## Phuc Khanh Pagoda

Phuc Khanh pagoda also has another name is So pagoda or Thinh Quang pagoda, built in the late Le Dynasty. Currently, Phuc Khanh Pagoda is located on Tay Son Street in Thinh Quang Ward, Dong Da District, Hanoi.



The solemn star award ceremony is usually held on January 8, 15 and 18. But from January 2, 3, thousands of people went to the temple to register.

## Ha Pagoda



The pagoda Ha has the name of Thanh Duc, built from the time of King Le Thanh Tong (1460 - 1497) in Cau Giay district - Hanoi.

Ha pagoda is famous for being sacred so it attracts many cross-country visitors to visit and worship Buddha. Especially on the 1st, the full moon day, there are many young people who do not have lovers or lovers often come here to pray for grace.

In addition to the sacred fame of grace, Ha pagoda is also one of the famous places where many people choose to celebrate the star award ceremony at the beginning of the year.

## Tran Quoc Pagoda



This more than 1,500 year old temple was built in the pre-Ly dynasty in 541 and is one of the oldest temples in Vietnam. Besides, Tran Quoc pagoda is also known as the most sacred temple in Hanoi attracting many Buddhists, visitors at home and abroad.

On the full moon day, on the 1st and the New Year, many people come to Tran Quoc Pagoda to pray for peace and luck.

## Quan Su Pagoda



Quan Su Pagoda was built in the 15th century and was named the most sacred temple of Hanoi.

This temple was chosen as the headquarters of the Vietnam Buddhist Church and the Institute of Buddhist Studies.

Located in the center of the capital, the temple is always crowded with visitors to the Buddha ceremony at the beginning of the year, Tet holidays, full moon and the 1st to pray for luck for themselves and their families.

## Phu Tay Ho



Phu Tay Ho worship Princess Lieu Hanh, also known as the famous Lieu Hanh form, is one of the sacred temples to pray for fortune every New Year's Eve in Hanoi.

## Quan Thanh Temple



Quan Thanh Temple was built by King Ly Thai To in the north of Thang Long citadel to destroy the air from the North. The temple is located at the corner of Co Ngu Street, now Thanh Nien Road.

In Quan Thanh temple, there is a statue of Thien Thien Tran cast in black copper with a height of 3.07, a circumference of 8m and a weight of 4 tons which is the only unique art work in Vietnam.

As one of the famous temples of Hanoi, Quan Thanh Temple has been chosen by many people as a place to pray for talents at the beginning of the new year.

## Kim Lien Temple



Kim Lien Temple is located in the south of Thang Long Citadel along with Quan Thanh Temple of "Thang Long Quarter" from King Ly Thai To.

Kim Lien Temple is the place to worship Cao Son Dai Vuong (the son of Lac Long Quan and Au Co) and the two goddesses are Ton Nu Dong Dong Trung Vuong Lake (princess daughter of King Le) and Hue Minh princess.

Kim Lien Temple still retains an ancient stone stele erected in 1772, engraved with divine relics and praises of God, composed from 1510 and 39 edicts of dynasties.
