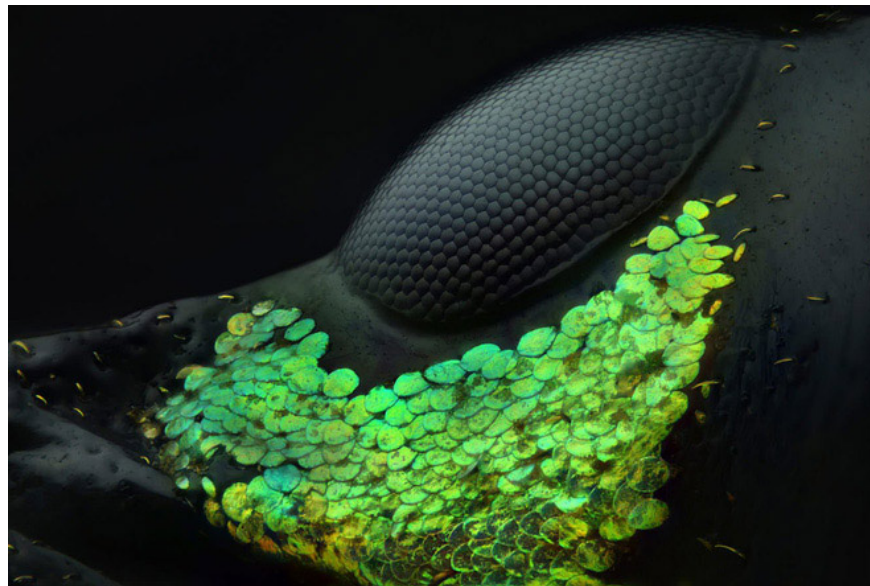


# The stunning beauty of the small world under the microscope through Nikon Small World Photomicrography winning photos 2018

The first prize at this year's competition is Yousef Al Habshi, an Arab photographer with a partial photograph of the eye of the red coconut beetle in Asia with an average length of only 11mm. Yousef Al Habshi took advantage of the contrasting light source and used the stacking technique to combine 128 images at the microscopic structure level to create this wonderful work.

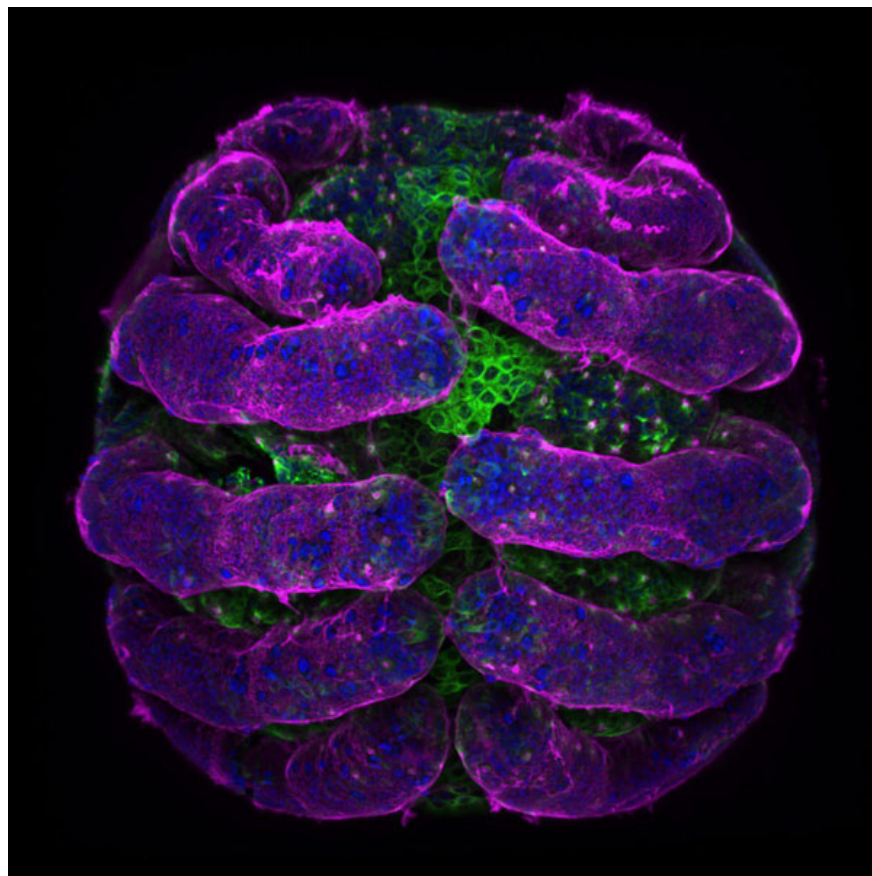
The second prize photo by Rogelio Moreno Gill captures fern spores.



