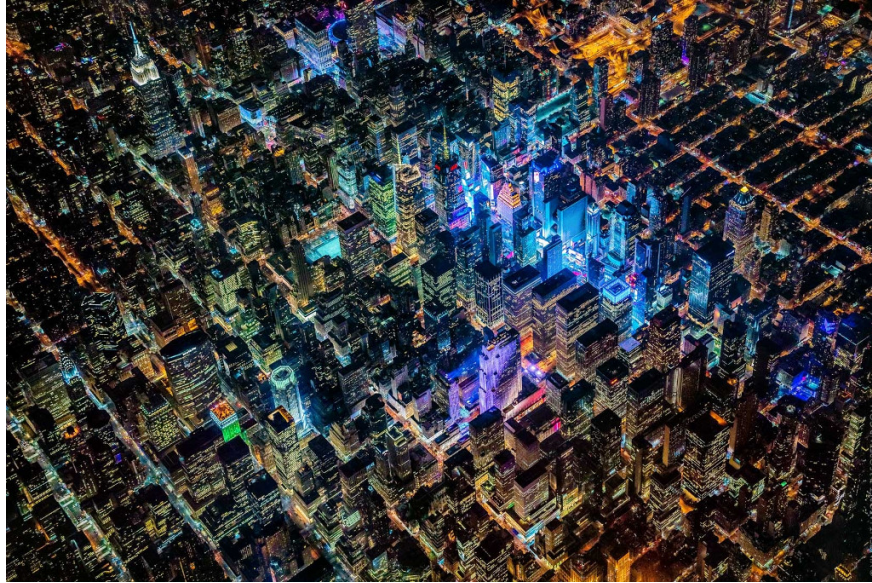

Berlin, Germany . This sparkling city is a maze of yellow street lights and new blue LED lights in some districts.



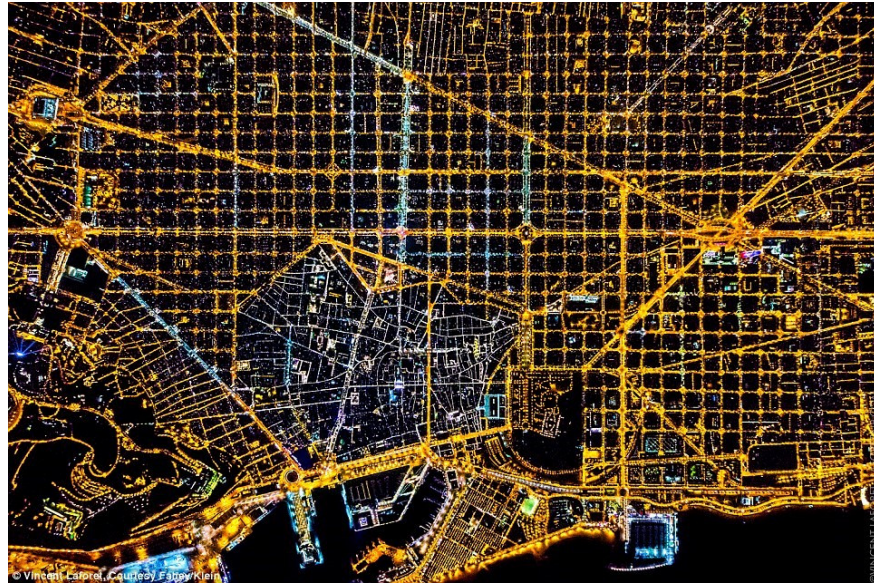
London, England . The technique of tilting the lens from the Tower Bridge through the River Thames makes a non-realistic view.



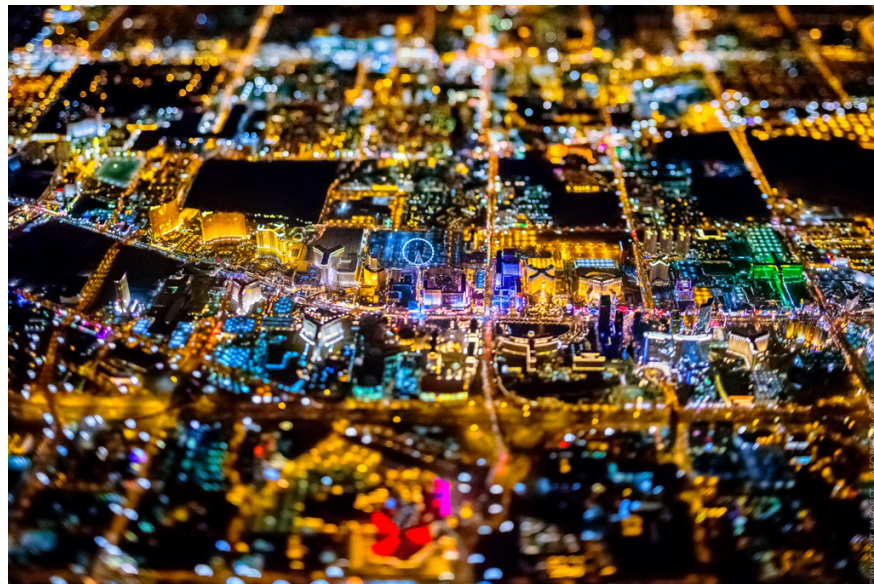
New York, USA . The bright lights at Times Square between Manhattan and New York.



