

The new Fluent Design style logo from Microsoft is starting to appear in Windows 10

Over the past few days, a number of Reddit forum members have posted information that Microsoft has started deploying new style logo templates on Windows 10.

As we reported in early December last year, Microsoft is trying to redesign more than 100 applications and services icons in a completely new Fluent Design style, including the Windows logo. familiar. And after more than a month, these logo templates began to be implemented on Windows 10 limited to receive feedback from users.

In the past few days, some Reddit forum members have posted information about Microsoft has started deploying new style logo templates on Windows 10, but this change has only been tested in the sidebar. service (taskbar).



Notably, the implementation of the Fluent Design logo has been limited by Microsoft to users who are using the latest version of Windows Insiders. In addition, Microsoft did not change a series of 100 new logos at the same time, such as the Windows Start logo remains the same. The company wants users to get used to the new logo, avoid the 'operation disorder' during use, so it is likely that these 100 new logo templates will be updated in small groups and will appear full. enough on Windows Insiders within a week or two.

Deploying the new logo test on Windows Insiders is a very reasonable way of doing Microsoft, giving the company enough time to receive and consult feedback from advanced users, then can perform a Some changes to these logos before introducing them to Windows 10 users around the world for the best experience.

It is not clear whether Microsoft will deploy new logo templates right on the Windows 10 19H2 Update (or later). We will update details as soon as the official announcement from Microsoft.
