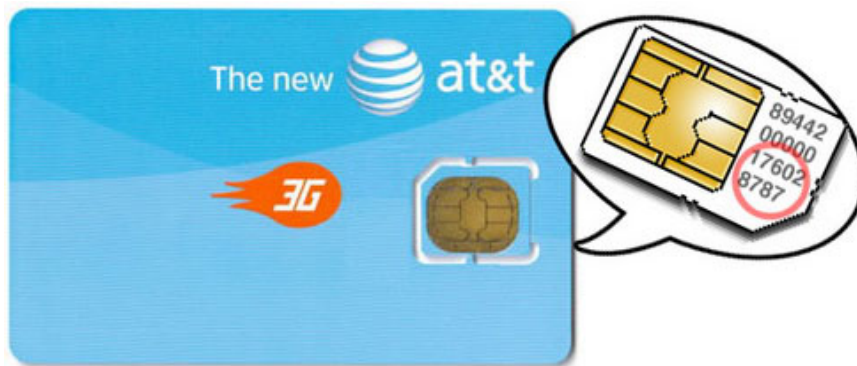


The conclusion for hackers stole 114,000 iPad accounts

From June to September 2010, two young people, Andrew Auerheimer and Daniel Spitulert, broke into AT & T's management system and took away 114,000 iPad users' 3G accounts, including those of famous figures. and government officials.

In early 2011, both hackers were arrested by US police. So far, Daniel Spitulert - one of two suspects - has acknowledged his behavior. At the same time, this hacker also confirmed himself to be a member of the Goatse Security organization. The number of emails retrieved from AT&T was transferred to Gawker and quickly spread on the internet.

The duo Daniel - Andrew attacked AT&T 's administration system through a browser vulnerability with a self - created script code called "iPad 3G slurper account" capable of identifying the ICC - ID number (of a circuit type). integrated on the iPad user identification cards). Daniel's testimony exactly coincided with what the US judicial department had acquired through the chat between Daniel and Andrew.

SPITLER: I just harvested 197 email addresses of iPad
3G subscribers there should be many more . . . weev: did you
see my new project?
A.A.: no
SPITLER: I'm stepping through iPad SIM ICCIDs to
harvest email addresses if you use someones ICCID on the
ipad service site it gives you their address

A.A.: loool thats hilarious HILARIOUS oh man now
this is big media news . . . is it scriptable? arent there
SIM that spoof iccid?²
SPITLER: I wrote a script to generate valid iccids and
it loads the site and pulls an email
. . .
A.A.: this could be like, a future massive phishing
operation serious like this is valuable data we have a list
a potential complete list of AT&T iphone subscriber emails
SPITLER: ipad but yeah

At the time of the incident, the Goatse group announced that they were just trying to help AT&T see the security of their site. They discovered how to break into AT & T's website management system and access the email address source with the iPad ID of the carrier's 3G network service user.

It is expected that Daniel Spiltler will face a sentence of up to 10 years in prison with a \$ 500,000 fine for unauthorized access and identity theft. The sentence will be enforced immediately after the final trial in Newark federal court, New Jersey, on September 28. And Andrew, with Daniel, is still facing private trials.

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
