1. The *World Economic Forum* (*World Economic Forum - WEF*) has just released a report assessing the level of tourism competition (*Travel and Tourism Competitiveness Report*), offering ranking countries and safe destinations for tourists. International visitors and tourists in 136 countries.
2. The report includes a ranking of safety levels for 136 countries for tourists.
3. The ranking is based on the level of terrorism and violence, not the level of crime.
4. The five most dangerous countries are Nigeria, Pakistan, El Salvador, Yemen and Colombia.



The **World Economic Forum** (WEF) report recently released a ranking of safe countries and destinations for international tourists and tourists in a total of 136 countries around the world.

To produce this ranking, the forum assessed the level of safety, security, and serious damage that might occur such as violence and terrorism.

Based on the report, we want to send to the readers the **20 most dangerous countries for travelers** , based on safety and security. Stay tuned if you want to find out what countries you should avoid!

20. Democratic Republic of Congo

Armed forces in the Congo, as well as other armed and gang groups operating in many parts of the country, are violent and brutal. Visitors to the country of Congo are no stranger to images of armored tanks and military helicopters everywhere.

19. Thailand

Yala, Pattani, Narathiwat and Songkhla provinces in southern Thailand are the places most at risk. In the past 13 years, in these regions there have been more than 6,500 people died of violence. Besides, there is also a law in force in this area.

18. Jamaica

Although no travel advice has been made for Jamaica, violence and gunfire are still widespread in parts of the country, such as Kingston Bay and Montego. Even visitors staying in high-end resorts may be affected.

17. South Africa

Terrorist organizations such as IS, Al Qaeda and Boko Haram are active in Chad. Previously, extremist group attacks targeted not only civilians and security forces but also foreigners.

Chad's borders, especially the border with Libya and Sudan are very dangerous with underground minefields.

14. Bangladesh

In addition to the threat of terrorist attacks, extreme weather also affects Bangladesh with frequent risks of natural disasters. Asian countries often suffer from tropical whirlwinds, floods and sometimes earthquakes.

13. Mali

The threat of terror attacks in Mali - Bamako's capital as well as other parts of northern and central Mali is very high. Regular hotels and restaurants are the targets of these attacks. In November 2015, many visitors were taken hostage and killed at the Radisson hotel in Bamako.

12. Lebanon

Lebanon is a country with many extremist groups operating, so terrorist attacks such as bombings are frequent. It is also a continuous occurrence of small protests and disputes between families or neighborhoods that lead to escalation and violence, harming both outsiders.

11. Philippines

In addition to recent shootings at Casino Manila, kidnappings are common throughout the Sulu Islands and South Sulu Sea. In those abductions, foreigners are often the favorite target of criminals.

10. Ukraine

The battle between Ukrainian armed forces and Russian-backed armed separatists is common in both the Eastern and Southeastern regions of Ukraine - more specifically, the regions of Donetsk, Luhansk and Crimea. Civilians continue to be caught up in these wars.

9. Honduras

Honduras is home to the highest crime rate in the world. Gracias a Dios region in particular is facing crimes, drug smuggling and lack of police and military presence in these places.

Tegucigalpa, San Pedro Sula and La Ceiba are dangerous areas; In the past 7 years, 70% of US citizen murders have occurred in these counties.

8. Kenya

While many terrorist attacks occurred outside Nairobi, the threat of terrorism inside the city was not low either. Grenades, guns and knives are common attacks here.

7. Egypt

IS and other extremist groups pose serious threats to public places throughout Egypt, among them tourist destinations. Groups are also known for attacking transport targets in many different forms.

6. Venezuela

The lack of basic goods such as water, food, medicine and electricity has led to many social unrests and crimes throughout Venezuela. It is also one of the countries with the highest crime rate in the world: armed robbery, murder, kidnapping and robbery are common forms of violence in this country. The US State Department has made many warnings for tourists to Venezuela.

5. Nigeria

Two extremist groups, Boko Haram or West African Islamic State, are responsible for many violent incidents in Nigeria. They often target densely populated areas such as churches, schools, restaurants, hotels and entertainment venues.

The US Department of State said travelers " *Be alert to crowded places and frequent places of foreigners*" and " *Be cautious throughout Nigeria's territory due to the threat of violence blindness can happen* " .

4. Pakistan

Religious conflicts have hindered Pakistan for many years, and violence against certain religious groups is still widespread throughout the country. The Pakistani government also limits many freedom of expression and prohibits foreigners from entering many places throughout the country.

3. El Salvador

In addition to being one of the highest crime rates in the world, El Salvador is also known for many criminal gangs - called maras. These gangs make everything from extortion to smuggling weapons and drug smuggling.

2. Yemen

Rebel groups based in Yemen's Sanya capital continue to target US citizens. Extremist groups like Al Qaeda are also active in this country. Many bombings and airstrikes left most of Yemen's population lacking essential necessities such as food, water and medical assistance.

1. Colombia

Previously, Colombia was not a dangerous country today. The city of Medellín last year was chosen as the best destination in South America voted by the World Tourism Awards. However, foreign tourists traveling to this country still pose a lot of danger of danger.

Bacrim - armed gangs responsible for kidnappings, drug trafficking and looting that take place across Colombia. Besides, terrorist acts and explosions are common in many big cities like Bogota city.
