But only 30% of the plastic is still in use, the rest is turned into waste and only 9% of plastic waste is recycled.

The rate of human plastic production is increasing over time, 50% of that plastic is produced in just 13 years.



According to studies, the average life of a plastic product is only 11 minutes before they turn into waste.

Scientists predict that if this trend continues the Earth will have to contain 12 billion tons of plastic waste by 1020.
