

# The difference between PDF and DOC

Today, there are two common formats that users employ to create and send documents: PDF and DOC (Word document). Many people may know what these formats are, but others may not know and cannot distinguish the difference between PDF and DOC (Word). To better understand these two formats, please read the article below.

Documents play a crucial role in how people share information with each other. By definition, a document contains text used to store and share information. Both **PDFs** and **Docs** serve the purpose of storing text and documents. However, there are differences **between PDFs and Docs** that allow them to be used for distinct tasks.

## The difference between PDF and Doc, distinguishing between PDF and Doc

Essentially, a document functions as a record to document all types of transactions and communications between two or more individuals or a group. For companies and organizations worldwide, creating and processing documents is considered a 'core' task in every aspect of their operations.

Both PDF ( **Portable Document Format**) and DOC are file formats for storing any type of document. Even users with little experience can send, access, and read the content in PDF and DOC files.

However, there are also characteristics that users should know to distinguish between PDF and DOC. First, each format was developed by different companies. PDF is the intellectual property of **Adobe Systems** , while DOC is the creation of the software giant **Microsoft** . Each company also produces the software used to create and edit documents corresponding to these file formats; Acrobat from Adobe and Word from Microsoft.

The next difference between PDF and DOC is the content editing platform of each format. DOC files can be created using **Microsoft Word** and can be saved in PDF format. When users want to edit this file, they can convert the PDF to Word and edit it there.



Conversely, Adobe created Acrobat to create PDF files but limited its content editing capabilities. This is because PDF was developed as a more widely distributed format and is recognized by all platforms.



That's why very few users use Acrobat to create documents. Additionally, PDF is open source, so any individual or developer can use it to create editing tools, unlike DOC, which is proprietary to Microsoft.

The biggest **difference between PDF and DOC is content transfer** . Documents created in DOC format are often less precise and consistent than PDF files, which retain everything the author wrote in the document. And because Microsoft owns the software proprietary, it requires specific settings to transfer the same content from one user to another.

A typical example of this is when a sender uses a font that is not installed on the recipient's computer to create a document. When the recipient opens the document, the computer will automatically replace it with a different font than the one the sender originally used. This is why many people, after creating a document in Word, often convert it to PDF to send to friends. There are many ways to convert Word to PDF that you can use.

Sometimes this can cause problems, especially with files that require high accuracy, such as company logos or letterheads, etc.

Understanding the key differences between PDF and DOC can help office workers and managers make informed choices when handling documents.