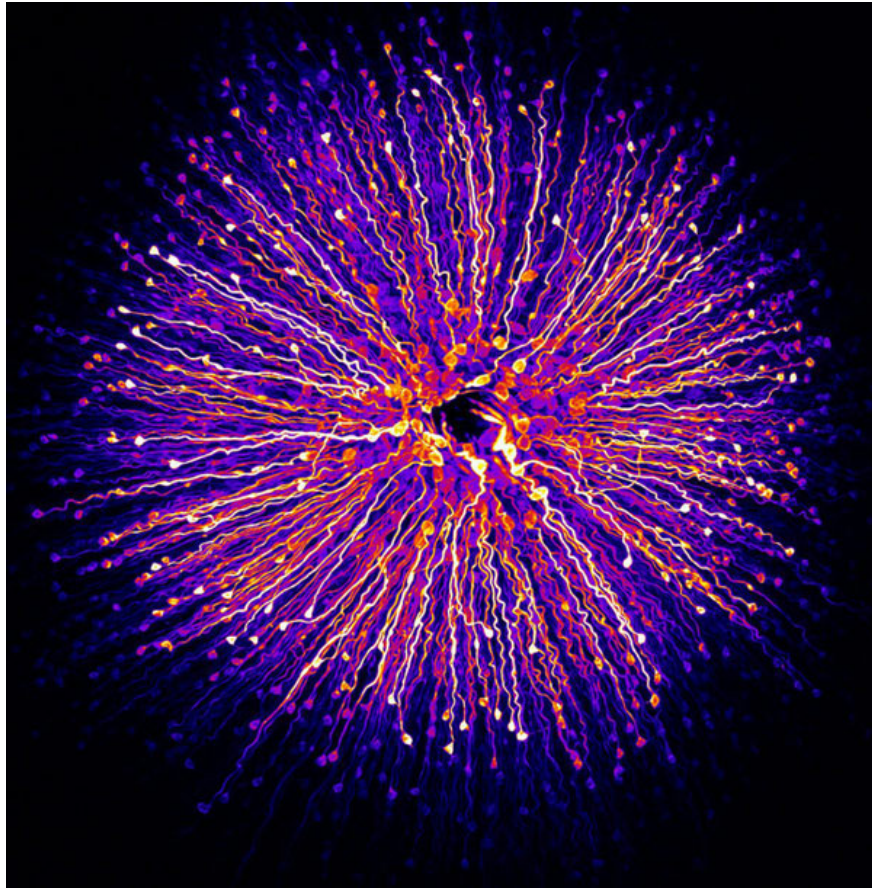
The bug in the bubble shell of Saulius Gugis of Naperville won the third prize.