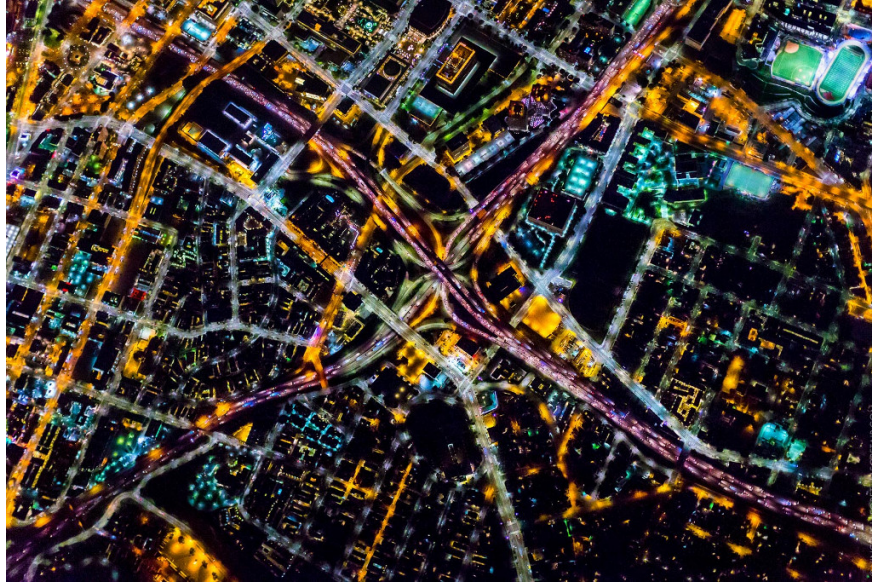
Sydney, Australia . Photographer Laforet calls this one of his favorite cities with icons such as Opera Theater and Harbor Bridge.



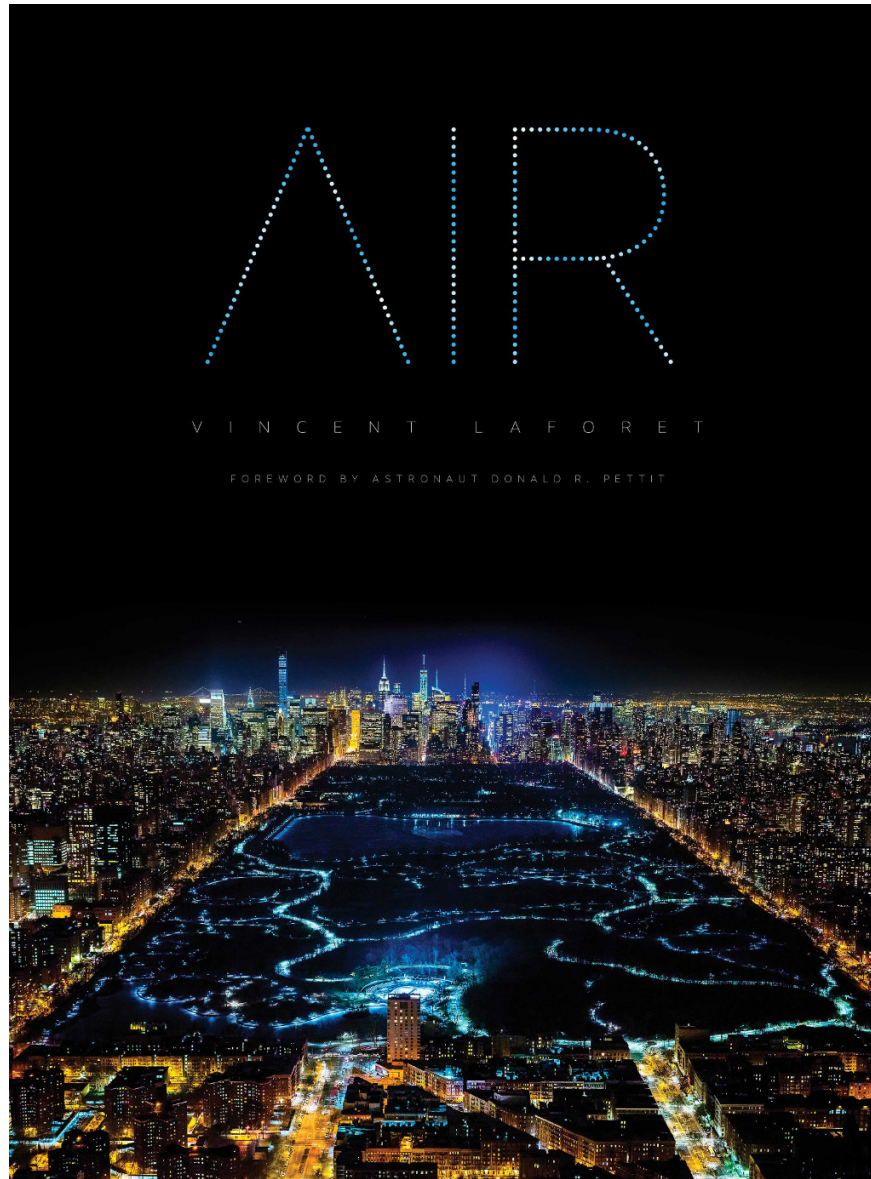
Barcelona, Spain is designed into neat plots, like computer circuits when viewed from above.