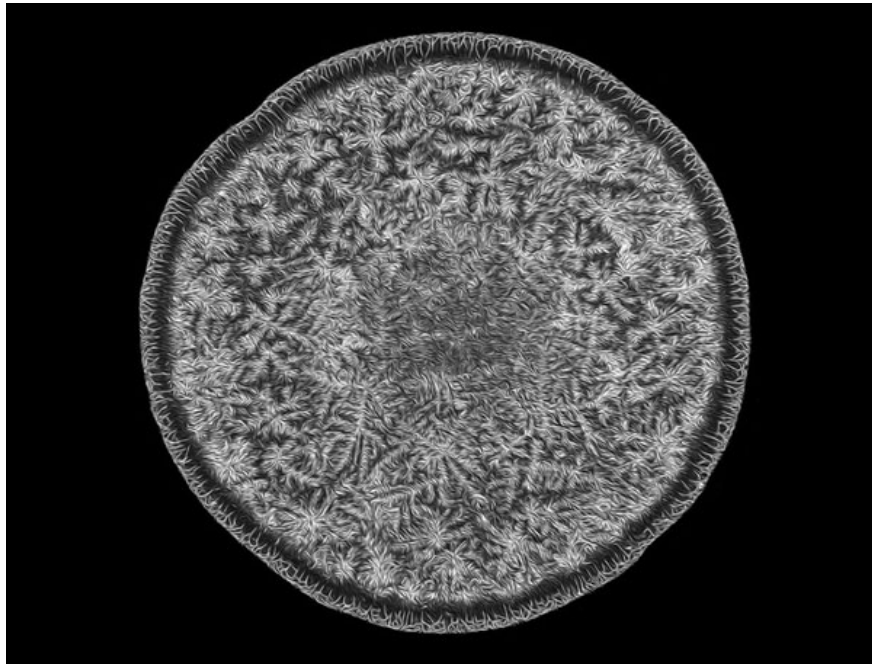
The male Peacock Feather won the fourth prize by Can Tunçer of İzmir.

The seventh position belongs to Norm Barker's Human Tears.



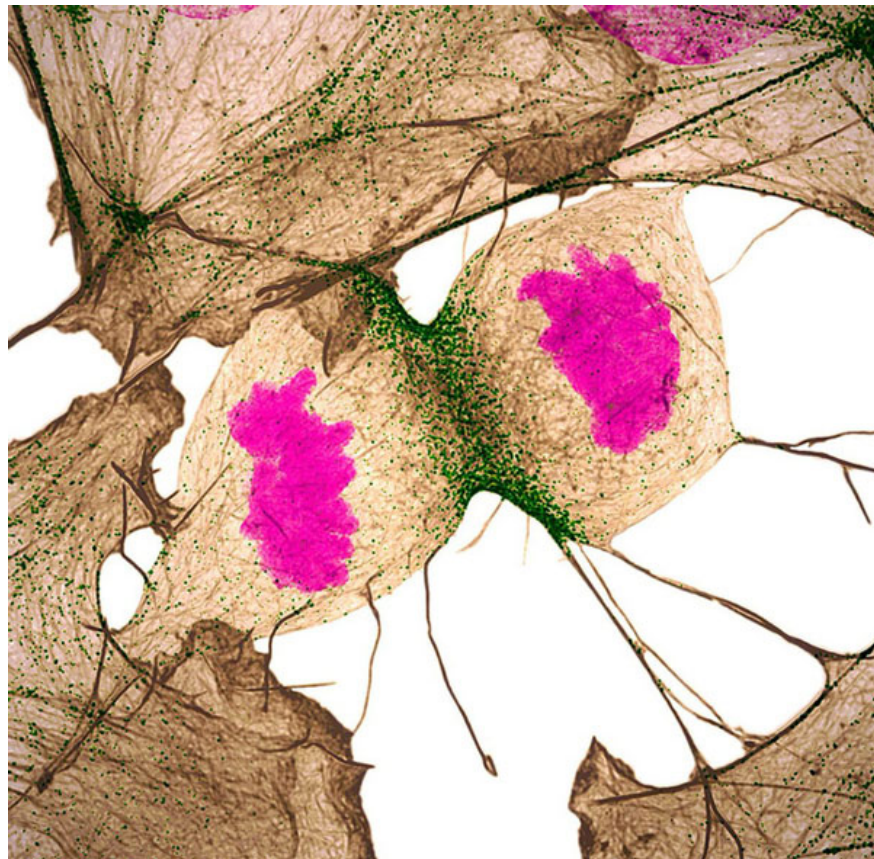
Pia Scanlon's portrait of a beetle ranked 8th.
